CONFERENCE OF MINISTERS OF EDUCATION OF FRENCH-SPEAKING COUNTRIES, NOUAKCHOTT (MAURITANIA) FEBRUARY 23 - 26, 1970

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Mitchell Sharp, announced today that Canada will be represented at the first 1970 Meeting of the Conference of Ministers of Education of French-speaking countries of Africa and Madagascar, which will take place at Nouakchott in Mauritania from February 23 - 26. The Canadian delegation will include representatives of Quebec, New Brunswick, Ontario and Manitoba as well as advisers from the federal administration.
