





## WARNINGS AGAINST THE WEED.


The London Lancet has been con iucting an invest The London Lancet has been conducting an investi-gation into the tobacco question and arrives at some in-teresting conclusions. It has discovered that the pipe smoker absorbs the most nicotine, the cigarette smoker the least, and the cigar smoker somewhat less than the pipe smoker. It says that Havana cigars contain re-markably little nicotine, and that Turkish cigarettes have more than the American cigarettes. The Lancet finds, however, that in some tobaccos there is a worse poison than nicotine, and this is furfural, a chemical that is credited with giving cheap whiskey its deadly character. Furfural was found in considerable quantities in Virginia cigarettes. There is little of it in Turkish cigarettes and in pipe and cigar smoke it is rare-ly detected.



It is inferred from the Lancet's investigation that the cheaper the cigarettes, the more dangerous they are to the smoker, and it follows that there are two reasons why boys should not smoke. One is that the practice has the effect of stunting their growth and impairing their general health, and the other is that since they usually smoke only the cheapest kinds of cigarette they are exposing themselves to the action of a drug that their plders for the most part can avoid. 




