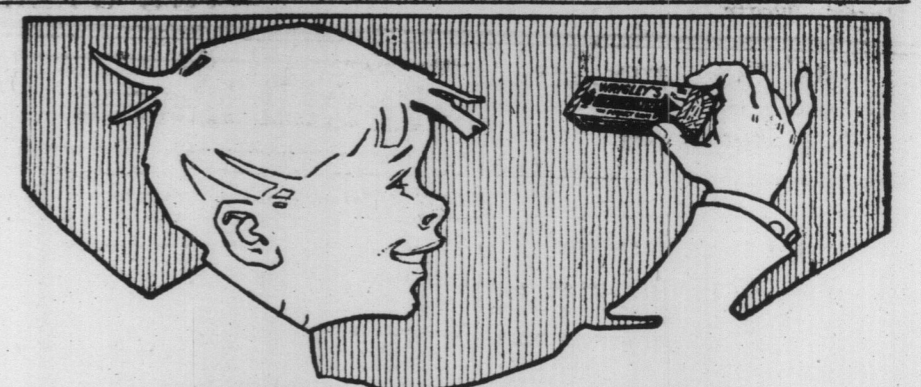

(Continued from Page Two.) entertained by pictures presented by Bishop & Bishop, proprietors of the Primrose Theatre, refreshments being served by M. W. Graves & Co. the choice quality of the cider manufactured by that firm, proving its popularity with all who were there.

THURSDAY MORNING The concluding session of the Fifty-fifth Annual meeting of the Nova Scotia Fruit Growers' Association opened at 10.30. Before the regular programme was taken up, a vote of thanks was extended to the Bridgetown Board of Trade for the manner in which the members had been entertained during their stay in Bridgetown. In the absence of the president, Mr. E. A. Hicks, appropriate replies were made by Dr. M.E. Armstrong, past president of the Board, and O. S. Dunham, Secretary. This resolution was followed by a similar one to the citizens of Bridgetown. In the absence of Mayor MacKenzie, an appropriate reply was made by Mr. E. A. Hicks, president of the Bridgetown Board of Trade, who entered the room just as the vote was being taken. A vote of thanks was also extended to Mr. Manning Ellis, the retiring secretary of the association, who had faithfully performed the duties connected with his office for seven years. He also made a very suitable reply.

Mr. C. W. Baxter, of Ottawa, gave an interesting talk on the "Grading of Potatoes" for the benefit of both the producers and consumers. It seemed to be the desire of all present for the government to adopt a regular grading system with the appointment of the necessary inspectors, etc. A resolution along these lines was passed last year and to test the sentiments of the meeting was again passed unanimously this year. This important matter will come before the Nova Scotia Farmers' Association at their regular meeting in Truro in March.

Prof. John Truman, of Truro, who was to have spoken on "The Possibilities of the Tractor for Orchard Operation," was unable to be present. Principal Cumming, of the Agricultural College of Truro, however, made a few remarks along this line and answered a number of important questions in reference to the tractor in not only orchard but general farmwork. Mr. Manning Ellis, of Port Williams, the retiring secretary read a paper on "Commercial Strawberry Culture." The session closed with the national anthem, all declaring the 55th annual meeting a big success. The officers and members of the council of the Board of Trade were at the station to say good-bye. The officers and members of the Board and the officers and members of the Association, both expressed a desire that Bridgetown would again be chosen as a place of meeting within the next few years.

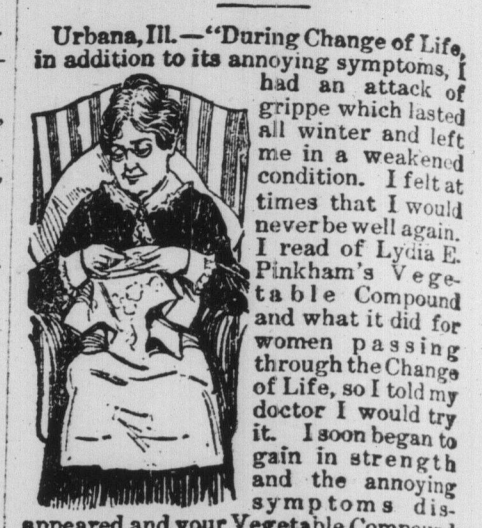
