At Manchester on the other day Rev. George C. Griffith, Protestant clergyman, was tried for the wilful murder of his mother as Kilgys, Osnaby Kerry, and sentenced to be hanged on the 9th inst. The prisoner was in considerable financial difficulties. His mother was found dead in the drawing room with a bullet wound through her head. Prisoner absconded, taking with him all the money she possessed, but was arrested the following morning in Killarney. The only other person in the house at the time of the murder was a female servant, and before leaving the prisoner informed her that her mistress had died of heart disease.

We love, adore and imitate them for their own sake because He is God; we respect and imitate them for their own sake because they are the most perfect of every virtue that is most pleasing in the sight of heaven. They are also real models of every good, strong and endurable quality of mind and heart that are most valuable for all human beings as members of society, striving to be active and earnest in doing their duty to God, to their neighbors and to themselves. Time is short and eternity long.

We are placed in this world for a certain purpose, which is to provide for this life and for the life to come and we have every chance for doing this. We have to leave this life after a certain time and give place to those who come after us.  
There is an immense treasure of valuable knowledge and wisdom in the words and well considered words of the learned and saintly Pontiff Leo XIII. As for the working men and all those whom penury and the inferiority of their condition so irritate, chiefly in our time, they have only to turn their eyes to the most holy members of this domestic society to find in them an incentive rather for rejoicing than for repining at their lot. In fact, they participate with the Holy Family in the same labors and the same care of daily life. Even Joseph had to provide for the wants of his life by the fruits of his hand; more than that, the Divine hand of our Blessed Lord themselves condescended to the material work of the artisan, to those and commonest labor. Therefore, it is not surprising that the very wisest men, abounding in wealth, should have stripped themselves of it and preferred to share the poverty and humble life of Jesus, Joseph and Joseph."
