Synopsis of Canadian North-Wes Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family, or an male over 18 years old, may home-stead a quarter section of available bominion land in Manitobs, Saskatche-wan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (out not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land is each of three years. A homesteader may live with a nins mile of his homestead on a farm o at least 90 acres, on certain conditions A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of hiree years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain readitions.
