The Budget.

Mr. Foster brought down his Budget Speech last evening. As was generally expected very few tariff changes are announced. Coal oil has been reduced 2 cents per gallon, and the tariff on binder twine is reduced from 25 per cent to 12 1/2 per cent. The export duty on legs will not be reimposed at all.

The City and its Suburbs.

Some of the City Hall visitors are away on the question of the city's attitude towards suburban districts. These visitors argue for a policy of isolation as far as isolation can be effected. They are opposed to suburban railways for one thing. A former Mayor of the city stated that city street railway should be prevented from making with outside lines any alliance under which suburban residents could readily reach the centre of business at a reasonable fare. It has also been considered as highly injurious to the city to sell water or the right to use our sewers to any outside district.

The non-voting features will be bitterly contested as being an unjust discrimination against Irish M.P.'s. Indeed we do not see how their functions as Imperial representatives can be maintained, while the members of one part of the Empire are less privileged than others. Why should Great Britain insist on a policy which would deprive Imperial questions, as she could by her national vote of 80, when the people of Ireland will not be under the same Imperial obligations as England and Scotland? Mr. Gladstone would be compelled to pay, say a war tax, Ireland might be asked to contribute to the cost of the "equality" argument.

Whether in competition in the telephone business will result beneficially to the community or otherwise is about to be tested in various cities in the United States. During this month and the next the existing patents on the Bell system expire and millions of dollars are anxiously awaiting the stroke of the hour when telephone will be declared free to all within the United States. Among other cities Chicago and St. Louis will introduce new telephone systems immediately after the expiration of the Bell patents. Little reduced rentals are promised, more satisfactory service and convenient adjuncts in the shape of telegraphs, etc. It is also said that one new system will do away with the hullo girls at the central stations, thus saving the telephone exchange in Toronto and Montreal. The alternative being supplied by automatic keyboards and cog wheels. Not only, then, are business men in Chicago expecting a big drop in prices, but they are looking forward to greater efficiency in service.

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THE SEARCH-LIGHT.

Rico Pacha, who has exercised great powers in Egypt, is a Hebrew by descent and religion. He is a man of enormous energy and will power, but has little fear of the young Khedive. He has many enemies, however, at court and in society who would gladly see his ruin as a law breaker. It is a dangerous doctrine to lay down that an integral portion of the Empire cannot be kept in order except by force or by granting it an independent government. Were that recognized as a law, it puts it in the power of a few agitators to break up the unity of the Empire by piecemeal.

It would have been a nobler and more effective argument of justification for Home Rule had it been urged on the high grounds of justice, equity and expediency. England will not grant Home Rule at all under "coercion"; she will not grant it in response to "stand and deliver." It is in the power of the British Government to grant Home Rule to Ireland or to keep up coercion, as we have seen so prominent. A boon given under a threat loses much of its value, it curses him that gives and him that takes; to both it is a memorial of humiliation, the one it reminds that he was accorded justice only by fear, the other that he gave only because he no longer dares to refuse.

We do not see how Mr. Gladstone can regard a Home Rule bill for Ireland as the measure to maintain "the equality of each of the three kingdoms." Under the proposed measure Ireland will have a national legislature, national autonomy, a national status, national privileges, which England has not, and Scotland has not. The position would be paralleled by one of our provinces having a House of Assembly

and local laws, while all the rest were without.

The Irish Parliament will indeed be more than one of our Provincial Legislatures. It will have no say in matters of "peace and war, public defence, treaties and foreign relations, dignities, titles, law and treason, nor external trade, nor coinage." If the Nationalists are satisfied with these limitations they have been making "expressions about nothing," for almost everything characteristic of a "nation" is denied to their country. Mr. Blais will find it hard to explain why he desires Canada to have the power of making treaties, yet Ireland not to have "a hard row to hoe" in other features of the proposed bill.

The proposed retention of eighty representatives of Ireland in the Imperial Parliament is a necessity while the home one is limited in its powers. But there is an element of the ludicrous in the scheme to prohibit Irish members from voting on certain motions affecting other parts of the Empire, especially from voting "on any motion or resolution exclusively affecting Great Britain." It is to be prohibited from speaking, so we shall hear of some edifying discussions as to what they can vote upon and what not, with probably a "motion" once in a while to stop them from voting by the Speaker or the House, on motions they may regard as having an Irish aspect.
