COLLEGIATE INSTITUTES RE-OPEN. On Jan. 3, 1899—Parents' Attention Called to the New Scale of Fees.



SMELTER FOR VANCOUVER. Company Formed in England to Erect Such a Plant.

Capitalization is \$50,000. To Treat Copper and Silver Ores—Work on the White Bear—Hall Mines Smelter to Close Down—Ontario Nickel Ores in Boundary Country.

A project for the establishment of a smelter in the vicinity of Vancouver, B.C., is well on foot in London, Eng. For this purpose the Smelting Company of British Columbia has been formed with a fixed capital of \$50,000, divided into 50,000 shares of 1s each.

The prospectus just out says that \$5,000 are reserved for issue hereafter, the balance, \$45,000, being now offered for subscription in cash.
