LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS.

Several communications and other important matters crowded out this week.

The Berlin Tagblatt says France has offered to co-operate with the Russian fleet in the Baltic.

The London Daily News strongly urges the British Government to stop the war between China and Japan.

During the Yacht Regatta in England on Monday last, a heavy excursion boat was wrecked and twenty persons were drowned.

These reports have lately been appearing in the newspapers of the Maritimes and thousands of acres of timber lands have been burned over.

The Spanish Consul at Montreal, says Canadian codfish will be admitted free to Cuba if Canada is prepared for a treaty similar to that between Spain, Norway and Sweden.

Sir Edward Grey, under-secretary of the Foreign Office, said in the Commons on Friday last that the British Government is responsible for loss of British life and property resulting from the sinking of the Xanthus.

Rev. Father Connolly, S. J., of Montreal, who had been conducting the clerical retreat at St. Dunstan's College last week, preached a logical and practical sermon in St. Dunstan's Cathedral on Sunday last.

The schooner "Geraldine" from the West Indies was seized by Customs officers at Halifax, on Monday last. Several hundred dollars worth of bay rum, cigars and other smuggled articles were found in the hold.

The steamer "Herald" arrived at Halifax from St. John's on Sunday last. She brought Capt. Cole, wife and three children and crew of the St. John's barque "Herald", who had been on a voyage from St. John's to Halifax.

A DESPATCH from St. John's, N. I., of the 15th inst. says the property of the Notre Dame trading company at Pelly's Island was destroyed by incendiary fire. Loss \$20,000. No insurance.
