We have the honor to present the following Report regarding the Schools under your charge for the year 1899.

Appended to the Report will be found Statistical Tables which give in detail all important particulars relating to Teachers, Pupils, Attendance, Absenteeism, Tardiness, Studies Pursued, Cost of Maintenance, etc.

ATTENDANCE.

The total number of pupils registered during the year was in the Kindergarten 4,725, in the other classes 29,885, of whom 1999 were promoted from the Kindergarten.

The average daily attendance was in the Kindergarten 2,097, in the other classes 21,775.

There are two music teachers and one drill instructor engaged in special teaching.

The certificates of the teachers are as follows: First Class, 83; Second Class, 468.

KINDERGARTENS.

The certificates of the Kindergartners are as follows : Directress, 94; Assistant, 32.

There are 46 Kindergartens in connection with our schools. The total number registered in the Kindergartens during the year was 4725, the average of monthly registered numbers was 2690, and the average

FREE TEXT BOOKS.

The total cost of Free Text Books issued in 1899 was \$1,291.10. Of this amount \$248.23 was returned for the text books sold, leaving a balance of \$1,042.87, as the cost of free text books during the year. A large amount was saved by repairing books in the schools with bookbinders' paste and strips supplied by the Board. In nearly every school the books have been preserved with great care.

The total cost of supplies including work books, exercise books, book-keeping blanks, dictation books, business forms, drawing books, writing books, slates, rulers, etc., was \$2,482.74. \$380.85 was received for supplies during the year, leaving the net cost of supplies \$2,101.89.

The cost per pupil for text books on the basis of total enrollment, omitting Kindergarten pupils, was 3½ cents.

The cost per pupil for text books on the basis of average monthly attendance, omitting Kindergarten pupils, was 41 cents.

The cost per pupil for supplies on the basis of total enrollment, omitting Kindergarten pupils, was 7 cents.

The cost per pupil for supplies on the basis of average monthly attendance, omitting Kindergarten pupils, was $8\frac{1}{2}$ cents.

The cost per papil for both text books and supplies on the basis of average monthly attendance, omitting Kindergarten pupils, was $12\frac{3}{4}$ cents.

The cost per pupil for text books, supplies and Kindergarten material on the basis of total enrollment, was 13 cents.

In the above statements the text books and supplies for Night Schools are charged against the day school pupils.

CITY MODEL SCHOOL.

The attendance at the Model School for giving professional training for third class teachers was 41.

The following obtained third class certificates in December, 189°. Nearly the whole of the successful candidates held higher than third class non-professional certificates, so that after teaching for six months they will be eligible for admission to the Normal School for professional training or second class certificates.

THE INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS.

The attendance at the Victoria Industrial School for boys during 1899 was 186. Of these, 69 attended during the whole year, 55 were sent from the Institution, and 62 were admitted. The principal states that the boys are improving in conduct, and there is less trouble in their management than formerly.

The teachers in the school-are doing efficient work, considering the fact that the pupils in all but the lowest class attend school only one-half of each day. It would be desirable to have the hours of teaching lengthened in order that the pupils might be able to give more time to their studies. There seems to be no reason for having the school hours in an Industrial School correspond with those in an ordinary Public School.

The attendance at the Alexandra Industrial School for girls during 1899 was 36. Of these, 25 attended during the whole year, 13 were sent out during the year, and 13 were admitted.

The girls are attentive to their work, and considering the circumstances, they do good work.

SCHOOL LIBRARIES.

There are thirty teachers' libraries in the schools. In some instances two schools are united for library purposes.

Each library now contains 135 books, including the following books purchased in 1899.

REPORT OF CLERK OF SUPPLIES.

In presenting my Report for the year I wish to state that quite an improvement has taken place in regard to the care of Text Books and supplies, greater economy being practised in the use of the general supplies. More especially is this the case with regard to the manner in which the Blank books are filled, being much more satisfactory than formerly.

The Kindergartners have also been as economical as possible in the use of material.

The slates used in our schools are of poor quality; the slate itself is very thin and easily broken, while the frames become detached in a short time; in fact a slate cannot be got at the price paid that will give satisfaction. If slates are to continue in use in our schools, to any great extent, I would recommend that one of a better quality be procured, which i am sure would be in the interest of the Board.

There were 3,335 Text Books rebound, 3,420 Text Books were condemned as being unfit for use and were replaced with new ones, 1,218 Text Books were paid for as well as a considerable quantity of general supplies, and 549 Text Books were confiscated by the Medical Health Officer, having been in the possession of pupils who had contagion in their homes.

See tables (A), (B), (C), (D), in the Appendix to the Minutes of the Board, showing the quantity of Text Books, General Supplies and Kindergarten Supplies on hand at the beginning of the year, the quantity purchased and delivered during the year, and the quantity on hand in December 1899.

MUSIC REPORTS.

MR. CRINGAN'S REPORT.

In presenting my report on Music for the past year I have much pleasure in testifying to the satisfactory nature of the results which have been accomplished in the departments under my direction. In the report of last year regret was expressed that the teaching of Part-Singing had not been attended with the success that could be desired, but, in one department at least, this has been remedied. The action of the Board in supplying music readers to the Senior Second Book Class has resulted in a degree of proficiency in this important respect which was previously impossible of attainment. During the year the pupils of this grade have had a distinct advantage over their less fortunate fellow-pupils who have studied from blackboard exercises only. The decision of the Board to put all senior pupils on an equality with the Second Book Classes by

providing them with music readers will advance the teaching of music in our schools to a greater extent than any previous action in the history of Education in Toronto. In addition to the increased economy of time formerly required to be spent in blackboard writing, and which may now be devoted to practical teaching, our pupils will have the invaluable advantage of studying music from the printed notation, the only form in which they are likely to meet with it in actual practice.

The question of the application of the Tonic-Solfa system to the Staff Notation has received a considerable amount of attention during the year, and has been widely discussed by our School Trustees and musicians who take an active interest in musical education. Of the latter a large majority have expressed flattering opinions of the results of our work, while one or two have expressed doubts regarding the thoroughness of the teaching of the Staff Notation. Regarding this I can report of a limited number of schools only, as the arrangements existing during the past year were of a nature which confined my supervision to eleven schools. In these the Staff Notation was taught by the regular teachers with results which could not fail to meet with the approval of any impartial investigator, however exacting. These results tend to confirm the statements repeatedly made by the most distinguished musical and educational authorities of Britain that "Pupils trained in the Tonic-Solfa system make the most correct and reliable readers of the Staff Notation." It must not be overlooked that, in order to secure satisfactory results, the previously acquired knowledge must be applied not ignored.

The teaching of Sight-singing and Voice Culture has been productive of results equally satisfactory with those of former years. As our teachers are steadily acquiring a more thorough knowledge of the scientific principles underlying correct methods of voice production higher ideals are presented and a definite improvement is distinctly perceptible. The enthusiasm with which they continue to co-operate in the advancement of musical education is again worthy of the highest commendation. As my visits are separated by an interval of five weeks the teaching is almost entirely in the hands of the regular teachers who deserve every credit for the conscientious manner in which the work has been accomplished.

The expression of confidence extended to me by the members of the Board in appointing me to the responsible position of Director of Music is deeply appreciated. I shall endeavor to show this appreciation by renewed efforts to raise the standard of musical education in the larger field with which I have been entrusted.

MR. PERRIN'S REPORT.

The progress of the pupils has to a greater or less extent been affected by the influence imparted by the teachers, who having thrown themselves into the teaching of this subject have met with deserved success. The progress has been more greatly marked where the pupils have been first made to read the notes as they recognize their position in the key before securing any practice in attempting to sing them.

In order that the teachers instruct the pupils on one uniform plan in the rudiments of music, printed explanations of a few of the principal terms in common use have been placed thus far in the hands of a portion only of the teachers for that purpose, so that when questioned at a future time the pupils will in most cases be found better grounded in these essentials than has been evident in the past.

The advance of the pupils in the Senior III book classes where the foundation of the notation is first studied has not been uniformly successful. The introduction of new teachers, and the interval elapsing

before their appointment, has possibly had something to do with this short-coming. Commendable work in other classes has however been well worthy of imitation.

The teachers of Junior IV book classes especially have experienced more or less difficulty in uniting the parts of a song after their pupils have already proved themselves able to sing them separately. To overcome this lack of confidence on the part of the pupils in adhering to the notes, they are suffered to take one note only of each part at a time, and sing them together until the ear has grown accustomed to hearing the opposing sound. Then a second trial is made, adding only the adjoining note in each part, until by this continual addition of one or more notes the difficulty of bringing a song to completion has been surmounted. This exercise, at the hands of teachers and pupils alike, requires much care and patience in its practice.

In some few instances pupils of the IV book classes have done wonderfully well in placing the bar-lines in position correctly in a piece of music where it would seem to them the accented notes lay.

A better practical knowledge of the time of the notes has been gained by the persistent habit on the part of the pupils of beating time, which eventually will be of a direct advantage to the individual pupil when in retirement he sings independently of both class and conductor.

There are a few teachers who can do better work in some other subject than in the teaching of music, and have accordingly throughout the year arranged with other teachers to take the music lesson in their classes, an interchange I fear that has not any too regularily been carried out to have been of much service. In fifteen instances only has it been necessary to resort to this expedient.

Oftentimes there comes the complaint that the pupils weary of a song before they have properly appreciated its good points, whereas in some cases it is the teachers themselves who are at fault, being unable to teach the song effectively they tire of it before the beneficial character of the music is discovered.

The following table shows the approximate percentages as regards the standing of the schools for the year, resulting from the general bi-monthly oral examinations, including proficiency in singing. Schools not appearing in this list have fallen below the average.

REPORT OF THE INSTRUCTOR IN MILITARY DRILL AND PHYSICAL EXERCISES.

I have the honor to submit the following report of the instruction in Drill and Physical Exercises in connection with the Public Schools of the City of Toronto for the year 1899.

I am pleased to report that the Senior boys have taken up the work with renewed interest—nearly every boy endeavoring to become more efficient than his neighbor.

The formation of Cadet Companies has been the cause of the improvement. It is gratifying to know that the pupils have begun to see how necessary Drill and Physical Culture are to them, in order that their physical side may be developed equally as much as their mental side.

During the year I had the honor of commanding a Company of Cadets, which was composed of boys selected from the Fifth Book Classes of the several Public Schools of this City. In spite of the opposition raised by some of the citizens, this Company was formed, equipped, and sent on a forty-five hundred mile trip, in answer to the invitation from Governor Bloxham, of Florida.

On February 2nd the Company left the city and travelled to Tampa, Florida, by way of Sarnia, Chicago, St. Louis, and Montgomery. We were received with open arms and were treated royally all the time we were there. The boys behaved themselves admirably, and I was proud of them. The Cadet Corps was absent two weeks and secured a grand reception on their return. This was the first armed Corps ever permitted to pass through the States. Since that date the Company has visited Madoc on May 24th, Markham on July 1st, Brampton in July, and Niagara Falls in July. The Cadet Company acted as an escort to the Chicago Cadets while they were in Toronto. Both corps camped in High Park and were under my command for two weeks.

In September new service rolls and recommendations for appointments were sent to the Militia Department as the officers to the original companies had left school along with numerous others of the cadets. We have not received the arms and accoutrements from the department as yet, but this no doubt is owing to the fact that the Militia Department has been kept busy with arrangements for the Canadian Contingents.

The work of the senior girls for the past year has improved, and could be very much better if the teachers would give the necessary time to the practice of the physical exercises as taught by me. I again strongly recommend that in these classes physical exercises with apparatus be taught.

I very much regret that I am unable to give the amount of instruction to the junior classes that I would like, owing to the large number of senior classes. I strongly recommend that an assistant be appointed to assist me with the junior classes.
