S T A N D I N G R U L E S
FOR THE
CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT
OF THE
Newfoundland Church Society.

NAME.

1.—The name of this Society shall be "THE NEW-FOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

OBJECTS.

2.—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Lincenced Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement, or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School-Rooms, and in the purchase of Land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply of Bibles, Prayer-Books, School-Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, and (4) to create and maintain a separate fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

MEMBERS.

3.—The members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceeding years the annual sum of ten shillings for the object of the Society; and

(2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceding years with the Bishop's licence.

4.—All members shall have power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

OFFICERS.

5.—The officers of this Society shall be (1) the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President; (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting.

MANAGERS.

6.—The Committee of management shall consist of the officers of the Society, and certain Lay-Members, elected as Representatives in each of the Deaneries; viz., four elected by Members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notre-Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7.—The election of Representatives shall be as follows:—On some day in Easter Week, in the year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a Meeting of the Members resident in each mission, shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the Mission, (if possible,) on some Sunday in the previous month; at which meeting the Clergyman, or in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the Members shall preside, and the Members present shall vote *seriatim* for the prescribed number of Representatives.

8.—When the voting (which may be continued, if necessary, six hours, but not longer) is completed, the presiding Officer in each mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean, and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected Representatives; provided that every person to be a member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.

9.—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deanery to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.

10.—The new Representatives shall be convened by the Secretary at the Michaelmas Quarterly Meeting; until which time the former Representatives shall continue in office.

11.—As often as it shall become necessary from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification, or refusal to serve, of any of the Representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the Members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese may in his discretion appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required Representative or Representatives shall in like manner be elected.

12.—The President, or a Vice-President and six other Members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.

13.—All Clergymen of the Diocese holding the Bishop's licence, shall be *ex-officio* honorary Members of the Committee with the right of speaking, but not with the exception of the Officers, of voting at its Meetings.

TRUSTEE.

14.—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let

or to take houses or lands, and to receive all rents and interest of monies as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

15.—An annual General meeting of the members and friends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's, who shall publish it (with the Bishops consent) in his Church on the previous Sunday.

16.—At the annual general meeting a report on the State of the Society, with the Treasurer's account duly audited, shall be submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then and there determined by the members.

17.—A special general meeting may be convened at any time, (1) by the President; (2) by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee; or (3) by any twelve members of the Society whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.

18.—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

COLLECTIONS.

19.—It is expected that a Collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clergyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family and every adult member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his Church-wardens and other respectable Members of his Congregation.

20.—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary, a list of the Contributors to the objects of the Society in his Mission, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one-fourth at least

of his whole collections, on or before the last day in every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N.B.—This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's, who shall send in the whole of their Collections to the Treasurer.

21.—All Clergyman who have collected as far as possible from every head of a family, or from every adult Member of the Church in their Mission, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole Collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own Mission; provided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate form, or independent of the general collection; and provided always that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

GRANTS.

22.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.

23.—No Clergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the contributors and their payments, and a fourth-part of his collection (as directed in rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grants from the Society, for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society, in his Mission; provided that where a collection has been duly made, and the list with the fourth-part of the collections transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his first annual collection, ask and receive for any of the objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.

24.—If a Clergyman leaves his Mission before the time for sending in his annual collection the Committee shall have power, on the recommendation of the President, to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

25.—In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or in his absence, the Senior Vice-President, shall take the Chair at all meetings of the Committee or Members, and shall have a casting vote.

26.—The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appointed for auditing the same.

27.—No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order, specifying the amount to be paid, and its object; which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence, by the Senior Officer of the Society in St. John's.

28.—The Committee shall meet for despatch of business in St. John's, on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock, P.M.

29.—A Special Meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either [1] by the President, or [2] by two Vice-Presidents; or [3] by any five members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting with its object be given the day before to all the other members of the Committee in St. John's.

30.—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint two of their number to examine the Treasurer's account up to that season, which account examined, approved, and signed by the auditors as correct,

shall be submitted to the Committee to be by them incorporated in or appended to the next yearly Report, and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.

31.—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secretary, and shall provide for all the contingent expenses of the Committee and the Society.

DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

32.—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and Members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same, to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the annual report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall conduct the correspondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

PRAYERS.

33.—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the purpose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

34.—These Rules may be altered, repealed, or added to by the Members assembled at any general meeting; provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing by any person intending to propose it, to the Secretary at least a month before, for the information of the President and Committee, and that assent has been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration; and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

NEW DEANERIES.

35.—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives; provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and Congregations.

NOTE.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

The above rules were agreed to by the President and members of the Church Society at an adjourned special general meeting held on Friday, July 16th, 1858.

At the annual meeting of the Church Society, held in the British Hall, on Thursday evening, June 18, 1863, the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Newfoundland in the Chair; the Report and Treasurer's accounts having been read, the following resolutions were agreed to.

1.—Proposed by W. V. Whitway, Esq., and seconded by John Bowring, Esq.,—that the report now read, with the Treasurer's accounts, be adopted and printed.

2.—Proposed by the Hon. Attorney General, and seconded by the Rev. T. M. Wood,—that this meeting desires to acknowledge, with reverence and gratitude, the mercy and goodness of God to the Church Society during the past year.

3.—Proposed by the Hon. Judge Robinson, and seconded by the Hon. R. J. Pinsent,—that we rejoice to hear of the creation of three more missions in the diocese during the past year; and that we pledge ourselves to promote to the utmost of our power the further extension of the Church.

4.—Proposed by the Rev. A. W. Mountain, and seconded by the Rev. John Pearson,—that we desire to express our sympathy with the Church Societies in the other colonial dioceses, and rejoice to hear of their success.

5.—Proposed by E. L. Jarvis, Esq., and seconded by the Rev. G. Nicholas,—that thanks are offered to the Committee for conducting the business of the Society, and that W. H. Mare, Esq., be Treasurer, and the Rev. John Pearson, Secretary, for the ensuing year.

6.—It was proposed by the Rev. John Pearson, seconded by W. H. Marc, Esq.,—that the following be Rule 14 of the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund;—
“If a Clergyman removed from the Diocese, his claim upon the fund shall cease; but if he desire it, he shall receive back half the amount of the yearly subscriptions he has paid in.” His Lordship the Bishop, at the request of the mover of the resolution, and with the consent of the Society, adjourned the meeting until Monday, June 22, 1863, at 3, P.M., in the Committee Room, to consider this question.

7.—Proposed by W. H. Marc, Esq., and seconded by Dr. Crowdy,—that the thanks of the meeting be respectfully offered to the Lord Bishop for presiding on this occasion.

R E P O R T , &c.

The Committee of the Church Society in presenting their Annual Report, cannot withhold an expression of regret that the operations of the Society are not more commensurate with the importance of its work and object; and that the duty of co-operation is not more generally acknowledged and acted upon in every Mission in the Diocese. Until this end has been attained, the work of the Church Society will not be fully accomplished.

Your Committee cannot but remember that five years ago certain alterations in the constitution of the Society were proposed and agreed to, with the confident hope that, as every alleged ground of objection was then removed, all the Missions would unite together for the support and extension of our Holy Religion. Why has not this been done? There cannot surely be any real objection to the Society, for it is to be noticed that nearly all those Missions which refuse to co-operate for the first *three* objects of the Church Society, are careful to comply with those Rules which relate to the *fourth* object. Your Committee would again earnestly entreat all the Reverend Clergy, and the members of the Church generally, to consider whether they are not keeping back from a good and holy cause without sufficient reason. The necessity for combined exertions is every year becoming more apparent; while, unhappily, there appears among many little inclination to work together for the glory of God through the instrumentality of our Church Society, which is so strongly recommended by the Right Rev. the Bishop of the Diocese.

The actual income during the past year amounts to the sum of £835 14 7: of this, £654 0 6 was subscribed in St John's.—Whether considered as a whole, or with reference to the capital only, your Committee cannot regard this as a satisfactory result. They hope and believe that many and great efforts are made for the support of religion, which do not appear in the returns; but still, after all, with respect to the parishes and missions which do unite their exertions, what is the result, when compared with what might be expected from Christian people, when called on to provide for the worship of Almighty God and the ministrations of religion. And it is not as to the amount contributed by individuals that we complain; for indeed many of the subscriptions are very liberal; the chief cause of regret is, that not one-half of the adult members of the Church contribute anything at all, while the burden has to be borne by a comparatively small number. The Committee of the Church Society can never cease bearing their testimony against this state of things, as they feel strongly that it is the duty of every one, in whatever station of life God has placed him, to contribute according to his means for the support of that Religion to which he belongs. Does not the Apostle tell us that “the Lord also hath ordained, that they who preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel?”

The Widows' and Orphans' Fund has now been in successful operation for the last five years, and your Committee have much satisfaction in calling attention to the gradual increase of its capital from £675 to considerably over £1800. There was the greatest necessity for the formation of such a fund, though happily in the good Providence of God no further claim has arisen as yet since the death of the Rev. John Moreton. The actual income for this year, including interest of loans and donations, amounts to £244 10 7.

There appears to have been some misunderstanding on the part of several members respecting the necessity of a strict compliance with one of the rules. The

Committee would take this opportunity of saying that they feel it to be their duty, in justice to those who have complied with the rules, to insist upon a collection being forwarded yearly from every mission where the clergyman is connected with the fund. If that most important rule, which provides for a yearly collection, is neglected, it is manifest that the income will be materially affected, and the stability of the fund very greatly endangered. It is hoped that, in future, the Committee will be spared the trouble of having to require arrears to be forwarded.

The Clergy in their respective missions, are requested to use their best endeavours to increase if possible the yearly collections for this object. It is a matter of the deepest regret that the sums remitted as collections are, in several instances, so small, and so entirely out of proportion to the number of church members in the missions. The Committee beg to remark that a much larger capital must be raised before the yearly collections can be dispensed with, or with safety diminished. It is also proper to notice that the rules require a collection to be made from *every congregation* in the mission. In some cases it would appear that this has not been done. The Committee hope that when the Clergy make their returns they will specify the sums collected *in each church* in the mission, with a view to their being separately entered in the Treasurer's accounts.—

It was announced in the last Annual Report, that it was intended to relieve the Lord Bishop of the trouble and expense of managing and maintaining the Depository. The stock was taken off the Bishop's hands at a valuation, and fresh supplies of books procured from England, so that the Depot is now believed to possess every requisite usually supplied by such institutions. There has been, necessarily, a large sum of money drawn from the Treasurer's hands for the purpose of assuming the management of the Depository, but your Committee feel sure that such an investment cannot but be approved by the Church Society,—one of whose especial objects is to provide for sale a supply of Bibles, Prayer-Books, School Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts. During the six months ending December 31, 1862, upwards of one hundred pounds worth of books were sold in the Depository in Water Street. It is hoped that all the Clergy will promote the circulation of Society's Publications: everything will be done by the Sub-Committee to make the depot as useful as possible; and any suggestions as to its management, or the supply of books, will be thankfully received, and as far as possible adopted.

A minute was passed by the Committee on October 2, 1862, to the effect that occasional grants of devotional books and tracts, to the value of 25s., should be made to any Clergyman in connection with the Society, who will make application in the usual manner.

Your Committee very gladly and thankfully report

that since the last Annual Meeting, the Lord Bishop of the Diocese has been enabled to place Clergymen at Pinchard's Island, at Salvage, and at New Harbor; all of them new Missions. It will be a matter of great satisfaction to all the members of the Church to hear this, and to learn also that these great benefits have been brought about through the exertions which have been made in the Parishes of Greenspond and Heart's Content to support the ministrations of religion among themselves. All the three places above mentioned, with the districts attached to them, were far too remote from the residence of the clergyman, under whose care they were placed, to be served with regularity and attention. During the winter and spring they were, of necessity, left to themselves, without the blessing of those religious services which it is the earnest wish of the Clergy to render. Let us, however, thank God that, to this extent, the lack of service has been supplied; let us also hope that ere long other widely extended districts, as Harbour Buffett, and Moreton's Harbour, and Trinity, may also be divided, and by the blessing of God more frequently and efficiently supplied with the services of true religion.

In connexion with this subject it is right to remark that the Committee gladly complied with the request of the Lord Bishop to devote the sum of £120 annually towards the support of the missionaries at Pinchard's Island and Salvage. The sum of £100 stg., formerly paid by the Society for Propagating the Gospel to the missionary at Greenspond, was placed at the disposal of the Bishop for the new missions in Bonavista Bay: and to meet the two sums of £50 stg. each the grants of £60 each were made to continue as long as his Lordship should think it desirable. The Committee feel confident that the members of the Church in Salvage and Pinchard's Island will do their utmost to help to maintain the worship of God, but in

the meantime they are thankful to be able to assist in providing the services of religion on a more satisfactory footing.—From this it will be seen that, for the first time, the Society has engaged in the direct extension of the Church. Let us hope that this is only the beginning of a more widely extended career, and that the now spiritually destitute French Shore, and the far too widely extended cures of some of our active and laborious clergy, may be more efficiently, if not more devotedly, served than at present can be the case.

In conclusion then, though your Committee cannot congratulate the members of the Church Society upon the present results, they may earnestly commend the good work to the thoughtful consideration and prayers of all Christian people. But a great work has yet to be done on the shores of Newfoundland,—a work which requires not money only, but men, men devoted to the service of GOD in the ministry of His Church. We are already permitted to bear a part in this great work; GOD grant that more men and means may be found to extend the work, and that by his mercy true religion may be taught, and the Sacraments of life duly administered, along the whole coast of Newfoundland, and that all who profess and call themselves Christians may be led into the way of truth, and hold the faith in unity of spirit, in the bond of peace, and in righteousness of life, through JESUS CHRIST our LORD. Amen.

The adjourned Meeting of the Church Society was held in the *Committee Room* on June 22, 1863, the Lord Bishop in the Chair, and the alteration of Rule 14 of the *Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund* was again brought forward, according to the terms of the resolution proposed by the Rev. J. Pearson, and seconded by W. H. Mare, Esq., on Thursday, June 18, 1863; when the following amendment was proposed by G. T. Rendell, Esq., and seconded by the Rev. G. M. Johnson,

"If a Clergyman having joined the Fund after the 14th June, 1863, removes from the Diocese after having served less than fourteen years, his connexion with the Fund shall cease, and he shall be entitled to receive back half the amount of the annual subscriptions he has paid. If he removes after having served fourteen years and less than twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connexion with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of six pounds, or nine pounds if residing within the Tropics; or he may, if he prefers, receive back half his annual subscriptions, upon which his connexion with the Fund shall cease. If he removes after having served twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connexion with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of Five Pounds, or Seven Pounds Ten Shillings if residing within the Tropics: or he may if he prefers receive back three fourths of his annual subscriptions, upon which his connexion with the fund shall cease.

All Clergymen in connexion with the Fund previous to the 24th June, 1863, to be governed by the original rule 14 thereof."

The amendment having been put to the meeting by the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop, was declared by him to be passed, and to be rule 14 of the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

The meeting then broke up.




