CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "THE ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. That the membership fee be \$1 per annum, and that all memberships be paid at that rate.

3. A donor of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting shall be entitled to be enrolled as a life member of the Association.

4. Associations shall pay \$5 per annum for the privilege of affiliation, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, entitling the Association to a badge, and to free entrance for Team Prizes in the affiliated Associations Matches.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council. The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Ontario, for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President.

7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents—one for each Military District.

8. There shall be a council, composed as follows:

1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected at the annual meeting.

2nd. The ex-Presidents of the Association.

3rd. The Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia for Ontario.

4th. The Brigade Majors of Militia for Ontario.

5th. The Presidents of local Affiliated Associations and Clubs, being members of the Association.

Five of whom shall form a quorum; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

9. Members of the Council may be represented at its meetings by written proxies, containing limited or full powers as may be expressed therein.

Such proxies to be held by members of the Association only, the signature to be duly witnessed, and no member to hold more than one proxy.

10. The Council shall select from its members the President of the Association.

11. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such District, and who shall be elected by the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

13. The council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any way altered, nor new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

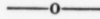
15. The annual prize meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

16. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.

17. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

18. There shall be an annual meeting to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

19 No change shall be made in the Constitution, except at the annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been sent to the Secretary three months previously, and also posted on the Bulletin Board at the opening of the annual matches.



BY-LAWS.

The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto, on the second day of the Annual Match.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting and the notices to the members. must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meeting.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of all members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure for sums of current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be tendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.
FOR YEAR ENDING 31st DEC., 1888.

In presenting the Twentieth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Ontario Rifle Association, your Council has pleasure in stating that another successful year is passed. The Association is now in its Twenty-first year, and is to be congratulated upon the good work it has done during the past twenty years, the valuable aid it has given to the promotion of Rifle shooting in the Province and the training of marksmen, thus forming an important organization in connection with the militia system of the Province.

The Annual Prize Meeting was held on the Association Ranges, Garrison Common, Toronto, on Monday August 27th and three following days. The weather was very favourable and the attendance even better than last year. The number of entries was 267 as against 232 in '87 and 188 in '86. Last year the scores made by prize winners were high, this year your Council notices with pleasure that the average of scores is still higher thus showing that progress is being made. The membership is now 266, being an increase of 22 over '87, and of 76 over '86. The number of affiliated associations has decreased 6 being 37 as against 43 last year.

At the Dominion Rifle Association matches held at Ottawa in September last, our Ontario Eight made excellent scores, taking first place in "London and Merchants' Match," again carrying off the cup and money prize of \$100. This is the second year in succession and the seventh time in 12 years that our team won this match.

The Treasurer's statement of receipts and disbursements duly audited is herewith submitted showing a cash balance of \$332.27 on hand.

The minutes of all the meetings of the Council and of the Annual Meeting of the members are also printed for the information of members.

Last year the Press complained that the arrangements made for their accommodation were inadequate. This year better arrangements were made which were satisfactory to the Press reporters. To the managers, proprietors and reporters of the various daily newspapers, the Council presents its thanks for the full and complete accounts published of each days proceedings.

To its many friends and supporters, the Association is under great obligation and your Council desires to acknowledge with grateful thanks the following grants, donations and contributions :

Held at the Rossin House, Saturday, March 10th, at 11 o'clock a. m.

MINUTES.

Minutes of two meetings of Council, held August 23rd and 24th, 1887, were read and confirmed.

ANNUAL REPORT AND CASH STATEMENT.

The Secretary presented a draft of the Annual Report of the Council, together with Balance Sheet for 1887, which on motion moved by Lt.-Col. Otter, and seconded by Major Delamere, were received, adopted, and ordered to be printed.

MUNICIPAL GRANTS.

The Secretary reported having made application to the various municipalities for the usual grant of Ten dollars, towards the Annual Prize Meeting, which action was approved of.

THE CITY COUNCIL AND THE RANGES.

A memorial from the Corporation of the City of Toronto, signed by the Mayor and City Clerk, was then read by the Secretary, praying for the removal of the Rifle Ranges outside the City limits, and claiming that the Ranges were unsafe, and that accidents to life were likely to occur, and stating that the City of Toronto would contribute towards the purchase of a Rifle Range outside the City, if a suitable selection of site could be made.

After the memorial was read the matter was discussed at some length, Lt.-Col. Gibson, Col. Gzowski, Major Delamere, Capt. Bruce and Lt.-Col. Allan, Q.O.R., speaking on the question.

The Secretary stated that His Worship the Mayor, and Mr. Withrow, President of the Industrial Exhibition Association, had called upon him and requested him to arrange if possible, for the Council to receive a joint deputation from the City Council and the Industrial Exhibition. It was decided to receive the deputation which was then in waiting.

His Worship the Mayor then at 12 o'clock, introduced the following deputation: E. F. Clarke, Mayor, Ald. McMillan, Ald. Hallam, Ald. Piper, W. G. McWilliams, City Solicitor, representing the City Council, J. J. Withrow, Wm. Rennie, W. B. Hamilton, J. K. Macdonald, representing the Industrial Exhibition.

Ald. McMillan spoke, and said that the City Council was willing to purchase a site for a Rifle Range, at Port Credit, about 12 miles from the City, which would cost the City about \$30,000. Mr. Withrow, and Mr. J. K. Macdonald, also spoke, and the deputation retired at one o'clock.

The whole matter was then again discussed when

It was moved by Major Mason, seconded by Lt.-Col. Gibson, and *carried*.

"That having heard read the memorial from the Council of City of Toronto, on the subject of the removal of the ranges, and also heard the representations made by the deputation from the City Council and the Industrial Exhibition Association, the Council is of opinion that the allegations in the memorial are in many respects not in accordance with the facts, in which view the Council is supported by the report of the Court of Enquiry, appointed by the Militia Department, but in view of the offer made by the deputation to provide ranges at Port Credit, a committee be appointed to report thereon at a future meeting of the Council, and that in connection with the extension of certain privileges to the Industrial Exhibition Association, the Secretary be instructed to remind that Association through the City Clerk, that no reply has ever been given to the letter written by the President of this Association, dated 17th May, 1887, and addressed to the City Clerk.

Resolved—That the President, Lt.-Col. Otter, Lt.-Col. Gibson, Lt.-Col. Allan, Q.O.R., Capt. Bruce and Capt. Cooper, be a Committee to consider any proposition made by the Corporation of the City of Toronto, or the Industrial Exhibition Association, in respect of the Association Ranges or any portion thereof."

COMMITTEE FOR PRIZE LIST, ETC.

Resolved, That the Annual Prize Meeting of the Association for 1888, be held the week immediately preceding that of the Dominion Rifle Association, that the following be a Committee to arrange a Prize List, and draft regulations for the same, viz.:—The President, Lt.-Col. Otter, Lt.-Col. Gibson, Lt.-Col. Allan, Q.O.R., Major Mason, 13th Batt., Capt. Cooper, Capt. Bruce, Asst. Surgeon McLaughlin, Lieut. Macnachten, the Treasurer and the Secretary.

AGGREGATE.

COUNCIL MEETING.

Held at Rossin House, Toronto, Wednesday, June 27th, 1888, at 3.45 o'clock.

PRESENT.—The President, Wm. Mulock, Esq., M.P. in the chair; Lt.-Col. Gibson, Lt.-Col. Allan, Capt. Cooper, Capt. Adam, Lieut. Lanskail, Lt.-Col. Otter, Major Delamere, Capt. Bruce, Lieut. W. S. Russell, Sergt. Mowatt and the Secretary.

The Secretary read Circular calling the meeting.

The President explained that Mr. Cockburn, M.P. of Toronto had complained to the Minister of Militia, that a Mr. Baldwin of Toronto, had complained through the public Press and to Mr. Cockburn, that an accident had nearly occurred on the Lake opposite the Ranges, on Saturday June 9th, 1888. The President explained that a correspondence had taken place between him and the Deputy Adjutant General, and also between him and the Militia Department at Ottawa, and that as a result the Ranges had been temporarily closed, and this meeting had been called, to consider what should be done under the circumstances.

The Secretary read the finding of the Court of Enquiry held in September last, and also the opinion of Major-General Sir Frederick Middleton, on the precautions necessary to make the Ranges safe.

After considerable discussion upon this matter, it was moved by Lt.-Col. Gibson, seconded by Lt.-Col. Allan, and unanimously

Resolved,—That the actual use of the Ranges by this Association, is confined to three or at most four days each year, and the responsibility of this Association should be limited to that period. But inasmuch as the local corps have always practised on these Ranges, and no other Ranges or facilities for rifle practice have been provided, this Council is of opinion that the Government should bear the cost of placing out in the lake the line of spar buoys that has been suggested, and taking any further precautions that may be considered necessary for absolute safety. This Council believes that the Government will not hesitate to incur this outlay, in view of the fact that the Government has never been at any expense whatever in furnishing rifle ranges and facilities for rifle practice for the local corps.

Moved by Capt. Bruce, seconded by Major Delamere, and unanimously

Resolved.—“That a copy of the foregoing resolution be forthwith forwarded to the Honourable the Minister of Militia, and that the Government be respectfully requested to give effect thereto at the earliest possible moment.

Moved by Lt.-Col. Gibson, seconded by Capt. Adam and *Carried*,

That this Association leaves to the local corps and the Militia Authorities, the regulation of practice of the local corps, and all responsibility in connection therewith, subject however to the right of this Association as lessees of the Ranges to lay down any terms or conditions which may at any time be thought necessary or proper.

A communication was read from Mr. C. N. Shanly, Honourary Secretary of the Toronto Cricket Club, dated May 16th 1888, asking on what terms the Ontario Rifle Association would sub-lease or give a surrender to the Government, a piece of land situated on Garrison Common, situated east of old burying ground, south of G. W. Div. track of G. T. R., west of Old Fort, and north of New Fort road, and marked in red on sketch of plan enclosed with the letter of above date.

The Council discussed this matter, when it was resolved to offer the said piece of land to the Toronto Cricket Ground Association, Limited, at a rental of one hundred Dollars per year, subject to the agreement being at any time cancelled if the said piece of land is required for military purposes.

To the Secretary of the Ontario Rifle Association.

New Fort Barracks,

Toronto, 7th May, 1888.

SIR,—

For the information of the Council of the Ontario Rifle Association, I have to apprise you that the Honourable, the Minister of Militia, has given authority, for the use of the Rifle Ranges upon the Garrison Common Toronto, "provided the necessary precautions are taken to prevent accidents." I am myself preparing regulations for the conduct of firing, which will be forwarded to you in a few days, but any alterations in the butts etc., effecting the safety of the Ranges, will I presume devolve upon your Association, whose proposed action I should like to be made aware of as soon as possible.

The following is a printed Copy of General Regulations for the Toronto Rifle Ranges, dated 7th May 1888.

TORONTO RIFLE RANGES.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. An officer of each Corps or Association at practice and the Sergt.-Instructor of Musketry must be on the ground during the whole of such practice, the former of whom will be held responsible that the firing of his own corps is properly carried out, and that the regulations are strictly enforced.
2. No shot must be fired until the targets are raised, the danger flags of the markers and "lookout" men have disappeared, and the Officer in charge ordered the "fire."
3. Under no circumstances is a man to load until in *position for firing* on the firing point; before leaving the firing point, care must be taken to throw out the last cartridge or case placed in the rifle. The practice of aiming and "snapping" must not be allowed.

4. On the appearance of the danger flag of a marker or lookout man on any one of the butts, the firing must cease there at once, and not be resumed until notice is given by the withdrawal of the danger signal, etc., as above detailed, that all is clear. Simultaneously with the appearance of the butt signal of danger, the firing point flag must be raised and the order given to "cease fire."

INSTRUCTIONS FOR N. C. O. IN CHARGE OF MARKERS.

1. Not to allow any firing until the butt flags are all hoisted, and that the lookout men are posted to warn persons from crossing the line of fire. Two "lookout" men will be posted, one at each of the extreme ends of the butt or butts in use.
2. To see that the danger flags are shewn as long as any marker is outside the butt, or any person in the line of fire.
3. To see that the markers' danger flags are raised whenever it is necessary to stop the firing, and that the targets are at once pulled down.
4. To allow no man to leave the butt until the "cease fire" has sounded, or the danger flag at the firing point is raised in answer to the signal from the butt.
5. To see whenever any one leaves the marker's butt, for any purpose, that a danger flag is invariably fixed in front at each end, and made distinctly visible by waving it, if the wind is blowing up or down the range, or when there is no wind.
6. To see that the danger flag is shown immediately any lookout man gives notice that persons, animals, or boats, are within the line of fire, and that it is kept up until the range is reported clear.
7. To allow no person, except on duty, to enter the marker's butt without an order from the senior officer on the range.
8. To see that all persons in the butt keep well under cover, to avoid the chance of being struck.
9. To see that every shot is correctly signalled.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR "LOOKOUT" MEN.

1. To warn parties attempting to cross the line of fire, whether on the land or water, that firing is going on, and if they persist in doing so, to immediately raise a danger flag, and call "danger" to the N. C. Officer in charge of the nearest range.
2. On the line of fire being clear to report the same to the N. C. Officer of the nearest range, and at his orders to withdraw the lookout danger signal.
3. To hold no communication with any one during the firing, except in the way of duty.

TWENTIETH ANNUAL PRIZE MEETING

OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION,

HELD ON THE ASSOCIATION RANGES, TORONTO,

27th AUGUST, 1888, and following days.

I.—AFFILIATION.

1. The Affiliation fee is \$5 (payable by 1st August), irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, which entitles an Association to a medal, and free entrance for team prizes in the "Walker Match."
2. Competitors on affiliated teams must have been members in good standing of such Association for at least thirty days previous to the match, and no competitor can enter as a member of more than one Association.

II.—MEMBERSHIP.

The fee for membership is \$1, irrespective of entrance fees; and all competitors must be members of the Association.

III.—ENTRIES.

Entries, accompanied by the fees for the first seven matches, must be made (upon forms to be obtained from the Secretary) on or before Wednesday, 22nd August; other matches during the first two days of the meeting.

IV.—POST ENTRIES.

1. Post entries (*ten per cent. extra*) will not be squadded until the regular entries have been provided for.
2. Post entries will be detailed to fire according to the number on the ticket issued, but the Council cannot hold themselves responsible should the holders of such ticket find it impossible to shoot before the close of the competition; in such case the entrance fee will be returned.
3. No post entries will be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

V.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Competitors *who are prevented from being present* at the Meeting, can have the entrance fees they have paid returned after the Meeting, provided that they return their firing tickets.

2. Competitors who attend the Meeting, but who are prevented from competing by illness will receive back their entrance fees on production of a medical certificate and their firing tickets.

VI.—TRANSIT.

By arrangement with the Grand Trunk, Canadian Pacific, and Northern and Northwestern Railway Companies competitors will be carried to and from the Meeting at reduced fares on being furnished by the Secretary of the Association with certificates.

VII.—QUARTERS.

1. Competitors desirous of being near the ranges may obtain a Tent and ten blankets on payment of \$1.50, or a Tent alone \$1.
2. Meals can be obtained on the ground.

VIII.—EFFICIENCY.

Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates competing in the "Canada Company," "Tait-Brassey" and "Gzowski" Matches will be required to produce Certificates from the Commanding Officer or Adjutant of their Corps that they are regularly enrolled and efficient members of the same.

IX.—RIFLES.

Rifles will be classified as follows :

CLASS I.

MILITARY BREECH-LOADERS.

1. Snider (S.) or Martini-Henry (M.H.) Rifles of *bona fide* Government pattern and bearing the Imperial viewer's mark.
2. Minimum pull of trigger, 6lbs.
3. Sights must be strictly in accordance with Government pattern, and may be *temporarily* coloured with black or white, so long as no application of a permanent nature is used ; they may also be shaded by any extemporized means. The sliding bar may be reversed, but no addition of *permanent* lines to the one down the centre will be allowed ; *temporary* marks or lines, removable at pleasure, may be used.
4. Any pad or shoe for the heel-plate of the butt, admitting of removal, and thereby allowing of variation at pleasure in the length of the stock will be disallowed.

X.—UNIFORM.

Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men competing for prizes restricted to the Militia must appear in the authorized full dress or undress uniform of their Corps, with a waist belt. Officers need not wear sword belts, nor officers of Rifle Corps cross belts. Cap covers may be worn. Uniforms to be fastened, and the heel-plate of the rifle to rest against the outside of the uniform when firing. Part uniform and part plain clothes will not be allowed on the ranges.

XI.—AMMUNITION.

1. In all Snider competitions the cost of ammunition will be included in the cost of entries. The register keepers will furnish the competitors with the

necessary number of rounds at each range. No other ammunition shall be used in Snider competitions.

2. Martini-Henry ammunition can be obtained on the ground at two cents per round.

XII.—POSITION.

In no matches will the "back position" (feet to the target) be allowed; and the word "any," relating to position, herein used, shall be considered subject to this qualification.

XIII.—TARGETS AND MARKING.

1. The size of the targets will be for regular matches :—At 200 yards—
4 feet by 4 feet wide ; Bull's Eye, 8 inches ; Inner, 24 inches ; Magpie, 3 feet ; Outer, remainder of target.

At 400, 500 and 600 yards—
6 feet square ; Bull's Eye, 2 feet ; Inner, 3 feet ; Magpie, 4 feet ; Outer, remainder of the target.

At 800 and 900 yards—
6 feet by 12 feet wide ; Bull's Eye, 3 feet ; Inner, 4 feet 6 inches ; Magpie 6 feet square ; Outer, remainder of the target.

For "Gzowski" Match—
Target 6 feet broad by 2 feet 6 inches high, with lines across in place of circles.

For "Revolver" Match—
Target 2 by 4 feet ; Bull's Eye, 4 inches ; Inner, 8 inches ; Magpie, 12 inches ; Outer, remainder of target.

2. Hits will be signalled at the butts and entered on the firing ticket according to the following scale :

HITS.	SIGNAL.	SCORE.
Bull's Eye.....	White disc.....	5 Marks.
Inner.....	Red disc.....	4 "
Magpie.....	White and black disc.....	3 "
Outer.....	Black disc.....	2 "

3. When two shots strike the target simultaneously, both hits will be marked, and that which has the highest value will be given to the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire.

4. The marking as signalled cannot be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the Range Officer is satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may telephone to the Non-Commissioned Officer at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination shall be final.

5. The competitor challenging a shot must deposit the sum of fifty cents, which will be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

6. All claims for shots signalled must be made before another shot is fired at the target in question.

XIV.—PENALTIES AND FINES.

Disqualification.

1. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own ; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so ; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target ; or
- (d) Who shall offer money or a bribe of any kind to an employé of the Association under any pretence whatever ; or
- (e) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association, shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council or to the Executive ; or
- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider to be discreditable ; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having elsewhere been guilty of any of the aforesaid offences ;

shall upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Executive Committee, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association.

Exclusion from further Competition during the Meeting.

2. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or
- (b) Who shall discharge his rifle within the enclosure, except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except on the firing points in use, and within the hours of shooting ; or
- (d) Who shall discharge his rifle accidentally, either by his own want of care, or by reason of any defect in the rifle ; or
- (e) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous ; or
- (f) Who shall refuse to comply with any order that may be given by the Officer in charge of the firing point to which he is detailed.

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

Disallowance of Score.

3. Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize ; or
- (b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the Meeting while shooting for any particular prize ; or

(c) Who when competing for an aggregate prize shall omit to enter or enter incorrectly his previous score or scores on the ticket provided for the purpose ;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

Fines.

4. Any competitor who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target shall be fined one dollar.

XV.—TIES.

Ties will be decided as follows :—

IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS.

1. When the firing takes place at more than one distance—

- (a) By the range totals in inverse order.
- (b) By the fewest *Outers.*
- (c) By the fewest *Maggies.*
- (d) By the fewest *Inners.*
- (e) By the inverse order of shots.
- (f) By division if for money prizes, or firing shot after shot at the longest distance, if for prizes in kind.

2. When firing takes place at one distance only—

- (a) By the fewest *Outers.*
- (b) By the fewest *Maggies.*
- (c) By the fewest *Inners.*
- (d) By the inverse order of shots.
- (e) By division, if for money prizes, or firing shot for shot, if for prizes in value.

IN TEAM COMPETITIONS.

- (a) If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.
- (b) By the fewest *Outers.*
- (c) By the fewest *Maggies.*
- (d) By the fewest *Inners.*
- (e) By the total of each round in inverse order.
- (f) By the highest scorer in each team shooting off three rounds at the longest distance.

IN AGGREGATES.

- 1. By score of each match in inverse order.
- 2. By following the rules for individual ties.

The names of competitors who have to shoot off ties will be posted up daily at 8.30 a.m. and 12.30 noon on the Ties Notice Board.

XVI.—PRIZE-WINNERS.

- 1. Winners of prizes must apply to the Treasurer's Office on the ground for them, and on receiving the amount of such prizes sign a receipt for the same.
- 2. All prizes not claimed before the 31st December, 1889 will be forfeited to the Association.

XVII.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

The meeting will be under the direction of an Executive Committee, composed of the Chairman and two members of the Council, to be nominated by the Council, whose decision shall be final and binding in all matters submitted to them for their consideration; but they may, at their discretion, refer any questions to the decision of the Council, in which case the decision of the Council on such questions shall be final.

1. All competitors will be subject to the Executive Committee, Officers, or Non-Commissioned Officers in charge of their respective ranges or squads, the Camp Police, and the General Regulations for the conduct of the Meeting.
2. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the General Regulations of the Meeting, as also with the conditions attached to the prize or prizes for which they have entered, *as the plea of ignorance of such regulations and conditions will not be entertained.*
2. They must refer to the Notice Boards daily, and ascertain whether any orders have been issued which alter or affect the original details.
4. They must attend at the firing point punctually at the hour detailed on the Firing Detail Board, and deliver their tickets to the Register Keeper. Unless a competitor produces his firing ticket at the firing point, he will not be allowed to fire. Should a competitor lose his firing ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity given him of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, his claim on the Association in regard to such compensation will be cancelled.
5. The matches will take place, if possible, at the time named. Any deviation from the rule will be posted on the Board of the Secretary's Hut. Temporary discontinuance on account of bad weather will be at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
6. The firing will begin daily at 9 a.m., and cease when the mid-day gun is fired. It will be resumed at 1 p.m., and cease at 6 p.m., except on the second day, when the firing will cease at 5 p.m., to enable members of the Association to attend the Annual General Meeting.
7. Two guns will be fired for the "Fire," one ten (10) minutes before the name hour, to warn competitors to move to the firing points; the second being the signal that firing is to begin. Two guns at the "Cease Fire," one ten (10) minutes before the hour named, after which no competitor will be allowed to begin his score; the second as a signal that all the scores begun before the first gun are completed.
8. Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.
9. No hair triggers will be allowed.
10. Slings may be used as an assistance at all matches; but in those restricted to Militia the slings must be of regulation length and pattern, and attached to the rifles, as in Government arms.
11. No "sighting" or "fouling" shots will be allowed.
12. Competitors may wipe out or clean out their rifles during any competition between distances only.
13. No two competitors shall shoot with the same rifle in the same match (except in the "Martini-Henry"); nor shall a competitor change his rifle during a match unless it becomes unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Range Officer.

14. Every competitor must enter and shoot under his own name, and, unless otherwise satisfied, not oftner than once for any prize.
 15. No member of a squad or firing party shall absent himself without leave during firing. Any competitor delaying the squad will be passed by.
 16. No competitor using a breech-loader shall load until called to the front to shoot.
 17. In all competitions, competitors will be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately*, but only one file at a time will be allowed *within* the firing ropes; and no person except the Register Keeper will be permitted to speak to a competitor after he has taken his place at the firing point, except in cases hereafter specified.
 18. Where only one competitor is present, he must necessarily fire his shots consecutively and without undue delay.
 19. A competitor may have any one present within the ropes to see that the scores recorded by the Register Keeper are in accordance with the signals from the butts.
 20. In individual competitions, a competitor may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided his doing so is not allowed to delay the shooting.
 21. In matches shot for by "representative" teams, all competitors will be permitted to have a "coach" or "spot," and to use binoculars or telescopes, providing that their doing so does not delay the firing.
 22. The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint a "spotter" to assist him; but no person, with the above exceptions, will be permitted within the ropes, or allowed to offer advice or give instructions to competitors.
- Any violation of this rule, or of any part of it, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the Officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on a repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Committee, who will deal with the case as laid down in the Regulations under the head of Penalties, and may remove any person advising or instructing a competitor from the ground.
23. Any competitor protesting against the ruling of the Officer of the Range, or feeling himself aggrieved in any way, must make a statement of his grievance in writing (upon forms to be had at the office), giving the names of two or more members of the squad who can bear him out in his statements, and hand it in to the Secretary; but his firing must not be delayed for that purpose.
 24. No practice will be allowed on the ranges during the continuance of the meeting, either before or after the day's firing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, *three* points will be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of such shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the target, in excess of the number of shots allowed, could only have been made by competitors in the section firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case that section will be disqualified.

REGULATIONS FOR VOLLEY FIRING.

Each section will fire in single rank, being commanded by the same officer, the hits being registered after each round.
