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

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A few Pastoral Words, TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

My DEAR FRIENDS,

In the following pages, the record which you have made for yourselves in the year, 1895, is contained. Not all your record, of course. It is only in God's book that it is fully written out. The advancement which you may have made in spiritual life cannot be described with printers' ink. But the facts and figures of the Annual Report are held to be a good index even of the strength of the spiritual pulse-beat of the congregation; and, therefore, I heartily commend to your careful perusal the several items which fill these pages, if you would know what your standing is as a spiritual agency.

A glance at this pamphlet will make one thing at least clear, that there are departments of work enough and these of a sufficiently varied character, to enlist the sympathies and co-operation of everyone of you, young and old. If you shall not find your sphere, that which is most to your liking and best adopted to call into active exercise your zeal and enthusiasm in one of the organizations existing in connection with the congregation, you will find it in another. Whatever reasonable excuse used to exist in St. Gabriel's, that there was no scope for the energies of the young, can no longer be urged. And the older members acknowledge gladly the hearty interest which the young men and women of our church are taking in all that pertains to its highest welfare. The young people may well evince the most eager desire for the welfare of St. Gabriel's-it is the Lord's cause they are promoting, and they have a greater prospective interest in the church's prosperity and success, than the older people have. Their help even in clearing off the debt is, therefore, reasonably to be expected.

Again, the Trustees echo the call to the people to furnish them with larger means to carry out the purposes of the trust. And that is right. The church is a militant institution. It must never reach the stage at which it is to rest and be thankful. "Woe to them that are at ease in Zion!" It is far better to be advancing even if the limits of the congregation's means are transcended, than to be content to sink down into a condition of inertness, with a balance at the right side. "Excelsion" must be inscribed on the banner of every prosperous

church. Aspiring after better things, and forgetting the things that are behind, must be our ideal. The fact that there is a deficit in the finances at the end of the year is, therefore, a thing not wholly to be deplored. Had the Trustees been content to let the church edifice remain in the state of disrepair, which a nine years' occupancy had produced, they might have been able to show but a very slender balance against the year's undertakings; and this, considering the depressed condition of trade in the community, is perhaps as much as was to be expected. But hoping that better times may soon dawn, and trusting that during the present year no considerable extra expenditure may be called for, it becomes the duty of all to address themselves earnestly to the task of providing not only for the ordinary outlay of this year, but also to overtake at least a part of the debt, on account of repairs, carried on from last year.

Let me again earnestly press upon you the obligation resting on each of you, as part of the church's organization. You must not allow yourselves to think of the church as existing only to do you good, as an institution from which you are only to receive benefits. Its main object is rather to enlist your sympathies in doing good, and to rally you to joint efforts in furthering the Kingdom of the Lord Jesus Christ. The church is as dependent upon you, as you are upon the church.

During the year, the mortgage debt on the edifice was reduced from \$13,000 to \$10,000. Within the year, 1896, it is hoped that it may be further reduced \$2000. There are subscriptions due, by members of the congregation and friends outside, sufficient to provide for this. Let an earnest effort be made to collect these subscriptions. If the debt were reduced to \$8000, at 5 p.c., it would greatly relieve the pressure on the congregation's finances. Our friends are, therefore, earnestly besought to signalize this year by paying up their subscriptions to the Building Fund.

From Park Avenue and Bleury Street, to University Street, north of St. Catherine Street, but west of Phillips Place, south to St. Antoine Street.

DISTRICT NO. IX—ROBERT STEWART, Elder.

From St. Antoine Street, north to city limits, and from University Street, excluded, westwards.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

January 8th, 1896.

The annual meeting of the congregation of St. Gabriel Church, in accordance with the constitution and by-laws, was held in the lecture room, on the evening of Wednesday, January, 8th, 1896.

On motion made by Mr. John A. Stuart, and duly seconded, the Rev. Dr. Campbell occupied the chair, and Mr. John Farquhar acted as secretary.

The reports of the Treasurer and secretary not being ready, it was moved by Mr. John MacTavish, and duly seconded, and carried:

"That this meeting be adjourned until the evening of Wednesday, January 22nd."

The adjourned annual meeting of the congregation of St. Gabriel Church, was held in the Lecture Room, on the evening of Wednesday, January 22nd, 1896.

It was moved by Mr. Chas. Byrd, duly seconded, and carried:-

"That in the absence of the Rev. Dr. Campbell, Mr. John MacTavish be chairman of the meeting, and that Mr. J. M. Farquhar act as secretary."

After prayer by Mr. John A. Stuart, and singing of a stanza, the minutes of the last annual meeting were read and confirmed.

The Treasurer's financial statement having been distributed in printed form, it was moved by Mr. Andrew McAllister, and duly seconded, that the financial statement be taken as read. Carried.

Mr. Andrew McAllister read the annual report of the Board of Trustees.

Mr. J. M. Farquhar read the financial statement of the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee, and also financial statement of the Ladies' Aid Society.

It was moved by Mr. James Henry, seconded by Mr. Chas. H. Thompson, and carried:—

"That the reports and financial statements, as now read be received and adopted, and that the same be printed and distributed amongst the members and and adherents of the congregation."

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eived and abers and It was moved by Mr. John A. Stuart, seconded by Mr. Wm. Clelland Jr., and carried:—

"That in acknowledgement of God's goodness to this congregation during the past year, this meeting desires to impress all present with thanks to God for all the privileges of religious worship which we have enjoyed, and pray that a spirit of unity and hopefulness may continue to prevail amongst the congregation."

It was moved by Mr. J. Loughead, seconded by Mr. T. H. Blair, and carried:

"That whereas the kind estimable services of the Ladies' Aid Society, and lady visitors in providing timely assistance and comfort for those in adversity, and by visiting the sick, as well as in other Christian duties, are highly valued by the congregation. Therefore, this meeting offers a vote of thanks to the members of the Ladies' Aid Society and the lady visitors, for their faithful attention to these benevolent duties during the past year."

It was moved by Mr. Wm. Clelland Jr., seconded by Mr. Thos. H. Blair, and carried:

"That whereas the efficient services of the choir in leading the praise services of the church, requires much training and zeal on the part of its members. The thanks of this meeting are offered to all the members of the choir for their continued devotion to the praise services of the congregation during the past year, and especially to Mr. Bain for voluntarily accepting a reduced salary for his services as choir master, in order to lighten the financial labors of the trustees."

It was moved by Mr. Alex. Tait, seconded by Mr. J. R. Eakin, and carried:—

"That whereas the thorough education of the children and young people in Bible knowledge and in the privileges of religious life, is one of the most important branches of church work. Therefore, this meeting would encourage the superintendent and teachers of our Sabbath School, by a vote of thanks, for their valuable services, and further requests the Board of Trustees to provide the usual necessary expenses of the Sabbath School during the current year."

It was moved by Mr. T. H. Blair, seconded by Mr. D. McLachlan, and carried:—

"That this meeting records its appreciation of the services of the Treasurer and Secretary and now tenders a vote of thanks to Mr. J. G. Veith the treasurer, and to Mr. Andrew McAllister for the careful performance of the duties of their respective offices during the past year."

It was moved by Mr. W. J. Mundell, seconded by Mr. Bennett, and carried:—

"Whereas the prosperity of the congregation is greatly aided by the reduction of the annual payment for interest on the debt on the church. Therefore this meeting offers a cordial vote of thanks to the Rev. Dr. Campbell, for his successful efforts in getting subscriptions towards the debt, and also to Mr. McNaughton, and other members of the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee, for their success jointly with the Rev. Dr. Campbell in paying off the first instalment of \$3000, of the debt on the church, and also thanks all other organizations which have at various times contributed much assistance towards the purchase debt on the church."

It was moved by Mr. J. C. Bennett, seconded by Mr. W. J.

Mundell, and carried:

"That in accordance with Article III of the By-Laws, this meeting does now nominate and elect Andrew McAllister, Sub-Chief John Beckingham and R. Weir, to be members of the Board of Trustees, to fill vacancies occurring at this time by rotation, and that the interim election by the trustees of Mr. John Henderson and Mr. J. R. Eakin be now concurred in and confirmed by this meeting."

It was moved by Mr. Arch. McAllister, seconded by Mr. W. J.

Helps, and carried :-

"That the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee consist of the following, and that they shall be authorized to take up subscriptions for the Purchase and Interest Fund on the usual terms, or in special calls for payments of the interest and debt remaining due on the church, viz:—Arch. McNaughton, Chas. Byrd, John MacTavish, Andrew McAllister, John Farquhar, John Henderson, J. G. Veith, Arch. McAllister, Wm. Clelland Jr., W. J. Mundell, Chas. Riva, Alex. Tait, J. A. Stuart and Thos. Sonne, with power to add to their number."

It was moved by Mr. Alex. Clelland, seconded by Mr. T. Penny, and carried:-

"That Messrs James Henry and Alex. Abernethy be appointed auditors for the year 1896."

It was moved by Mr. J. A. Stuart, and seconded by Mr. Andrew McAllister, and carried :---

"That Mr. MacTavish vacate the chair and that Mr. Byrd take the same." It was moved by Mr. John A. Stuart, and seconded by Mr.

Andrew McAllister, and carried :-

"That a vote of thanks be given to Mr. MacTavish and Mr. J. M. Farquhar for the able manner in which they have filled the duties of the Chair and Secretary this evening."

Refreshments were then served by the ladies, and the remainder of

the evening was spent in social intercourse.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

For the year ending December 31st, 1895.

It is again with much pleasure that the Board of Trustees lay before the congregation their Annual Report of the financial and temporal affairs of the church for the year 1895.

It was deemed advisable that the Treasurer's statement be printed and distributed into the hands of the members at this meeting, so that each might have a better opportunity of seeing exactly how the finances of the church stand, and be prompted to do better in future.

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As the Treasurer's Statement is the essence of the prosperity and vitality of the church, it is the earnest hope that all will give it their careful consideration.

The corresponding figures for the three previous years are also presented for the purpose of comparison as follows:

It will be seen by the above figures that there has been a gradual decrease in the total revenue for the three years, a state of things that is much regretted by the Board. The willingness of some of our people by the gratifying increase as well as the regularity in paying the same is thoroughly appreciated, while it is regretted that the Treasurer Reports that the unpaid proportion of promised Weekly Offerings continues to increase; the past year showing arrears of about \$324,15, and \$70,00 for pew rents, the latter amount considered to be good, and no doubt will be collected, but the arrears for Weekly Offerings is not considered so favorable, and it is a subject for careful thought, that those in arrears should clearly see it their duty to carry out their obligation more faithfully.

It is not the wish that the keeping up of the finances should be a burden to anyone, and if any have promised more than they feel able to pay let them inform the treasurer, but give regularly what you can, and if by any reason whatever you should be absent from church see that your offering is made up the following Sabbath, as punctuality is the key to prosperity.

The Trustees would point out that they exercise the greatest economy possible with the proper maintenance of the church, making worthy provision for the worship of God, but in order to do this they depend upon every member and communicant to feel it his or her duty to give as the Lord hath prospered them.

The Purchase and Interest Fund has, as usual been made out in detail and will be submitted, but under this head the Trustees feel greatly thankful to our pastor, Dr. Campbell, for his untiring energy in raising the sum of \$1500, from outside friends towards paying off some of the debt on the church property, in addition to other sums which he handed the trustees, which made it possible for us to reduce the debt from \$13,000 to \$10,000, which will, no doubt, make itself felt in the way of a saving of interest and prove a great boon to the congregation.

We would also wish to record our thanks to the Young People's Association for their handsome donation of \$210.00 towards this fund.

During the year we have had some extra expense in the way of repairs to organ and tinting and cleaning basement, which made the expense heavier than usual, although they are repairs that can hardly be charged to this year only, as they are natural wear and tear.

On the last Sabbath in December our pastor, by a special request, from the pulpit asked the congregation to put forth a special effort to make up the deficit the response to which realized the sum of \$139,50, although not being quite as much as expected, was well worthy of congratulation when we take into consideration the season of the year.

In reviewing the whole financial situation for the year, and taking into consideration the deficit, the Board thought it advisable to reduce the running expense of the church and try and make the expenditure balance with the income, but since then we have been greatly favored by our Choir Leader, seeing the extremity we were in kindly coming forward and offering to fulfill his duties as heretofore at a reduction of \$200, (the Trustees to attend to the tuning of the organ). For this the Board extend to him their hearty thanks.

Before closing this report we would offer a word of encouragement to all. When we take into consideration the closeness of the great financial markets as well as lack of employment, we may well congratulate ourselves, as no doubt if we look around we will see others worse off than we are. Therefore let us not be discouraged but press on and make 1896 feel that everyone is contributing his mite to carry on Christ's work in old St. Gabriel.

ABSTRACT OF ANNUAL REPORT.

The festival took place on the evening of Friday, January 24th, and although the night was stormy there was a large attendance of the children as well as of their parents and friends. The pastor occupied the chair. Refreshments were served from 6 to 7.30 p.m., and it is needless to say that the good things provided by the ladies had ample justice done them.

The report submitted showed on the roll of teachers and scholars at 31st December, 1895, 286 altogether, while the average attendance of all during the year was 210. Only one scholar died in 1895. The missionary collections amounted to \$144.87--collected for all purposes \$256.74; \$32 worth of books was added to the Library. The Chinese Class was closed at the summer holidays, and was not afterwards resumed, as full provision was made in other morning schools for all the almond-eyed foreigners. Mr. A.A. Tait assists Rev. Dr. Campbell in conducting the Bible Class. The report was received and adopted, the missionary moneys were voted away, and then the programme prepared by the children was gone through with.
