



The statement brought down by Mr. McClung, the assignee, shows liabilities of\$17,000, with assets amounting to about \$10,000. The reasons advanced by the insolvent for the deficit are loss on stock at Fenelon Falls, too much advertising and competition. Mr. Patterson made an offer of 40 cents on the dollar, 20 cents payable in 30 days, 10 cents in two months, and the balance in three months, the meeting being adjourned for a week in order to hear from the creditors as to their acceptance of the insolvent's offer. Mr. Watson, Mr. Caldecott and Mr. J. A. Macintosh were appointed inspectors of the estate. The larger creditors are: Caldecott & Co., \$2800; Lailey, Watson & Co., \$1800; Hutchison & Co., \$1000; Sampson, Kennedy & Co., \$900 and Thibaudeau Bros. & Co., \$1700, the latter being a Montreal firm.


