An Act to amend the Act chapter twenty-two passed in the 28th year of Her Majesty's reign, "for the punishment of persons selling liquor without license and for the purposes therein mentioned;" and also the Act chapter thirty-eight passed in the 23rd year of Her Majesty's reign in amendment of the ninth chapter of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, intituled, "An Act respecting civilization and enfranchisement of certain Indians."

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. The first section of chapter twenty-two of the Acts passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, is hereby amended by adding to and inserting therein, after the words "competant authority," in the second line thereof, the following words, which shall be read as a part of the said section: "by himself, his clerk, his servant or agent or by any person on the premises occupied by him, there appearing to act as his clerk, or his servant or his agent."

2. The second section of chapter thirty-eight of the Acts passed in the twenty-third year of the reign of Her present Majesty, is hereby amended by adding to, and inserting therein, after the words "No person shall," in the first line of the said section, the following words, which shall be read as a part of the said second section: "by himself, his clerk, his servant or agent, or by any person on the premises, or on any steamer or other vessel sailing or trading on the coast, belonging to or occupied by him, there appearing to act as his clerk or his servant or his agent."
