## CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

## ONTARIO.

Wilioin the past few days a transaction has taket. place in the Ottawa valley which is regarded as of great imporiance to the lumber trade. It was the purchase by Robert Cox \& Company of next season's cut of deals of the McLaren Estate, of Buckingham, Que. That a sale should have been made at this early date augurs well for the prospects for next year. While the exaci figure has nut been made known, it is understood to be a slight advance over the prices realized for this season's production. Now that a start has been inade, it is expected that exporters to the British narket will shortly evince considerable eagerness to close contracts for next season's goods, and it would seem that at least fair prices are now assured It is probable that the production of deals in the Oltawa valley next year will show a decrease as compared with this season, and that a greater quantity of lumber suitable for the United States market will be manufactured. There is a possibility also that no large quantity of deals for the British market will be mannfactured in the Geosgian Bay district, and altogether we look forward to higher prices for British deals next scason.

Minufacturers and dealers report a continuance of inquiries for both pine and hardwood lumber. The movement of stock, however, has been restricied by a scarcity of cars, and it is probable that this matier will be considered at an early inceting of the Ontario l.umbermen's Assnctation.

Masitora anil hritisil col.umbia.
Fine weather in Maninba and lise Territories has greally faciliated work on
the numerous buldings in course of erecsion, 10 which is partially due the great activity in the lumber trade. Dealers in sashes and doors at Winnipeg are scarcely able to keep up with orders, and for special sizes particularly are finding difficulty in meeting the requirements of the trade. From what can be learned dealers seem to be adhering pretty closely in the regular price list. In Braish Columbia boih export and localirade is prosperous. About one month ago no less than five vessels were in port at Vancouver loading lumber inf foreign destinations. The project to consolidate all the mills in the Kootenay and Boundary districts is still under way.
oUxBRC ANI) NEW aRUNSWICK.
Spruce mannfacturers in the eastern provinces are now in a position to give their attention to logging operations, the lumber shipments for ihe season having practically terminated on account of the scarcity of stock. The market is unusually strong, and in view of the high prices ruling it is understood that one or two cargoes of deals, now in the hands of brokers, will be shipped from St . Jolin in January, the freight rate being 55s. The shipments from St. John for the last two weeks in October consisied of 1,297,000 feet of deals 10 England, 718,000 feet of boards ond scantlings to luenos liyres, $1,550,000$ feet of long lumber, $1,495,000$ laths and $1,900,000$ cedar shingles to the United States. Lumber tonnage from Nova Scotia ports to the River l'latte is enquited for, but sutable vessels are rather difficalt to obiain. Freights are about \$10.j0 to Buenos Ayres.

## UNITED STATKS.

Have lumber prices sellled down 103 winter basis? This is the question which is being asked by the lumber trade of the United States. During the past week, for the first time in several months, no advances have been made, whuch gives strengt': to the argument thit the iop notch has now been reached. The general opinion seems to be that there will be no all-round advance on any class of lumber, and that any changes made will be on certain grades and sizes to even up the price lis:. In the eastern markets the demand for pine and spruce becomes more urgent as the tume approaches for the close of unvigation, but mrough encrectic effors dealers lizve secured it fair stock for the winter requirements. At Buffilo there is acereat scatcaly of $11 / \mathrm{meli}$ box and mill culls, and reports ire made of short siocks in shelvini and dicssing At Busion bo'l pine and spruce are going inio consumption frecly. Stocks are badly broken and prices at leasi $\$$ j per
thousand higher than liey were one month ago.
The demand for hardwoods is keeping up well, and many of the lanke wholesal: consumers have been giving some attentoon to supplies for next season. In maple there has been exl:abiced a slught weakness, and there is less cooroplaint of short supply of basswood p.nd elm than formerly, but white ash cannot be found in sufficient guantity, and sells at Buffalo as high as 665 for $11 / 2$-inch.
Only a moderate trade is doing in shingles. Ai Buffalo white pine are ;uoled at $\$ 4$ and Michignn white cedar at $\$ 3.70$, while red cedars sell at $\$ 3.75$.
New Brunswick cedar slungles are still New Brunswick cedar shungles are still quoted at Boston at $\$ 3.25$.

Reports from foreign countries are such as give strength to the timber market. The South American demand is unusually brisk, and the Australian market is just commencing to show sixns of a long expected boom. In Great Britain there is a steady consumption of wood goods, and stocks are becoming reduced. Although few, if any, contracts tiave been made with exporters for spring shipments, the opinion is gaining ground that prices will be higher than the first-open-water quotahigher than the first-open-water quota-

## zUFFALO AND TONAWANDA

[Cortespondence of the Canata f.umnemay]
I am in some doubt whether I can at this writing impart any information that will ade to the sum total of knowleclge that the Canadian lumberman has of his lusiness. We nre of the opinion on this side of the line that he already knous too much. We are sorry abrout it. Why conld he not have remained child. like and mentally undeveloped till we could have gone over there and made off whth the best of his season's cut of lumber if would have added to our regard for him as a neighbor, and would have made uur freckets bulge still more than they do.
When the price of lumbet, and especially of pine, liegan to race up the scale, it was found that the western saw mill man on our sile was entirely without reason. He wanied almut as much for his stock as we in the middle of the trade, geographically, could get from the sen. board consumer. We were at a luss what to do, for to set up prices at the rate they were advancing in the west was to shut off the conservative casterner and reduce the bulk of trade. The result would he also that the cast would get into the bad halist of going around us and buying of the producer directa fatal fashion.

So it was agreed, each man with himself, that the thing to do was to go over into Canada, take it for granted that the country was mostly astecp, and pick up all the available lumber was tried so thoroughly that for a comsilerable
time evers man that came back from the Ge gian llay distict reported all the honds fa of our lumbermen, looking for stock. Well, they got sume, just as they are still getling sume hefore the repront was, but Canadian poices hefore the repront was hat Canadian pices
were as high as our own, and it was not of the were as high as our own, and it was nut of the enst use to go there alter lumier uniess there mas danger of the home cut giving out en
titely. ity.
Since that linge there has been considerable buying of pine in Canada, but unless a lot can be discovered in the back district where the owner doessit take the papers, or where the particular cut is more exactly adapted to the buyer's wants dan any othor lhat he can find, he is about as well offat home. The Canadian lumberman is generally awake these days.
For a lime there uas considerable buying of shingles in Canada, for they have been scarce here right along, but it is nut reported of the Canadian shingle maker, as well as of our own, that it has been found nore profitable to make other lumber than shingles, and that a ereat patt of the shingle mills are shut toon This uill keep the price uf shangles up, especi ally since it has been found imporsible to ge a full supply of red cedar shingles for winter The corders have been sent in for them, but there have been so many calls for cars that only a part of the orders could be filled.
The producer of hemleck is making the argest percentage of profit on his business upposing that he was making a living before the advance. At old prices henilcek was
wholesaling at less than \$0 licre, but the demand soon sent prices up, till the base price 18 now \$14, with so much prospect of more de
 advised bs authotity that 11 will have to pay $\$ 20$ licfore spring. The price is $\$ 10.50$ there null.
Theic is conssideratile pine coming: down from Cicorgian bay this falt, especially to the Holland yard at Mack Kock, and the Montgomers's are grumg ready to taing down therr secent purchase at Atidland, thought it is nut expected that it will all come this fall. lors a ulile the cut in mall mates mate by the Lirand Tiunk considerably demoralized the earryngs trade, but that has been fixed up again.
The September meeting of the pine interests here, following the more general neecting in Detrots, agan resulted in hipher priees, the ad. vance in some cases leing $\$ 3$, in spite of the already high price all round. Bax and millcull grates ate so scarce that thes had to go up with the rest, though they had already been advancel a laper percentage than anythong else in pine. The loox lactories have never done such a sushing trade as they have during the pavt summer, and they are still very hus), though the bighest enstomer, the canned-fruit indusis; is alrout out of the lush for the season.

The hatiwood dealers are very confident of a continuation of the good prices now enjoyed, especially on account of the general scarcity ol looking to them closely; but there is no accumu.
