

N reviewing the record of the last year, the Session calls upon the congregation to unite in giving thanks and praise to Him from whom cometh every good and perfect gift.

We have pleasure in stating, what has been apparent to all, that the attendance at the Sabbath services and prayer meeting was large throughout the year. This has been encouraging to the Session. Remembering this and other manifestations of God's kindness, we feel that "Not one thing hath failed of all the good things which the Lord, our God, spake concerning us."

We gladly call the attention of the congregation to the increased spirituality of the church as manifested in the very large increase in the contributions to the missionary schemes of the church. Notwithstanding the stringency of the times, at the request of the minister the large sum of \$1,200 was contributed in one offering. It is gratifying to know that the contributions to missions were larger than ever before, and especially that many more members and adherents than formerly contributed to this fund. While only some eighty-five were regular contributors in former years, more than four hundred participated in the good work on this occasion. The Session take this opportunity of thanking the congregation for their liberality and hearty response to the request of the minister.

We call attention to the necessity for improved Sabbath School accommodation and remind the congregation that there has been established a fund in this connection to which, largely through the liberality of one member, a considerable sum was contributed. It is hoped that this fund will speedily increase.

While a goodly number joined the church by profession of faith, we regret that we did not admit so large a number as during the previous year. The decrease seems to hav

While not referring to all the other organizations in connection with the Church, we are pleased to hear of the good work successfully performed by them during the year.

Six elders retired from the Session during the year. Four of them went forth to organize a new congregation, and one received his certificate of membership and joined a neighboring church near which he had been residing. The congregation will probably soon be invited to elect a number of elders.

Every passing year reminds us that we are only sojourners here. The year 1894 was not an exception. Some of the old and some of the young were called away—a larger number than in any former year. We humbly bow before the will of the only wise God. "The Lord gave and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."

MANAGERS' REPORT.

N presenting to the congregation the sixteenth Annual Report and Financial Statement, the Board of Managers desire to express their pleasure and gratification that the necessary expenditure for the year has been so well met by the very general contributions of the members and adherents of the congregation, and the different organizations in connection therewith, the total contributions of the year just closed amounting to the handsome sum of \$9,652.03, an increase over last year of \$1,343.78, and \$1,031.48 over any previous year, except when subscriptions on account of the Church Building Fund were being received, which in face of the continued depressed condition of financial interests throughout the continued repressed to divide the continued, and as a congregation we have every reason to give thanks to Almighty God for his goodness to us.

The Treasurer's Statement shows that the offerings on the collection plates for the year were \$7,434.46—\$1,362.15 of this being for special contributions—leaving \$6,072.31 for the ordinary expenditure on church services and maintenance.

The property of the church has been well taken care of during the past year, repairs and improvements having been very generally made throughout the main edifice and Sunday School. The general renovation of the church auditorium, which will soon require attention, has not yet been undertaken.

The Board would again remind the congregation that an effort should be made to reduce the mortgage upon the church property during the present year by at least \$1,000. They would also recommend, in consequence of the large increase in the membership of the congregation, that the Board of Managers be increased to eighteen members, instead of fifteen as at present. The following gentlemen retire this year by rotation but are eligible for re-election, viz.: Messrs. F. M. Nicholson, J. A. Carlaw, James Crichton,

The following members have within the past few weeks resigned their positions on the Board for the purpose of joining and aiding in the formation of the proposed new congregation which is being formed from among the members and overflow of this church, viz.: W. F. Mitchell, J. P. Balfour and P. T. McKay. These with the number retiring in rotation, as above, and the three which it is desirable to add to the Board, will make it necessary to elect ten managers this year, three of those having the lowest number of votes to retire in 1896, and the lowest one of those remaining to retire in 1897, thus leaving six managers to retire in rotation every year.

The Board are pleased to report that the liability of our congregation for the mortgage on behalf of Ruth Street church has been removed by the conveyance of the property

to trustees of the Ruth Street congregation.

The Board would again emphasize their confidence in the general use of the envelope, which has always proved so satisfactory as a systematic method of receiving thank-offerings.

During the year the ushers have found considerable difficulty in providing sittings for strangers, and as we have by special card extended a welcome to all visitors, we should be pleased to have the pew holders support that welcome by a generous offering of any sittings they can spare. The presence of one hundred families in our midst, who are unprovided with sittings, makes it incumbent upon those holding pews to sacrifice their own comfort somewhat for the sake of their fellow-worshippers.

The Board has more than ordinary pleasure in recommending an increase to \$2,500 per annum in the stipend of our beloved pastor, whose ministrations, zeal, and kindness of disposition, combined with marked spiritual influence, and ability to present the Gospel with its everlasting truths to the overflowing congregations that his well-directed efforts draw, from day to day, to the Fountain of Mercy, lead us to devoutly hope that he may long be spared to occupy his eminent sphere of usefulness in this field of labor for the Master.

PEW SECRETARY'S REPORT.

T is again my duty to give a short account of my stewardship as an officer of the Board of Managers.

I found greater difficulty than during the previous year in attending to the wants of those desiring sittings, on account of having fewer sittings to allocate and a larger number of applicants.

In January, 1894,

193 families occupied 619 sittings on the main floor.
101 " 315 " in the gallery.
making a total of 934 sittings allocated and 89 vacant.

At the present time

204 families occupy 626 sittings on the main floor,
107 " " 331 " in the gallery,
so that out of a total seating capacity of 1,023 there are 957
allocated and 66 vacant, an increase of 17 families and 23
sittings over 1893.

Of the 66 vacant sittings in the church 40 are in the extreme back of the gallery, the balance being scattered throughout the church. We have now on our books applications for 107 sittings, while last year we had 60.

Owing to the large number desiring sittings in our church, we request that when seat holders leave our congregation they will let us know of such change. It is also very desirable that applications for sittings should be made personally to the Pew Secretary.

REPORT OF THE MISSIONARY COMMITTEE.

HE formation of this committee was authorized at the annual missionary meeting of the congregation held on the 7th of March, 1894, the members to be chosen as follows: Three members from the Session, three from the Board of Managers, and two from each of the other organizations connected with the congregation, together with the Pastor and Missionary Treasurer. Owing to the manner of the appointment of its members the committee was not fully organized until the 9th of April following.

In presenting our first annual report we desire to return our heartfelt acknowledgements unto our Lord and Master for the fulfilment to us of His gracious promise: "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in My Name, He will give it to you." We ask His help in our work, and we have been abundantly blessed by Him.

During the year the largest number that ever gave to the schemes of the church since our congregation was formed, contributed of their means to missions, the result being that the sum of \$1601.46 was received. This is the largest amount contributed to that fund in any year by this congregation.

We acknowledge our great indebtedness to our Heavenly Father for thus blessing us and in giving us in this marked way an evidence that our work as a committee and the work of our pastor has been acceptable and pleasing to Him the great Head of our church.

The committee have had "The Record" delivered to 300 families in the congregation. Many of these have paid for it, but there is still a number who have overlooked doing so, leaving a balance of \$39, or 156 quarters. This amount can no doubt be readily made up if all who have not paid would kindly pay the small sum, 25 cents per year, to the distributor.

The following ladies have now for some months past faithfully distributed the "Records," namely, Misses Agnew, Bathgate, Chapman, Fraser, Gall, Graham, Laidlaw, Miller, Mitchell, Maconachie, McBeth, Neilson, Shannon, B. Shannon and Mrs. Laws. The thanks of the committee and of the congregation are due to these ladies, and also to Mrs. Buck, who receives and arranges the papers for distribution, for their kind and faithful services so willingly performed.

The committee agreed at the beginning of their labors to endeavor to obtain one address on "Mission Work" during each month, to be delivered at the Wednesday congregational prayer meeting. In this we were partially successful, the following gentlemen giving instructive and interesting addresses on that subject: Rev. Mr. Fenwick of Corea, Rev. Mr. McVicar of China, Miss Laidlaw of Portage la Prairie, Rev. Mr. Wilkie of Indore, Rev. Jonathan Goforth of China, Rev. Dr. Somerville of Owen Sound, Rev. D. C. Hossack (our pastor), Rev. R. P. MacKay (Secretary of the F. M. Committee), and Messrs. George Smith and James Mitchell, members of our congregation.

On the 28th Nov, 1894, a Missionary Library was formed. There were many books donated and several magazines and papers—relating principally to Missions. The library is to be kept open for all on Thursday and Saturday evenings of each week, a suitable room having been fitted up (with the

Lists containing the different schemes of the Church, to be filled in by contributors to the fund, with the amount agreed to be paid to each scheme during the year, were delivered with the "Record." These, however, have not been used as generally as desirable.

In concluding this brief report of our work for the year, we desire to call the earnest and prayerful attention of the congregation to the following points: The committee has in a measure proved successful in its work; it can in a much more marked measure prove successful in the future by the united support and prayers of the congregation. We ask confidently for these, and unless we obtain both our work will not prosper as it can with them. This support can be given wisely in the following ways: 1. By aiding the distributors of the "Record," making them welcome to your homes every month and encouraging them on their way, and by the payment to them annually of 25c. for the "Record." 2. By reading the monthly "Record," especially the Mission news in it. 3. By lending or donating books, maps, magazines, or other literature, or heathen curios, to the Missionary Library, and attending it whenever possible. 4. By attending the weekly prayer meeting and especially the addresses, etc., on Mission subjects, when delivered, and, if possible, by delivering addresses 5. By filling in and returning the slips as to the schemes of the Church, and attending the Sabbath services, and once a month especially worship God by making your Missionary offering. 6. By aiding our Pastor and the Session in looking after and welcoming to the Church strangers on your street, obtaining their names and addresses and giving them to the elder of your district. 7 At all services, and at your homes, praying earnestly for the success of Missions and of the work of our Pastor and all others engaged in this noblest of all work, winning souls to

HE Girls' Mission Band was organized last March with a membership of sixteen, and has been steadily increasing in numbers and interest since then.

Meetings have been held fortnightly, except in July and August.

Missions among the North-west Indians have been studied, and a number of quilts, dolls and other articles to the value of \$25 have been prepared and sent to the North-west by the Band.

Realizing the blessings we have received ourselves by attending the meetings, the joy that comes from doing something for our Master, who has done so much for us, and the pleasure that comes from giving to those who are in need, we cordially invite all the girls who are not members to come and spend an hour with us on Saturday afternoons and share the blessings which our Heavenly Father is so ready to bestow upon us.

RUTH STREET MISSION MORTGAGE.

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE.

T a special meeting of the congregation, held on the evening of the 13th of June, 1894, the Managers of this congregation reported that an application had been made on behalf of the Ruth Street congregation for assistance towards the renewing or liquidating the mort gage on their property. It was stated that Messrs. Joseph Norwich, James W. Fenwick and C. M. Gordon, then members of this congregation, under authority given them, executed a mortgage for \$1500 in 1887 upon the property now occupied by and at that time purchased for the use of the Ruth Street Church; that the time for the payment of this mortgage had expired; that the Ruth Street congregation were not in a position to pay the amount due or renew the mortgage, and that they desired our congregation to aid them in the matter.

Upon motion the following committee was appointed to took into the matter and report the result to this congregation, namely: Major Carlaw, Joseph Norwich, J. W. Fenwick, J. M. Campbell, A. G. Gowanlock and John Winchester (Convener).

Your committee thereupon met with representatives from

the Ruth Street Church, having a number of conferences with them, the result being as follows:

The Ruth Street congregation appointed trustees to hold the property for their use; a proper conveyance was duly executed by the old trustees in favor of those so appointed; the new trustees thereupon obtained a loan on their property by way of mortgage and with the proceeds paid off the mortgage given in 1887, and a discharge thereof was duly registered, thus releasing the old trustees and this congregation from all liability in connection with the matter.

Your committee beg to report further that during the negotiations for a new loan it was discovered that the title accepted by the solicitor acting for this congregation in 887 was defective, and that it was necessary to remedy the defect, which was done after a considerable delay and the incurring of expense by the solicitors of the persons proposing to advance the money. Upon this committee representing this matter to the Managers of our Church they kindly paid the sum of \$49.35 towards the expenses of the new loan, etc., considering it proper that our congregation should at least bear the expense of making the title good.

Your committee cannot close their report without publicly tendering their sincere thanks to Mr, J. D. Spence, one of the Managers. The success of our labors was in a large measure due to his indefatigable exertions; his services as a solicitor were most valuable and those he gave to your committed gratuitously and heartily.
