At the concert held last fall by the Anxiliary \$17.00 was realized, which in addition to buying materials for a very handsome banner, has also enabled the treasurer to provide the necessary work for the winter, and there is still about \$2.00 in the treasury.

The officers of the Girls' Auxiliary would gladly welcome more of the adults of the congregation as members.
