# FIERCE FIGHT AT PHILLIPPINES

Spanish Flagship and Another Cruiser Destroyed by Fire and Other Vessels Reported to Have Been Sunk.

# ONE SPANISH CAPTAIN HAS BEEN KILLED

The Fighting Appears to Have Been Severe and the Slaughter Considerable-Spain Controls the Avenues of Information and the Admissions Made Indicate a Victory for Commo-

Madrid, via Paris, May 1.—The French Minister at Madrid is in receipt of a despatch to the effect that the American fleet was obliged to retreat after a terrible engagement. The Spanish losses were heavy and the American ships were severely damaged.

CONFIRMATION FROM MADRID. Madrid, May 1.—(6.20 p.m.)—Advices from Manila say the American squadron under Commander Dewey appeared off the Bay of Manila at 5 o'clock this morning, and opened a strong cannonade against the Spanish squadron and forts protecting the harbor. The Spanish second-class cruiser Don Juan de Austria was severely damaged and her commander was killed. Another Spanish vessel was burned. The American squadron retired, having also sustained severe damage. A second naval engagement followed, in which the American squadron suffered considerable loss and the Spanish warships Mindanao and

Madrid, May 1 .- (8 p.m.)-The following is the text of official despatch from the Governor-General of the Philippines to the Minister of War, Lieut.-Gen. Correa, as to the engagement off Manila:

"Last night, April 30, the batteries at the entrance to the port announced the arrival of the enemy's squadron, forcing a passage under the obscurity of the night. At daybreak the enemy took up positions, opening with a strong fire against Fort Cavite and the arsenal. "Our fleet engaged the enemy in a brilliant combat, protected by the Ca-

vite and Manila forts. They obliged the enemy, with heavy loss, ton an peuvre repeatedly. At 9 o'clock the American squadron took refuge behind the foreign merchant shipping, on the east side of the bay. "Our fleet, considering the enemy's superiority, naturally suffered a severe loss.
