The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, today announced the following appointments:

Mr. Arthur Julian Andrew, at present Canadian Ambassador to Israel and concurrently High Commissioner to Cyprus, as Canadian Ambassador to Sweden.

Mr. Robert Louis Rogers, at present Head of the Far Eastern Division of the Department of External Affairs in Ottawa, as Canadian Ambassador to Israel, succeeding Mr. A. J. Andrew.

The appointment of Mr. Andrew's successor as Canadian High Commissioner to Cyprus will be announced in due course.

Mr. Andrew was born in Pictou, Nova Scotia, on November 20, 1915, and studied at Dalhousie University. After employment with the Canadian Press in Halifax he joined the Canadian Army in 1939, serving on the Atlantic Coast and in the United Kingdom, Italy, and northwestern Europe. Mr. Andrew joined the Department of External Affairs in 1947 and has served with Canadian diplomatic missions in Bonn, from 1950 to 1953, and in Vienna from 1953 to 1954. He was Chargé d'affaires ad interim in Prague from 1957 to 1960. Mr. Andrew was appointed Ambassador to Israel and concurrently High Commissioner to Cyprus in 1962.

Mr. Andrew is married and has two children.

Mr. Rogers was born in Toronto on November 23, 1919, and is a graduate of the University of Toronto. After joining the Canadian Army in 1942, he served in Newfoundland, in the United Kingdom and in northwestern Europe. Mr. Rogers became a member of the Department of External Affairs in 1946, serving with Canadian diplomatic missions in Washington and Tokyo. In 1958 he was appointed Counsellor in London, and in 1960, Counsellor with the Canadian Delegation to the North Atlantic Council. Since July 1963, Mr. Rogers has been Head of the Far Eastern Division of the Department of External Affairs.

Mr. Rogers is married and has four children.
