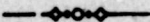

THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL MEETING.

The Thirty-second Annual Meeting of the Boys' Home was held at the Home, in George Street, on Monday, March 7th, 1892.

Among those present were Sir Casimer Gzowski, Hon. G. W. Allan, Dr. J. G. Hodgins, Dr. Thorburn, Dr. James Thorburn, Mr. John Gartahore, Mr. S. H. Baird, Rev. A. Baldwin, Rev. Wm. Patterson, Rev. John Neil, Principal McMurphy, Mr. C. H. Gooderham, Mr. J. J. Withrow, Rev. John Pearson, Rev. Canon DuMoulin, Rev. Henry Baldwin.

Letters of regret were read from Sir Daniel Wilson, Mayor Fleming, Rev. J. Fielding Sweeny, Mr. James L. Hughes, Mr. E. B. Osler, and others.

Dr. J. G. Hodgins occupied the chair and Rev. O. C. S. Wallace opened the meeting with prayer.

The Chairman then asked the Hon. G. W. Allan to read the Secretary's Report.

THE THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

The Lady Managers, in laying before the public a report for the year now past, desire to thank their many and long-continued friends for the interest shown and the support given by them towards the Boys' Home.

The Managers can now look back over the past twelve months with great thankfulness. The Home has been full to overflowing the entire year. Owing to the scarcity of work, much distress has been felt among the poorer classes,

and very many little ones, below the required age, have had to be admitted, making the lack of a nursery seriously felt ; but yet, in spite of the presence of these babies in the Home, no fatal illness has occurred, excepting one case, and that the result of inflammatory rheumatism, contracted before the boy was admitted.

The total number of inmates during the past year, including those in residence on the 1st of January, 1891, was 167. Of these, 59 were removed by parents ; 12 have been sent to situations ; and 1 died ; leaving 95 boys in residence, December 31st, 1891. Of the 12 sent to situations, 8 have retained their places, 3 are still on probation, and 1 has been returned to the Home, too homesick for his employers to keep him any longer.

There are, at the present time, 42 boys with farmers, in different parts of the country, serving their terms of apprenticeship until eighteen years of age. In order to bind these boys a little more closely to their old home, the Lady Managers, in turn, make it their duty to write to one or more of them occasionally. Sometimes the replies to these letters of the "Godmothers" (as the Managers have been called in this connection) are very characteristic. The following will serve as an example :—

DUNSFORD, Feb. 15th, 1892.

DEAR MRS. —,—I was glad to hear from both you and the Home. I was not acquainted with you when I was in the Home. I was well pleased with the little present you sent me. You will please excuse me for not writing you sooner, as I was about starting school and I waited to see how I would get along. I am getting along well ; I am in the third book and had to get a new set of books all through. We have a nice teacher, Miss Pattyson. I wrote to Miss McKay the day after I arrived here, and got no answer. I got one letter from my mother, in answer to one I sent shortly after I came. I wrote her a few days before Christmas, but received no answer ; I don't know whether she has

moved or not and would like to know, if I could find out from you or any of the ladies. Also, I would like to know if my brother Herbert is still in the Home. If he is, and would like to come out, there is a nice place about a mile from here which I think he could have. I have a very nice place and I like it well and hope to succeed in putting in my term. We are just a mile from church and school. I go to church and Sunday school every Sunday. We have five horses, eighteen sheep, eleven pigs, nine cows and twenty young cattle, and about forty fowl. I was at a Sunday school excursion about a month after I came here ; we sailed about forty miles on the steamer Crandella. I have been this winter to three tea-meetings, and to hear the Jubilee Singers, so that I have plenty of amusement. You asked to know something about the people I live with, as your name is the same as theirs. They are a young pair with no family, are members of the Methodist Church and go to church regularly ; they do have nice company, the minister visits them quite often. We live in a cottage brick house. We bought a nice new organ this past autumn ; the music teacher, Miss Campbell, mostly stays two nights in the week with us. Mr. — got me a good pair of rubbers ; Mrs. — also knit me some good warm stockings. They got me an overcoat, cap and other articles of clothing, so that I am warmly and comfortably clad for the winter. Mr. and Mrs. — wish me to ask you of what countries your ancestors were, to see if there is any relationship existing between you and them, as they did not know of any of that name except his father in this country, and he came from near Glasgow, Scotland. They also wish me to ask you, if you are ever in this section of country, to come and visit them. As it is nearly 9 o'clock, p.m., I think I will bring my letter to a close, by wishing you and all connected with the Home good health and happiness all through life.

In answer to a doubt expressed among the farmers as to the disposal of the money paid in for the apprentices, it has been considered advisable to give the names of those who, having reached the eighteenth year and fulfilled their contract, have withdrawn the full amount to their credit :

The balance, \$121.67, has been taken out by five other boys, in small amounts, remaining to their credit. One of these five is now a conductor on a sleeping car and receiving a salary of \$700 per annum. A short extract, acknowledging the receipt of the money, might also be inserted here :

February 7th, 1892.

DEAR FRIEND,—Enclosed you will find the receipt you asked me to return and I hope you will receive it safely, but let me thank you for the interest you have taken in me. I would like to have left the money there when it was bringing in 5 per cent., but still I would rather have it here. I have not put it in the Bank, as it was closed yesterday when I was in Orangeville, but I will go and put it in there tomorrow. I was going to learn the carpentering three months ago, but people advised me to stay on the farm, and as I liked it best, I have made up my mind to farm. My time was up with Mr. Robinson last September ; I hired with

him then for two months, and now for a year. I am getting my washing and mending done, my clothes made and \$90 beside for this year, but I expect to get more next year. I think I can save about \$70 this year, and I intend to save all I can every year until I have enough to start myself. I dropped you a card since I wrote you the letter and I suppose you received it too. I think this is all now.

A detailed statement of the financial condition of the Home will be found in the Treasurer's report.

There has been no change made in the *personnel* of the Board during the past twelve months, excepting the retirement of Miss Crooks through failing health.

The Management refer their friends to the Medical Officer's report for the health of the children, and here take the opportunity of expressing their gratitude to that old friend of the Institution, Dr. Thorburn, who for thirty years acted as the medical officer of the Home. During that time, more than a quarter of a century, always ready to respond to the many calls upon his time and care; and the extraordinary low mortality among the children throughout these years is the best proof of his success.

Last year, Dr. Thorburn, at his own request, took the position of Consulting Physician on the Board, his son, Dr. James D. Thorburn, in conjunction with Dr. W. P. Caven, assuming the more active duties of Medical Officers; a change which, while relieving the Doctor of the constant visiting, has been so far utilized by him in giving very close attention to a matter which has caused much anxiety and great expense—the sanitary condition of the buildings. The Management are very thankfu' to be able to say, on

the authority of some of their most practical gentleman advisors, they are now in good condition.

The Home and Infirmary are still under the kind and efficient management of Miss McKay and Mrs. Chapman, who have both been untiring in their watchfulness, during the various more or less serious illnesses among the children.

The Managers beg to acknowledge their indebtedness to Mr. Kilgour and Mr. Brush, who with their little band of helpers are laboring so earnestly in the Sunday school, for the best advancement of the children. Especially would they express their sense of obligation to the many friends who, during the months that have passed, have so thoughtfully provided at various times, trips and treats, picnics and excursions, with the never-forgotten Christmas tree; thus helping very materially to make these poor lads forget that their only home is provided by charity and that their best friends are strangers.

The older boys, under the careful direction of Miss Cowan and her assistant Miss Blight, show most gratifying progress in the day school.

Grateful acknowledgment is made of the receipt of \$2500 from the executors of the estate of the late William Gooderham, being second instalment on the legacy; also of \$200 from the Glover Harrison estate.

The Managers feel they cannot close without alluding with sincere regret to the death, during the past year, of Mrs. Freeland, one of the earliest friends of the Home.

A most cordial invitation is extended to all desiring to visit the Institution, and the Managers feel assured that such visits must surely result in deepening the sympathy and increasing the interest in the work there carried on for the poor and outcast boys of their city.

MEDICAL REPORT.

In presenting to you this, my Thirty-second Annual Report of the health of the inmates of the Home, it is gratifying to me to say that during the past year they have enjoyed fair health, which, however, is no exception to the experience of previous years.

Until recently there have been 109 boys under our care, at present there are 97.

There has been one death since my last report, viz., a boy having died in June from chronic heart disease following rheumatism.

In the early spring, measles, followed by mumps, made an invasion amongst us, and forty-seven of the boys were affected by the former disease, and sixteen by the latter. There were also several cases of aggravated influenza, and two cases of diphtheria, one of the latter patients now being in the Diphtheria Hospital, and I am pleased to say he is convalescing.

The troublesome scalp disease alluded to in two of my former annual reports, has, I am pleased to say, entirely disappeared. This is a source of gratification in many ways, and especially so, that the extra expense of keeping the infirmary constantly open and equipped, is now no longer a necessity. No better evidence can be given of the general health of our care, than the bright and vigorous appearance which the boys now before you present. In this connection I would strongly recommend that they be instructed in drill exercises as in former years. This would have a beneficial effect, physically and mentally, upon them in more ways than one.

The out-houses connected with the Home have been altered and improved, and are now in a fair sanitary condition; the same remarks are applicable to the main building.

I would again call the attention of the Directors, as I have on former occasions, to the great necessity of substituting gas for coal-oil in lighting the building, and trust before another year passes by that my suggestion in that respect will be acted upon. The use of coal-oil is highly dangerous both to life and property, and the change could doubtless be made without incurring very great expense or annoyance. I would also recommend that a telephone be placed in the Home, which would be of very great convenience to all connected with it.

We are deeply indebted to Dr. W. P. Caven and Dr. J. D. Thorburn, for the assistance they have rendered on all occasions during the past year; and I have also pleasure in bearing testimony to the worth of Miss McKay, who does all she can to make the boys comfortable.

The public and Municipality of Toronto are very much indebted to the ladies who have taken such a deep interest in the work of the Home.

After short addresses by Mr. John Gartshore, Mr. J. J. Withrow, Mr. C. H. Gooderham, and Mr. T. H. Baird, a vote of thanks was tendered to Dr. J. G. Hodgins for discharging the duties of chairman.

The Rev. Henry Baldwin closed the meeting with the benediction.

OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society ; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose ; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the " Home " daily, each week ; inspect the house ; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the " Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the direction of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys ; to conduct the household affairs generally ; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval

of the Weekly Committee; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., Dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and Divine Service in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
