Present Government of Ireland Declared to Be Rotten and Should Be Ended.

London, Feb. 3.—"For the Irish party there is no such thing as an alternative policy to Home Rule," declared John Redmond, the leader of the Irish parliamentary party in the House of Commons today, as he resumed the debate on the address in reply to the speech from the throne.

Mr. Redmond proceeded in a speech of great length to detail the various grievances of Ireland, incidentally denouncing the Liberals that it was a decision to suppose they could count on Irish support for promising an alternative policy to Home Rule.

Mr. Redmond biterly attacked the government's attitude on education in Ireland, describing it as grossly absurd and irreparably harmful to the youth of Ireland.

Rule Now Rotten. Mr. Redmond concluded with a few scathing remarks concerning "that rampant anarchism known as Dublin Castle," declaring the present government of Ireland was rotten to the core.

YORK COUNTY AND SUBURBS

County Council Will Aid the G.G.B.G. in Recruiting From Patriotic and Material Reasons.

TELEPHONES FOR METROPOLITAN RAILWAY. An Innovation Desired—Toronto Junction C.I. Committee Organized.

The members of York County Council resumed their January session at the Court House yesterday morning.

In the afternoon an early adjournment was made, so that the members could visit the legislature to hear the member for Montserrat.

The Standing Committee on Finance reported in favor of assisting the Governor-General's Body Guard to establish depots at Markham or Unionville and Newmarket or Aurora, for the following reasons: 1. It would restore to the county squadrons C and D, where they were originally formed, and create a spirit of patriotism among the young men.

The Commissioners of County Property handed to the county engineer a plan for the improvement in the matter of heating the new cars on the Metropolitan Railway, and having them put in commission.

Complaints having been made by the registrar that North York Registry office was waiting in facilities for filing documents, the commissioners recommended that metallic fittings be put in at the rate of \$2 per document file and \$2.15 per roller book shelf.

The county solicitor reviewed the legal cases since last session. An attack was made on the bylaw regarding the union school section proposed by the Town of East Toronto and the Township of York.

At the meeting of the Metropolitan Railway Company, the directors considered the proposed Irish legislation with a view of giving home rule to Ireland, or as a concession for the purpose of changing the status of the Nationalists.

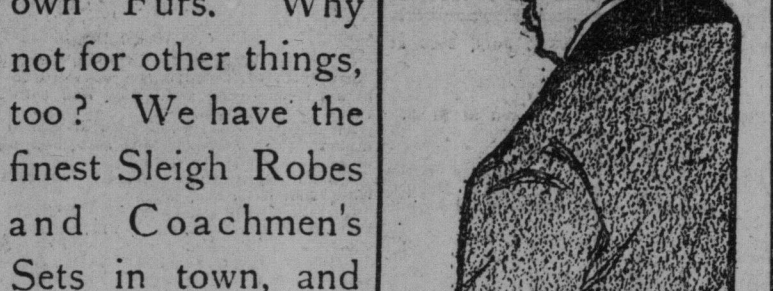
