BRUSSELS, May 23.—A treaty concerning the Congo Free State!has been concluded be-tween King Leopold and the British Minister to Balging.

tween King Leopold and the British Minister to Belgium.

The King has recognized the British sphere of influence and abandons to England a small strip of territory in the region of the Upper Congo and Lake Tanganyika, thus giving England access northward to the Nile. In exchange England grants the King until the end of his reign the left bank of the Nile up to the seventeenth degree.

This is considered the most important African treaty concluded for many years, and is a master stroke of diplomacy on the part of King Leopold, as it shuts out France from the Nile basin and places the Congo Free State under the obligation of fighting the Soudan dervishes.

Angry Comments by Paris Papers.

PARIS, May 23.—The Temps and Debats publish hostile comments on the new Anglo-Belgian treaty as to African territory. They say that the treaty gives the Congo State access to the valley of the Upper Nile, assuring to Great Britain the strip of territory between Lake Albert Edward and Tanganyika. A Scotch Baptist Church certainly was organized in the upper room in Colborne-street; but that church beginned defunct, some four or five years after its organization. The Leesting house in March-street subsequently was occupied for a time by the First Regular Baptist Church of Toronto and afterwards by the United Secsion Church (Presbyterian), of which the late Dr. Jennings was the minister. The Presbyterian congregation removing to another part of the city the meeting house became vacant till about the month of July, 1840, when it was re-opened under the ministry of the atte Rev. W. H. Cooms of Tauton, Eng., sent out to Toronto as a missionary by the English Baptist Missionary Society, and the present Jarvis-street Church was organized, supra, in October, 1840.




