cessary to give the necessary protection to himself and the other prisoners in his charge, the verdict said adding: We exbnerdte the keeper of all blame and from ny intent to kill." One of the three men felled by the crowbar in Syncs's hands is still in the prison hospital, men were injured only slightly shoulders and soon recovered about the head and harmed.
