

The contention is that the Belt Line is part of the system of the Grand Trunk Railway Company and therefore for the general advantage of the Dominion of Canada, and that the charter should have been granted by the Dominion instead of the Ontario Legislature. Judgment was reserved.

There is also absolutely no danger of tearing anything that it irons. The Parisian Laundry has the copyright of this machine, both in Toronto and Detroit, the fact of which gives it a very great advantage over all competitors.

A department of the business to which especial attention is paid is railway linen, and in this department the laundry is kept

busy.

Of the hands employed a very large number are Americans and more especially of the foremen. These have been taken from the head office at Detroit.






