BEATIFICATION CEREMONIES OF BISHOP DE MONTMORENCY-LAVAL, MOTHER MARIE DE L'INCARNATION AND KATÉRI TÉKAKWITHA VATICAN, JUNE 22 - 24

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, Mark MacGuigan, announced today that the Minister of National Defence, Gilles Lamontagne, will head the Canadian delegation to the beatification ceremonies of Bishop de Montmorency-Laval, Mother Marie de l'Incarnation and Katéri Tékakwitha, which will be held at the Vatican June 22 - 24. Bishop de Montmorency-Laval was the first Canadian bishop with a diocese which covered the whole North American continent.

An Iroquois, Katéri Tekakwitha, was a dominant figure in the early history of the Church in New France.
