J. G. GIBSON'S RINK WINS THE OPEN CLASS A-McCarthy's Two Mile Open Class B.

At Prospect Park, Aug. 22.—The lawn bowling tournament was continued here today in splendid weather. 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HAMILTON ASKED FOR \$250,000.

The T. H. & B. Railway Company has asked the Toronto Board of Trade for \$250,000 to build the line from Hamilton to Toronto.

Hamilton, Aug. 22.—The evening papers to-night contained a column and a half letter from J. N. Beckley of the T. H. & B. Railway Company, setting forth the claims of the company for another bonus of \$250,000 from Hamilton for the construction of a double-track line from Hamilton to Toronto to connect with the C.P.R. at Toronto. In 1890, and again in 1892, a bylaw was passed granting the company a bonus of \$250,000 for the construction of the line. The company, however, did not take advantage of the offer, and the bonus was not paid. The company now claims that it is entitled to the bonus for the construction of the line, and asks for \$250,000 to build the line.
