THE Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the Province of Prince Edward Island, commenced its First Annual Communication in the city of Charlottetown, on Wednesday, the 16th day of February, A. L., 5876, at 7 o'clock, p.m.

Charlottetown, Feb'y 16, 1876.

Your Committee appointed to have the proceedings of Convention and Grand Lodge proceedings to 12th day of August last, published, beg respectfully to submit their Report.

Your Committee employed Messrs. McGowan & Haszard to print the Journals of the Grand Lodge, from its first inception to the last communication. W. Bro. P. S. McGowan having acted as Secretary up to the Election of Officers, would take special pains to see that the work was properly executed. Two hundred copies have been issued and the members of this body have each been furnished with a copy.

Your Committee called for Tenders for the printing of the Constitutions and Regulations of this Grand Lodge, and Messrs, Bremner Brothers's being the lowest tender, was accepted. Four hundred copies have been printed and placed in the hands of the Grand Secretary, and they trust will meet with the approval of this Grand Lodge.

On motion of W. Brother ADAM MURRAY, it was Resolved that the prayer of the Petition be granted.

W. Brother, JOHN W. MORRISON, gave notice that he would, at the next Quarterly Communication, move the following:

Resolved, That the following be added to Section 8 of the Regulations, under the head of Grand Masters, "on Finance and Audit," and also "on Charters." The following to be added to Section 11, under the head of Board of General Purposes, "and shall make a full report of its doings at each Annual Meeting of this Grand Lodge."

dge, otice As directed by resolution of Grand Lodge, a Memorial was addressed to the various Grand Lodges throughout the world, informing them of our inauguration and requesting Masonic recognition by them. Replies have already been received from the Grand Lodges of New Brunswick, Canada, Manitoba, Quebec, Cincinnati, Utah, Montana and New Jersey, tendering fraternal greeting to this Grand Lodge.

In response to the recommendation of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, I have appointed R. W. Bro. Gaßriel Hudson Flewel-Ling, King's County, New Brunswick, to be the representative of this Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. I have recommended W. Bro. J. W. Morrison, as a suitable Bro. to represent the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick near this Grand Lodge.

I have also in accordance with the recommendation of the Grand Lodge of Canada, appointed R. W. Bro. Wm. H. Weller, Deputy Grand Master, to represent the Grand Lodge of P. E. Island at the

Grand Lodge of Canada.

The Grand Lodge of Quebec, having asked for an exchange of representatives, I have recommended W. Bro. Neil McKelvie for appointment by that Grand Lodge, and have requested the M. W. Grand Master of Quebec to name a suitable Bro. for appointment to represent this Grand Lodge near his Grand Lodge.

The Grand Lodge of Manitoba, having requested an interchange of representatives, I have recommended R. W. Bro. Deputy G. M. Thos.

A. McLean for appointment as the representative of that Grand

A. MCLEAN for appointment as the representative of that Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of P. E. Island. These appointments and recommendations will, I hope, meet with

the approval and confirmation of Grand Lodge.

Four dispensations have been issued to wear regalia at Masonic entertainments, and six to confer Degrees at shorter intervals than four weeks, to brethren about to leave the Island.

Intreference to dispensations for this purpose, I would strongly urge upon Masters of Lodges not to apply for them unless they are aware that there is an actual necessity for so doing. The time required to intervene between the degrees is quite limited enough to obtain that instruction which it is especially necessary every candidate should receive.

The warrants for the different lodges have been prepared and are

now ready for forwarding to them.

Agreeably to resolution of Grand Lodge, a dispensation was granted to Brothers Henry W. AITKEN, NATHANIEL P. STRAMBERG, DAVID HOOPER MCKINNON and others, to form a Lodge to be called "King Solomon," in Charlottetown, this Lodge was immediately organized, and under the management of the leading members composing it, I am of opinion bids fair to be one of our best working and most prominent Lodges.

The shortness of time and the very busy season which has passed since the formation of Grand Lodge, prevented my visiting, as I had hoped to have done, all the Lodges throughout the Island. I have only been enabled to visit those in my own neighborhood. I am happy to report of these, that with some trifling exceptions, I found them well attended and with every appearance of being in a prosperous condition. To the officers of Grand Lodge for the ensuing year will devolve the pleasure as well as the duty of visiting all the Lodges.

▶ I would suggest to Grand Lodge the necessity of taking steps for the adoption of uniform, ritual and work in the subordinate Lodges within this jurisdiction. Though but a short time since the inauguration of Grand Lodge, I am happy to be able to congratulate you upon the success which has attended it.

I regret that in consequence of heavy snow storms in November last, the members of Grand Lodge were unable to attend the Quarterly Communication that was to be held in Summerside, and I did not think it advisable to call an emergent meeting at that busy season of the year, as our annual meeting would come on so soon.

On motion Bros. W. Adam Murray, R. W. John Murrhead, and W. Thomas Brehaut were appointed a committee on the M. W. Grand Master's Address.

The R. W. Grand Secretary submitted the following report and annexed statement:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of A. F. & A. M. of Prince Edward Island:

I have the honor to submit my Report of Proceedings, at the Grand Secretary's office, since the erection of the M. W. Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, on the 24th June, 1875.

Immediately after the erection of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, by order of the M. W. Grand Master, I issued dispensations to the worshipful masters, officers and members of all the subordinate lodges, empowering them to work under the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, until the new warrants were prepared.

I also, by order of the M. W. Grand Master, issued & dispensation to Bros. Henry W. Aitken, David Hooper McKinnón, Nathaniel P. Stramberg and others, to organize a new lodge under the name of King Solomon, to be held in Charlottetown, U. D.

I forwarded memorials to the M. W. Grand Lodges of England, Scotland, Ireland, and France, and to all the M. W. Grand Lodges on this Continent, informing them of our erection and praying for recognition of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island.

The proceedings of Grand Lodge to 12th August, have been printed and copies sent to all the above named Grand Lodges, and to all the members of this Grand Lodge.

The constitutions and regulations of the M. W. Grand Lodge have been printed, and a copy forwarded to the W. Master of each subordinate Lodge, and orders for a limited number have since been filled.

The new warrants have been delayed for want of parchment, but I am happy to say that they are now ready, having been printed in a very neat manner by Messrs. Bremmer Brothers. I superintended the work myself, and as it is likely that the old warrants will be called in by the mother Grand Lodges. I have embodied the names of the first charter members, the names of the W. Masters and Wardens of the different lodges, at the time of the erection of the M. W. Grand Lodge of P. E. Island, in each warrant, also the date on which the original charters were granted, with the names of the Grand Masters. I have also had copies printed to retain as a register.

I wrote to Brother Alexander Hay of Edinburgh, Scotland, enquiring the cost of a plate for diplomas. I received an answer in which he kindly offered to superintend the engraving of a plate, and as there are a number of diplomas now required, I wrote and request-

WELLER, Deputy Grand Master of Canada, was recommended by the M. W. Grand Master of Canada, to be the representative of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, at and near that Grand Lodge.

In accordance with that recommendation, I was directed by the M. W. Grand Master to issue a commission appointing R. W. Bro. W. H. Weller to be the representative of this Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of Canada.

The Grand Lodge of Quebec having offered to exchange representatives, by order of the M. W. Grand Master, I recommended W. Bro. NEIL McKellyle, for appointment as their representative near this Grand Lodge, and requested their M. W. Grand Master to name a brother for appointment to represent the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island near that Grand Lodge.

I also, by order of the M. W. Grand Master, in reply to a communication received from the M. W. Grand Lodge of Manitoba, recommended R. W. Bro. Thomas A. McLean, for appointment as their representative near this Grand Lodge, and requested them to name a brother for appointment, as the representative of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, near that Grand Lodge.

This Grand Lodge is under obligations to W. Bro. McKechnie, Superintendant of our Island Railroad, for his courtesy to your Grand Secretary, and for his willingness to facilitate the attendance of members to the Grand Lodge Communication, at reduced fares.

Your Grand Secretary cannot bring his report to a close without acknowledging the brotherly kindness of R. W. Bro. WILLIAM F. Bunting, Grand Secretary of the M. W. Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, who has furnished him with all the forms and information necessary to carry out the duties of his office, which was entirely new work to your Grand Secretary.

The returns of the Lodges for the year ending December 27, 1875, have been received, and the names of all the members of the different Lodges registered, showing the total number on the roll to be 584.

Ten dispensations have been issued by the M. W. Grand Master. To confer degrees at short intervals, six, wear regalia at entertainments, four.

The receipts of this office for the year now ended are five hundred and seventy dollars and ninety cents.

The Grand Secretary read a communication just received from the M. W. Grand Master of State of New Jersey, informing the M. W. Grand Master, that at the last communication of the M. W. Grand Lodge of New Jersey, fraternal recognition had been extended to the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, and that he had appointed our M. W. Grand Master as the representative of that Grand Lodge, near this Grand Lodge, and recommended R. W. Bro. Samuel Reed of Mount Holly, N. J., as a suitable brother to represent the Grand Lodge of P. E. Island, near the Grand Lodge of New Jersey.

W. Bro. W. W. McLeod gave the following notice to amend the constitution:

Your Committee would recommend for the approval of the Grand Lodge, the several appointments made by the M. W. Grand Master, as representatives to the Grand Lodges of New Brunswick, Canada, Quebec, and Manitoba.

Your Committee quite agree with the M. W. Grand Master in reference to Dispensations for conferring degrees.

Your Committee are also pleased to learn that the warrants for the different lodges on the Island have been prepared, and that a dispensation for a new lodge, to be located in Charlottetown, was issued, which bids fair to be one of our prominent lodges.

Your Committee regret that the M. W. Grand Master has not been able officially to visit all the Lodges on the Island, and agree with him in the necessity of the Grand Lodge taking steps for the adoption of a uniform Ritual.

Your Committee regret that in consequence of snow storms, the November Quarterly Communication was not held in Summerside, and agree with the M. W. Grand Master that as our Annual Communication would so soon take place, that it was not advisable to call an emergent communication at that busy season of the year.
