Scenes of the Wildest Enthusiasm Follow Bryan's Defense of the Silver Scheme.

Chicago, July 10.—The crowds were early in motion yesterday towards the Coliseum, and by ten o'clock the hall was packed with 20,000 people.

When the resolutions committee report in favor of silver was presented, Senator Hill moved a minority report, concluding in these words: "Until international co-operation can be secured, we favor the rigid maintenance of the gold standard."

It would place this country at once upon a silver basis, impair contracts, disturb business, diminish the purchasing power of the wages of labor and inflict irreparable evils upon our national commerce and industry.
