The Municipal Council

WEDNESDAY FORENOON

Council met at 10 Minutes of yesterday's proceedings read.

Coun. Adams said he was fully in accord with the principle involved in resolution introduced yesterday by Coun. Campbell with reference to the manner of appointing Alms House Commissioners, but before minutes were adopted he would like to see that portion expanded which says that more efficient men could be obtained were the Council to have the appointment of said Commissioners. He did not care to assist in doing anything which would even have an appearance of casting the slightest discredit on the present Commissioners comprising as they did some of the most intelligent gentlemen in the county.

Coun. Campbell said he had no desire whatever to cast any discredit on these gentlemen. The resolution did not do so in a certain extent, could be procured and surely this was no slur on the Commissioners.

Coun. Loggie said he did not see anything objectionable in the resolution. The present Commissioners were fairly good men, but that did not move that they were the very best men in the County, for it might just be possible that better men could be obtained.

The minutes, as prepared, were then adopted.

Council adjourned until one o'clock for dinner.
