PATRICK WICKHAM TOOK HIS LIFE WHILE IMPRISONED AT BUFFALO

Resident of Toronto Charged Himself With Bezzelment and Cut His Throat—Another Prisoner Tried to Suicide by Slashing Himself With a Knife.

Buffalo, July 5.—Two prisoners, both showing signs of insanity, sought death by suicide yesterday afternoon in cells adjoining each other at the first street Police Station. One of them is already dead, and the other is expected to die.

Patrick Wickham, a glassblower, whose home was in Toronto, the man whose case is considered hopeless by the hospital doctors is Henry Gudski, 39 years old, who resided with his family at 223 Strand-street.

Wickham cut his throat. The body of Wickham was discovered about 5 o'clock by the matron, who passed his cell and looked in. It was lying face down on the floor, which was covered with blood. Dr. F. A. Harrington was summoned, and it was found that Wickham had cut his throat. An ordinary pocketknife, which lay at his side, was the instrument which had been used.

Gudski slashed his abdomen. Dr. Harrington had only returned to his office when he received another hurried call to the police station. This time Scott Haynes had passed by the cells and saw Gudski in the act of tearing his abdomen open with a knife. The man was just in the act of making a third slash with the pocketknife when he also slashed with the knife in his clothing. After a severe fight with the sergeant, Gudski weakened and was sent to the emergency hospital.

HARCOURT SAYS "DOG-FANCY" WRITS TELL THEIR TALE TO-DAY

"I Had Full Knowledge That My Name Was Being Used, and I Intend to Have It Used Until the Ring is Annihilated." Replies Mr. Morang.

Hon. Mr. Harcourt would have the public believe that the World's exposure of the school-book ring yesterday was a mere dog-day romance. In an interview with a Telegram reporter he stated that Mr. Morang's name had been freely made use of by the World "without his knowledge or authority."

Mr. Morang's reply to the Minister's statement is this: "I had full knowledge that my name was being used by the World, and I intend to have it used until the ring is annihilated. Furthermore, if my words don't count with the Minister, perhaps the writs that will be issued on the ring to-morrow morning will. Mr. Harcourt has the documents all ready. 
