

REJECTS THE BARY.

Annie McDonald, a domestic servant said to be about 37 years of age, is suing Peter Robinson, bartender of the village of Waukegan, for \$2000 damages for breach of promise of marriage. The plaintiff has a baby a few months old, of which she claims the defendant is the father, but this the defendant denies. The master made an order yesterday, changing the venue from Pictou to Barrie.

In the action of Brooke v. The Toronto Belt Line Ry. Co. a motion was argued yesterday afternoon for an injunction to restrain the Commission of Public Works for Ontario from issuing to the company a certificate of possession under the Railway Act. The motion came up some time ago, but was enlarged, the company undertaking not to proceed with the building of their line on the plaintiff's land. W. Cassels, Q.C., W.D. McFarlane and J. M. Clark appeared for the plaintiff and Charles Ross, Q.C., and W. Macdonald for the defendant. The ground on which the injunction is asked is that the commission has no jurisdiction to grant the same, the act incorporating the company being ultra vires. The contention is that the Belt Line is part of the system of the Grand Trunk Railway Company, and therefore for the general advantage of the Dominion of Canada, and that the charter should have been granted by the Dominion instead of the Ontario Legislature. Judgment was reserved.

Argument in the action of Chaffield v. Cunningham, adjourned from the St. Catharines Chancery Court, was proceeded with before Mr. Justice Robertson yesterday and judgment reserved.

CATTLE MARKET FEES.

The Right to Sell Fodder to be Sold to the Highest Bidder.

At yesterday's meeting of the Markets and Licenses a communication was read from Messrs. Thomas Wilson, George Gross, Henry Addy, David Clark, Thomas Lowman and Jeremiah Vickers, extra guards in Toronto jail. These men complain that for three years they have occupied positions on the temporary staff and were still retained in the places mentioned even when a new man was appointed to the permanent staff a month ago. The new official, they also stated, is receiving \$27.50 per year in advance of their salaries, and this they also considered a very unfair mode of treatment.

A very animated discussion ensued, the considerations presented in this document proving quite a bone of contention. Several of the members thought that, as the petitioners stated, it was unfair to make an appointment over the heads of trusted employees; but others pressed, and this opinion Governor Green, who was present, substantiated, that competency had been the chief consideration. The argument under the new official's salary being cut down to a level with the older employees. The majority was composed of Ald. Jolliffe, Foster, Stewart, Bell, Farquhar and Stanley.

The complications in connection with the Western Cattle Market were next brought up for consideration. Ald. Foster came forward with a proposition providing for the appointment of an officer to collect the fees in connection with this institution, rather than, as formerly, farming the right out. In amendment Ald. McMath moved that the right to collect the fees be sold for fourteen months. This resolution was carried, Ald. Stewart voting yes, and Stanley and Foster nay.

In this connection Ald. J. E. Verrell moved that permission to sell fodder within the market precincts be sold to the highest bidder. The proposition was adopted.

Of the hands employed a very large number are Americans and more especially the foremen. These have been taken from the head office at Detroit.

In conversation with the manager, he expressed surprise at the very rapid growth of the business. "For the time that we have been here, that is since we have opened a laundry here, the business has increased almost more rapidly than we could have expected."

This is, however, the just reward of energy, enterprise and superior workmanship.

Standard of Business Competency. Editor World: Much credit is due to your enterprising journal for the interest you take in the subject of commercial rating, and for having procured and published the opinions of some of our leading wholesalers on the subject of "Bankrupt Stock Reform."

If there were no bankruptcies this difficulty would be at an end. The effort, therefore, so as to reach this remedy, must be made in the direction of reducing their number to a minimum. This is in the power of the wholesalers themselves.

What is it that brings about the bankruptcy of the trader? Let us deal with one cause at a time. We find that out of 1629 failures in Canada during the year 1890 312, or nearly 20 per cent., were due to incompetency arising not doubt from the belief that success in business may be gained without the knowledge and experience that is needed in other pursuits. Now it is quite in the power of the wholesaler to refuse to give credit where and when he pleases.

Why not aim at extinguishing it, at least, largely reducing this percentage of bankruptcies? Why not keep them out of business for their own sakes, if for no other reason, by adopting a plan which was recommended in a letter to the Monetary Times of May 10, 1888, and commented on in The Montreal Herald of the 30th of that month, but which was thought then by the latter paper to be not quite ripe for execution without more extended discussion.

The proposition referred to was to devise some means of fixing a standard of fitness to embark in any business—the terms of such standard to be determined by a committee of the Board of Trade—applications for credit to be refused by wholesalers unless accompanied by evidence of business qualification in the form of the certificate of such a committee.

This plan would doubtless reach either cases of failure that were evidently caused by incompetency. It might be a step in the right direction, and if the further pursuit of this subject you may be able to draw out what is needed, namely, the views of the wholesalers themselves.
