(Special to Times) Ottawa, Ont., Nov. 26—Canada's ten and coffee bill for the last fiscal year, estimated at wholesalers' prices of im-portation totalled \$9,217,422. That was the value of the total import ations of tea and coffee for the year. Retail prices for both commodi-ties are practically double the importers' prices, and consequently the actual amount paid out for tea and coffee last year by consumers was approximately eighteen million dollars.
