Whole Tribes Commit to Avoid Starving Fathers Killing and Their Own Children Wives.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 15. Terrible accounts are reaching here of cannibalism and among the tribes in the frozen Arctic plains of the Peninsula, at the extremity of the continent. Most of the tribes died during the winter of 1904-5. The inhabitants without means of subsistence.
