REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY

FOR THE YEAR 1876.

The Committee of Management have the honor to lay before the members the forty-first Annual Report.

Although the dulness in commercial and industrial affairs has, throughout the year, had its natural effect in sending before our Society a large number of cases of distress—some of them very sad—yet the number has not been so great as during the previous year, nor has the amount expended been as large.

We have relieved 89 cases comprising about 120 persons in all.

The total amount expended in charity is \$766.55 details of which will be found in the Report of the Sub-Committee of Charity.

The Treasurer's Report shows the financial condition of the Society.

Your committee desire to bring under the notice of the members the great advantage which would result to the Society if donations of cast-off clothing were made from time to time.

The sub committee of charity report that a sum of about \$50 has been disbursed in the purchase of clothing alone. If members, or others desirous of aiding us, having east-off clothing to give away would notify any of the officers of the Society arrangements would be made to send for it.

Your committee regret to state that our membership Roll has not been increased during the year, and they would urge upon the members the desirability of endeavouring to

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ship Roll uld urge uring to augment their numbers, thereby increasing the usefulness of the Society. One ordinary member has elected to become a Life member.

Our anniversary service was held in the Cathedral on the Eve of St. George's day (St. George's day falling on Sunday) when an excellent sermon was preached by the Revd. M. M. Fothergill; the Revd. G. V. Housman, M. A. and Revd. C. W. Rawson, M. A., assisting in the service. The musical portion of the service was conducted by Mr. Ed. A. Bishop, to whom the Society is much indebted: we have also to thank the Ladies and Gentlemen of the Cathedral Choir and others who kindly lent their aid on the occasion.

The offertory in aid of the society's charitable fund amounted to \$74,25.

Our arrangements with the Finlay Asylum and Ladies' Protestant Home continue to give satisfaction, and our thanks are due to the officers of both these institutions for their ever ready and willing help to forward our interests.

Our acknowledgments are also due to the Quebec and Gulf Perts Steamship Company and Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company for kindly reducing the fares for those passengers we have had occasion to send them.

To R. H. Russell, Esq., we owe many thanks for his cheerful and kind assistance in various ways, especially in obtaining opportunities for men who were anxious to return home and willing to work their passage. We are also indebted to the Deputy Shipping Master for similar favours.

Our thanks are due to our Physician for gratuitous services and also to our Clergy for their valuable aid.

There have been no interments in our lot at Mount Hermon this year.

The Society deplores the death of James G. Colston, Esq., Q. C., L L.D. He was a member of the Committee of Management for some years and always took a lively and active interest in the affairs of the Society.

In conclusion your Committee would bring under your notice the number of undeserving tramps who are continually

travelling from place to place and appealing to the various Charitable Societies with plausible stories which it is impossible to disprove—and they would suggest for the consideration of their successors in office whether some means cannot be devised to lessen this evil.

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REPORT

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SUB-COMMITTEE OF CHARITY

TO THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

FOR THE YEAR 1876.

The Sub-Committee of Charity have the honor to report

Relief has been extended to eighty-nine cases of distress, comprising one hundred and twenty persons; 73 men 27 women and incidentally 20 children.

The amount expended by the Sub-Committee in charity is \$666.55, distributed as follows:

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Of those partially assisted to return Home two were single men, and the others were families of 3, 5, 7, and 3, respectively; all were deserving cases.

It is worthy of note that the above expenditure includes some \$50 or over for clothing which had to be purchased for individuals completely destitute, about to cross the Atlantic, &c.

R. H. Russell, Esq., shipping master, kindly found opportunities for six of the above to work their passages home, the Society providing them with clothing and other necessaries. These were able-bodied individuals temporarily without employment, whom we make it a rule never to send Home at the Society's expense. The Deputy Shipping Master, Mr. Miller, has also been very obliging in rendering assistance in the same direction.

A mother and her two children were accommodated for a time in the Ladies' Protestant Home, where every care and attention possible were shown them.

The Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company, and the Quebec and Gulf Ports S. S. Company have kindly favoured us in the usual way.

Our physician has cheerfully rendered professional aid, and our chaplains have earnestly assisted this Committee in its efforts to alleviate distress. The Rev. J. S. Sykes, Port Chaplain, has also done good service in this way. time 20 80

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aid, and ee in its es, Port As in past years your Sub-Committee have found their chief difficulty in distinguishing between deserving and undeserving cases, and in guarding against the class of vagrants, or *tramps*, who trayel over the Country preying upon our charitable organizations.

Peter Shappard, native of Guernsey, came to Canada in 1809. Died at Quebec, 23rd August, 1856, at the age of 63 years.

John Racey, Senior, native of Bath, came to Quebec in 1801. Died in England in 1 56, at the age of 73 years.

The Earl of Ellesmere, K. G., visited the United States, in 1854, as one of the Queen's Commissioners to at end the opening of the New York

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es, in 1854, as one of the New York Crystal Palace, which made him favorably known to the American people. He visited Quebec also at that time, and was the guest of the Earl of Elgin. He expired at Bridgewater house, St James, on Wednesday, the 18th March, 1857. Was treasurer from the formation of the Society for sixteen years consecutively. The Society has erected a monument to his memory in the Cathedral.

The Right Revd. George Jehosaphat Mountain, D.D., D.C.L. Lord Bishop of Quebec, was the second son of Bishop Jacob Mountain, the first Anglican bishop of Quebec. He was born 27th July, 1789, at Norwich, England, came to Canada with his father, 1703, and died after a brief illess at Bardfield, his country seat, on 5th Jeny., 1863. He was nineteen years Rector of Quebec, and was consecrated Bishop 14th February, 1836. He was a diligent visitor among his flock, and in the dreadful visitations of cholera in 1832 and 1834, he literally lived night and day among the dying and the dead, while in 1847, when the province was visited with the plague of typhus fever, and the poor emigrants were dying by thousands at the Quarantine station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Isle regularly with the rest of the clergy; and again when the cholera visited Quebec, in 1849 and 1854, he was diligent in visiting the hospitals. During many years and up to the time of his death, Bishop Mountain, besides his Life membership, contributed regularly to the Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptions, and at all times took a great

interest in its proceedings.


