The fourth annual meeting of the Girls' Auxiliary was held on Monday, March 11th, when reports were read by the secretary and treasurer, and the officers for this year elected. During last year 27 meetings were held. The Easter 1900 bale of clothing was sent to the school children of the mission at Hall's Bridge. Last Christmas a very large bale was sent to Rev. Canon Harding of Aspley, which in addition to over fifty articles of clothing, also contained the gift of a book or toy from each member of the Auxiliary, and twenty-five bags of candy for the annual Christmas tree for the Sunday school children; also a very pretty quilt, a gift to Mrs. Harding, made at home by two of the girls. We are now working for the Rev. Mr. Wood, who is in charge of the Manitou Mission, Rainy River District.

In addition to the usual "Educational" and "Black-foot Hospital" pledges, the girls have also contributed towards the Century Fund, Chinese Mission in British Columbia, and the St. Mary's Bible Training Home at Matsumoto, Japan.

At the concert held last fall by the Auxiliary \$17.00 was realized, which in addition to buying materials for a very handsome banner, has also enabled the treasurer to provide the necessary work for the winter, and there is still about \$2.00 in the treasury.

The officers of the Girls' Auxiliary would gladly welcome more of the adults of the congregation as members.

On Wednesday, March 13th, the annual business meeting of the St. Alban's Cathedral branch of the Women's Auxiliary took place in the chapel, when the following officers were elected:
