The English Directors of the Great Western Railway received quite an ovation at Brantford on Wednesday night.

The Reporter says that bass-fishing has commenced in the Grand River, and some very fine specimens have been caught during the past week.

The grasshoppers are assembling in large numbers in the north-western territories of the United States, and it is feared that they are preparing for an invasion of Manitoba.

HAMILTON AND NORTH-WEST RAILWAY.—Enthusiastic meetings were held on Thursday in Cheltenham and Georgetown, in the interests of the Hamilton and North-Western Railway. Addresses were delivered by Mayor Chisholm and by Messrs. Maidland Young and P. W. Dayfoot, of Hamilton, and by Mr. Plews, of salmonville. Resolutions were unanimously carried in favor of granting liberal bonuses to the road.

FATAL AFFRAY.—On Monday morning a wrangle occurred between two farmers named Thomas Keys and Wm. Keeling, in Sylvanham township, about four miles from Owen Sound, which had resulted in the death of one of the men. Mr. Keys was taking Keeling's horse to pound, as that had been trespassing on his property, and was shortly after found with his skull fractured and bleeding profusely from the brain. He was attended by two surgeons from the town, but he died on Thursday morning. A gun stock has been found, covered with blood, and Keeling is under arrest.

WANTED A FREE RIDE.—A correspondent of the Galt Reporter from Hespeler says:—As the 8:30 train was approaching that station on Monday evening last, a young man under the influence of liquor demanded from the conductor a free ride to Guelph. Being refused, he made use of improper language, and a struggle eventually ensued, during the course of which the young man received considerable injury from being struck over the head with a brick. An ugly scalp wound was the result, from which the blood flowed freely. The wound was afterwards dressed at the Devitt House by Dr. Swan.

THE MEDICAL COUNCIL.—It seems that out of the 130 votes in this Division, which ought to have been recorded for a member of the Medical Council, only 54 were sent in. This we believe was partly owing to a delay on the part of the Registrar in sending out the voting papers. Dr. Yeomans, of Mr. Forest, ran against Dr. Clarke, but on account of the delay already mentioned the number of votes that Dr. Yeomans expected were not recorded for him. Out of the 54 recorded, Dr. Clarke, (including his own vote), had 39; Dr. Yeomans, who did not vote for himself, had 15. The delay in sending the voting papers was greatly to Dr. Yeomans' disadvantage.

THE BOSTON JUBILEE.—Boston, June 21.—At the Coliseum this afternoon the audience was fully equal in numbers and enthusiasm to that of yesterday. The day was dedicated to Austria. The popular feature of the day was the performance by the British Grenadier Guards' Band, which gave the overture to "Semiramide" and several other selections, the effect upon the vast chorus and audience being electrical. Marshal Rudersdorff was led to the platform, and when the applause had subsided, sang "God Save the Queen." After a burst of enthusiasm, Mr. Gilmore, on the spur of the moment, started "Auld Lang Syne," which was sung with expression and warmth not witnessed since the festival began. Prices of seats are to be reduced to 50 cents, according to location.

Public Meeting.

The Action of the Exhibition Committee Condemned.

The Council Requested to Reconsider Their Vote.

In accordance with the announcement by the Mayor of a public meeting of citizens to discuss the action of the Exhibition Committee with respect to the granting of the use of the Exhibition buildings and grounds for public purposes, a very large number of the most respectable citizens of all creeds assembled in the Town Hall, which was filled to its utmost capacity, many being forced to remain outside. The entire meeting was remarkably orderly, and the greatest unanimity prevailed. At a little after eight o'clock the Mayor, who occupied the chair, called the meeting to order, and stated the object of the gathering. He called upon Dr. Clarke, whose name first appeared on the requisition, to address the audience.

Dr. Clarke, on coming forward was loudly applauded. He began by expressing his belief that the Council had some motive, with which he was not acquainted, for refusing the Pic-nic Committee the use of the Exhibition building. He had such confidence in them that he would not think them foolish enough to grant such a step without they had a plausible reason for it. He moved the following resolution:—

"Whereas the Central Exhibition Grounds of the Town of Guelph were purchased, and the buildings erected at the public expense for the public benefit, and the proprietors inasmuch as assembled, hereby affirm our indispensible right to use said grounds and buildings for other than agricultural exhibition purposes; such as pic-nics and other popular gatherings, under proper restrictions and conditions for the protection of said grounds from any and every use that would be injurious to the public interest; and whereas it has been a question of increased taxation, he would sooner at his advanced age, have paid his taxes than appear in public to make objections, but this was a matter of such vital importance to the town that his conscience would not permit him to stand by and see such a high-handed action without raising his voice in dissent. He had objected some time ago to an increase in the taxes of \$4,000 which had been carried by a bare majority, but this was an entirely different affair. A special meeting of the Council is called at 2 o'clock to-day, when some definite conclusion will doubtless be arrived at in the matter.

A Number of Persons Killed and Wounded.

Belleville, June 22.—The engine of No. 3 train going east broke an axle near Shannonville to day. The passenger cars ran on the engine. Nearly all the injured are second-class passengers.
