



The New Brunswick farmer, with a good home market at his door, has no reason these days to envy his brethren in the West. In consequence of the wheat blockade in the Prairie Provinces conditions are said to be "simply appalling." In Saskatchewan wheat has been standing alongside the elevators for weeks and the loss to the farmers has been enormous. According to a despatch from Winnipeg the elevator commissioner has suspended the Grain Act and has issued imperative orders that cars be provided, but without result. Many farmers are sell-

NEW BRUNSWICK'S OPPORTUNITIES.

It is an encouraging sign of the times hat the possibilities in the soil of New Brunswick are at long last coming to be realized. A rather striking example of this fact has occurred in the neighborhood of Pennifeld, Charlotte County. It has just been discovered, during the past season, that the loose gravely soil in this district is ideal for potator raising. An interesting account of the circumstances and the subsequent developments was given by Mr. S. W. Farning of St. Stephen Board of Trade.

It appears that a chemical company, located in the upper section of Charlotte County, had been endeavoring to grow potatoes on a large scale, but for several years, owing to the nature of the soil, the crop had been a fall-ure. They "tumbled" on the Pennifeld district last sminer quite by accident, and, as the soil seemed to afford better prospects of success, the experiment was made of planting potatoes. The result more than justified the plants fourished until killed by the frost on September 10. The harvest was a plendid one, without a sign of rot or blight. One carload was sent to St. John and commanded a ready sale at the highest prices, the dealer here asserting that they were the fineat potatoes he had ever seen. The company felt encouraged to go into potato culture in the district on a large scale and took up the matter of recipit rates with the C. P. R. Very favorable terms were granted. Lack of storage was found to be a handleup and the railway company is now considering a suggestion to erect a warehouse where the growers can reat space for storage purposes. Mr. Farnham told the Hondrad of Trade that in his opinion potatoes could be raisised in Pennifeld cheaper than anywhere clae in the world.
