Atmospheric electricity, the velocity of the wind, the transparency of the air, Foucault's experiment to prove that the earth revolves, all can be studied. Spectroscopes for analysis of the light of the sun and stars will be placed under the dome. A study equally interesting will be that of the variation of temperature with altitude. For the public a very strange sight will be the effect of lightning and the deviation of a falling body.

The tower will be surrounded by a lightning rod, but in itself the tower will be glaced for the young and formidable quantities of electricity. To produce that effect a lightning-rod will be placed on the summit of the tower and the conductor will be interrupted for the space of two yards. The lightning will thus jump from one section to another, with continual explosions.

At the base of the tower, on immense blocks of marble, inscriptions recalling the history of the century will be engraved in gilded letters. There will be found extracts from the names of illustrious republicans, etc. The weight of this tower will not be greater than 7000 tons, almost enough iron to make a railroad from Paris to Saint Germain by way of Versailles. The cost will be about \$1,000,000, but the inventor of this gigantic work asks only the admission fees for ten years to pay all the expenses of the building.
