the National Steeplechase Association of  
America resulted as follows: President,  
August Belmont; vice-president, H. De Courcy  
Forbes; treasurer and honorary secre-  
tary, S. S. Hovland.

Mr. Belmont was appointed secretary,  
and was instructed to announce open the  
following stakes, to close March 4, 1895:

## TO CONVEY HOSE ACROSS STREETS

Appliances Which the Council Should  
Purchase at Once—A Timely  
Suggestion.

A well-known citizen said yesterday: "While the council was considering the question of purchasing modern fire appliances, it was strange that no allowance had yet suggested measures for properly conveying hose across the streets in case of fire. In many cities of the United States and Europe various appliances for this purpose are in use. There is a good deal of talk of purchasing an electric fire engine. It could only be used on streets where there are trolley wires, and when a fire is several blocks off they would be useless unless conducting wires were laid from the engine to the place of making these extensive purchases without the proper appliances to convey the hose to the scene of a fire?"

**Trade of the Week.**  
New York, Jan. 18.—Bradstreet says: Toronto reports a moderate volume of trade, with some improvement in orders for heavy and seasonal goods and a fair outlook. More than usual dullness is reported by Montreal jobbers, the redeeming feature in the Province of Quebec being that purchases have long been confined to actual wants, so that liabilities are smaller than usual. In Nova Scotia the volume of trade for the year has about equalled expectations, although prices have been disappointing, low, and profits consequently reduced. The situation in Newfoundland remains unchanged, with the outlook not encouraging. Bank clearing, Winnipeg, Hamilton, Toronto, Montreal and Halifax aggregate \$21,159,000 this week. Last week the total was \$22,680,000, and in the week a year ago it was \$13,707,000. There are 64 business failures from the Dominion of Canada this week. Last week the total was 53, and one and two years ago respectively it was 48 and 39.
