The Weekly Prayer Meeting is held on Wednesday Evening, at 7:30, in St. Andrew's Church and the Mission Church, in alternate months.

Ordinary Meetings of the Kirk Session are held monthly in the Vestry.

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered on the first Sunday in each month.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper is observed on the first Sunday in the months of January, May and September.

Meetings of the Board of Managers are held Quarterly on the first Monday in the months of January, April, July and October, at 7.30 p.m.

Meetings of the Sabbath School Teachers are held . weekly.

Meetings of the Ladies' Association are held weekly during the winter months.

Ordinary Meetings of the Young Men's Association are held fortnightly from the beginning of October to the end of April.

Pew Rents are payable in advance on the 21st days of March, June, September, and December. The Managers are in the Vestry from 7 to 9 o'clock, p.m., on Friday and Saturday of the last week of these months, to receive payments and to let Sittings. Application for Sittings to be made at other times to the Treasurer, Mr. Inglis, or to any of the Managers.

SCHEMES OF THE CHURCH.

Contributions are made to these by means of the Schedule System, and collected by the Ladies' Association. The following are the Schemes to which Contributions are required to be made.

- I. MINISTERS' WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND, for providing annuities for the widows and orphans of Ministers who die in the service of the Church. Each Minister pays \$12 annually to this Fund.
- 2. SUSTENTATION FUND, to furnish the means of paying \$200 a year to each Minister who receives nothing from the Temporalities' Fund.
- 3. SCHOLARSHIP AND BURSARY FUND, for aiding in the education of Students for the Ministry at Queen's and Morrin Colleges.
- 4. FRENCH MISSION, for Mission work among the French Canadians.
- 5. PRESBYTERY'S HOME MISSION, for supplying with the means of grace, destitute localities within the bounds of the Presbytery of Toronto.
- 6. MANITOBA MISSION, for Mission work in the Province of Manitoba.

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REPORT OF MANAGERS.

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The Financial Statement which the Managers have now to lay before the Congregation, for the year 1872, shows not only that the prosperity of the previous year has been maintained, but that a further increase has taken place in the two chief sources of revenue, as will be seen from the following comparison:

refunded out of the revenue. The debt remaining on the Church is \$500, and on the King Street property \$2146.

The large sum of \$570 70 appears in the Treasurer's books as arrears of Pew Rent. Those who cannot conveniently get to the Church on the evenings appointed for these payments, are reminded that the amount may be enclosed in an envelope addressed to the Treasurer, and put into the plate on Sabbaths.

The Envelope System of contributing weekly towards the support of ordinances, has now been in operation for two years, with the most successful results. There are, however, a considerable number of the congregation who have not yet adopted this systematic plan, chiefly those who have recently joined, and as it is very desirable that the practice should become a general one, these are recommended to apply to any of the Managers for the necessary envelopes.

No active measures have yet been taken for the erection of a manse, the managers having deemed it advisable to delay until the site of the future church for the congregation should be fixed. The fund now available for this purpose is \$4054 48.

The Managers now find it no easy matter to meet the demand for seats in the Church. The whole number of sittings is 767; of these 721 are rented, leaving 46 sittings throughout the Church appearing as vacant. Some of these are, however, regularly occupied by adherents from whom no payment is expected.

To meet the growing requirements of the congregation it is recommended that a Fund be at once commenced for the purpose of erecting a New Church, the present site, however desirable in other respects, being too small on which to erect a building suitable to the wants of the congregation, the Managers have had under their anxious consideration the selection of a suitable site for the future Church, and have decided to submit the two following propositions, leaving the decision in the hands of the congregation, viz:

FIRST.—Sell the present Church and site; build the New Church on the property belonging to the congregation on the corner of King and Simcoe Sts., where there is also room for the Manse; purchase a lot north-east of Yonge St., to which remove the present Mission Church.

SECOND.—Sell the present Church and site, also sell the property on the corner of King and Simcoe Sts.; purchase sites in some central position north-west of the present Church, on which to erect the New Church and Manse.
