NORTH TORONTO, Dec. 1.—If the public meeting held in the town hall last night under the auspices of the Ratepayers' Association is any criterion, the sentiment for a "Greater Toronto" is fast travelling northward. The meeting was well attended and harmony and good-will reigned throughout.

H. Waddington, the convener of the special committee appointed to gather data on annexation to Toronto, reported at the outset that he personally had not the time to devote to this subject as the committee got facts and figures from reliable sources. - 1. In the event of the Town of North Toronto being annexed to the City of Toronto, would the town fire protection?
2. Would North Toronto get police protection?
3. Would we get high school accommodation?
4. Would the town get sewerage? If so, how would the cost be provided?
5. Would the town be provided an electric light service on the same plan as these other matters which I think properly belong to the city council.
