



Hay Island Range Lights, two Range Lights upon Hay Island, Miramichi Bay, to enable vessels, in seeking shelter, to clear the point of the shoal off the east end of the Island. Latitude N 47° 14′ 10″; longitude W 65° 3m 40s; the front light is fixed white catoptric, exhibited from a lantern hoisted on a mast 15 feet high; it is elevated 23 feet above high water, and should be visible 10 miles; at the base of the mast is a small shed painted red. The back light is distant 210 feet from the front one; it is fixed white catoptric, elevated 30 feet above high water, and should be visible 11 miles; the building is a square wooden tower, 21 feet high from base to vane, and is painted white.

Oak Point, Front—Miramichi Bay. Latitude N 47° 7′ 10″; longitude W 65° 41′ 58″. One fixed white light, 43 feet above high water; visible 10 miles. Lantern hoisted on a mast, with white shed at base—all supported on trestle work.

Oak Point, Back.—1800 feet N E by E from front light; one fixed white light, 48 feet above high water; lantern hoisted on a mast, with white shed at base—all supported on trestle work. These two in one lead to red buoy in river above.

Sheldrake Island, Miramichi Bay. Latitude 47° 5′ 37″; longitude 65° 10m 5s; two fixed white lights on masts, with shed at base; quarter mile apart, visible 9 miles: 48 feet above high water; range lights.

Grant's Beach, Miramichi Bay. Latitude 47° 5′ 10″; longitude 65° 23′ 15″; two fixed white lights, bearing S W and N E from each other, visible 10 miles; both lights are lanterns hoisted on a mast, with white shed at base, supported on trestle work, 120 and 140 feet above high water.

Middle Island, Miramichi River. Latitude 47° 3′ 28″; longitude 65° 27′ 0″; mast, with shed at base; fixed white light, 45 feet above high water.

Newcastle Light, on Lime Kiln Bank. Latitude N 47° 0m 45s; longitude W 65° 33m 40s; fixed red dioptric, 87 feet above high water; visible 9 miles; square wooden tower, white, with red roof.

Bay du Vin Island. Front light on W end of Island, back light 1,222 feet N E by E from front light; latitude N 47° 5m 20s; longitude W 65° 7m 5s. Two fixed white lights visible 10 miles, 30 and 42 feet above high water; both lights are lanterns on mast; red shed at base.

Fox Island, north west point of Island. Latitude 47° 8′ 5″; longitude 65° 2′ 20″; three fixed white lights, visible 8 miles. One of the lights is situated within 100 feet of the most northern point of the Island: it is 50 feet above high water, and has a post 40 feet high. Second light is 1051 feet SE ½ E from the first named, and will be 46 feet above high water, with a post 38 feet high. Third light is 954 feet S W by W ½ W from the first named, and 36 feet above high water, with a post 28 feet high. The first and second in line range N W ½ N into the Horseshoe Channel. The first and third in line range N E by E ½ E through Portage Island Channel. The second and third in line range W by N ½ N leading to the upper buoy of Horseshoe Shoal.

Fox Island, east end, or Swashway; latitude 47° 6′ 50″; longitude 65° 0′ 10″; two fixed white lights, visible 10 miles; white tower, 30 feet above high water mark; range lights to guide vessels through the Swashway Channel.

Miramichi Bay Light Ship, Horseshoe Bar, between Fox and Portage Island. Latitude 47° 8′ 0″; longitude 65° 3′ 0″; fixed red light, visible 8 miles; 35 feet above high water. A schooner-rigged ship.

Preston's Beach, Miramichi Bay. Latitude 479 4/ 50//; longitude 659 54/ 40"; two fixed white lights, visible 10 miles, 55 and 60 feet above high water. White Beacons; range lights.

Escuminac, on Point. Lat. 47º 4/ 82// lone 649 47/ 33//; fixed white light, visible 14 miles; white tower, 70 feet above high water. A steam fog horn situated 100 yards west of the lighthouse, sounds blasts of 6 seconds duration, with intervals of 35 seconds.

Richibucto Head, on Headland. Latitude 46° 39' 40'': longitude 64° 42' 30'': fixed white light, visible 14 miles; white square tower, 70 feet above high water.

Richibucto Harbor Range Lights, two range light towers, close to the present day beacons upon the South Beach, at the entrance to the Richibucto River. The front building is on the outside of the bank; S beach white square tower, 33 feet high to vane on lantern; latitude N 46° 42' 45''; longitude W 64° 46" 10"; the light is fixed white catoptric, elevated 40 feet above high water mark, and should be visible 12 miles. The back tower is distant W by S & S 306 feet from the front one; it is an open white square tower, 43 feet high to vane on lantern; the light is fixed red catoptric, elevated 44 feet above high water mark, and should be visible 12 miles. These two lights are intended to replace the day beacons, and in one lead through the channel over the bar at the mouth of the river.

Buctouche Inner Lights.—Latitude N 46° 29' 35"; longitude W 64° 40' 30". Front light close to shore road, on Indian or Church Point, is a fixed white light on white square wood tower, with red roof, 23 feet above high water mark, visible 9 miles. Range lights visible in direction of range, replacing former day beacons. Back light (1,980 ft N N W | W from front one) is a fixed white light on white square wood tower, with red roof, 53 ft above high water mark, visible 12 miles. Head into harbor through deepest channel, clear of all obstructions, from line of range of Dixon's Point lights to where channel turns abruptly to westward to enter Buctouche River.

Buctouche Range Lights. Built on line of former day beacons to guide into Buctouche Harbor; latitude N 46° 27m 40s; longitude W 64° 38m 50s. Front light fixed white, white square wood tower, on Dixon's Point, 36 ft above high water mark, visible 11 miles. Back light 1,050 ft N W by W from front light; is a fixed white light on white square wood tower, 41 ft above high water

mark, visible 12 miles.

South Beach, entrance to Richibucto River; two range light towers; latitude N 46° 42′ 45″; longitude W 64° 46′ 10″; fixed white catoptric light 40 feet above high water, visible 12 miles. The back tower is distant W by S 1 S 306 feet from the front one; open frame square tower 43 feet high, painted white. The light is fixed red catoptric, 44 ft above high water, visible 12 miles.

Cassie's Point, on Point; latitude 46° 19' 15"; longitude 64° 30' 20", revolving white light every half minute, visible 14 miles; white square tower; 47 feet above high water.

Shediac Island.—Line of range W by N 1 N; latitude 46° 15′ 20″; longitude 64° 31′ 50″; two fixed white lights, visible 10 miles; white masts, with elevated platform 48 and 56 feet above high water. Beacons.

Shediac Harbor, Point du Chene Wharf. Latitude 46° 14' 20"; longitude 64° 31′ 0″; two white lights, visible 6 miles on iron masts with sheds at the base, 32 and 38 feet above high water mark.

[Sea Coast Lights are distinguished from Harbor Lights by the latitude and longitude being given. Sailing Directions are also given, not true nautical, but according to general campass courses and bearings].

West Quoddy Light. Latitude 44° 48′ 54″ N; longitude 66° 57′ 1″ W; tower of brick, painted with red and white horizontal stripes, connected with dwelling house by white building; fixed white light, visible 16 miles; situated on the west side of the entrance to Eastport and the St. Croix River, via Lubec Narrows. Fair anchorage in West Quoddy Bay 1 mile N W by N from the entrance. The Narrows have lately been dredged to a depth of 12 feet at low water, the Channel being 200 feet wide; but strangers should not attempt to pass through without a pilot. There is a Steam Fog Whistle at West Quoddy Head, giving a blast of 8 seconds duration at intervals of 52 seconds. Sail Rock, a dry ledge, lies ½ of a mile from this Light, and when the tide is running should be carefully avoided.

Molton's Ledge. Morton's Rock; red can buoy 2nd class. Boatman's Head bears from the buoy S W by W ½ W 2 miles. Sail rock E by N 2 miles.

Little River Light, on an Island at the mouth of Little River Harbor; tower white, attached to Keeper's dwelling; fixed white light varied by a flash 1m 30s; visible 11 miles; seen from N E by E ½ E, via eastward to south. Also, fog bell, struck by machinery twice a minute. Latitude 44° 39′ 45″ N; longitude 67° 12′ 5″ W. Good anchorage for a small number of vessels just inside the Island. To enter harbor pass to eastward of the light, leaving a spar buoy on starboard.

Cutter Harbor Entrance. An Automatic Whistling Buoy is placed 9-10 of a mile from the light. The light bears from the buoy N W by W ½ W 1. This buoy will be in place during the months of June, July, August and

Libby Island Light, on S W end of Libby Island, at mouth of Machias Bay and River; latitude 44° 34′ 5″ N; longitude 67° 22′ 2″ W; grey tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles. Island is divided in two parts, with the Light situated on the S W end of the western part. To enter the harbor via eastern entrance, get Avery's Rock Light to bear N by E and run for it, leaving it handy on starboard hand, then N by E ‡ E, to a high, bluff, woody Island, which leave not less than ‡ of a mile on the port hand, then N ½ W half a mile and anchor. In using this Channel, keep a sharp look out for the eastern end of Libby Island, which runs low, and extends 1 mile E N E from the Light, and for Cross Island Ledges, which make off from Cross Island on your starboard, and off which is a red can buoy. The Channel here is about a mile wide. To enter via western entrance: Pass Libby Island Light a fair berth on your starboard hand, and get it to bear S S W half a mile, then run N E by E until Avery's Rock bears N by E, then continue as via eastern entrance. A Fog Trumpet has recently been established here, located on the extreme S W end of the Island, giving in thick weather blasts of 7 seconds duration at intervals of 40 seconds. If the Trumpet becomes disabled, a bell will be struck by machinery, one blow every 10 seconds.

Avery's Rock, in Machias Bay, near mouth of River; tower built from the top of Keeper's dwelling, painted white; fixed red light, visible 12 miles.

Mossepeak Light. Latitude 44° 28′ 27″ N; longitude 67° 31′ 57″ W; white tower, white flash light, 30 seconds between flashes, visible 13 miles. Mistake Island is to the northwest side of entrance to Bay of Fundy. For entering Mossepeak harbor, leave the light a fair berth on your port hand, and steer about a N W course 1 mile, keeping midway between the shores on either hand, and as soon as passing through the Narrows haul towards the N E a few lengths and anchor. There is another small harbor about N N E, 1½ miles from the light, called the Cow Yard. From Mossepeak Light, Libby Island bears N E by E ½ E, 9 miles. Petit Menan Light W ½ S, 17 miles.

Moosepeak Automatic Buoy, in deep water, off Moosepeak light; works by action of the sea; often heard 4 miles; Bearings—Moosepeak light bears N by W 2 miles, Petit Menan Ledge W 3 S 15 miles, Petit Menan light W 15 miles, Libby Island light 3 E 9 miles.

Nashe's Island Light: white tower; fixed red light, visible 12 miles. To enter Moosepeak Reach, west entrance, leave light on starboard hand; also, a guide to Pleasant River.

Narraguagus Light; in top of a white dwelling house; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. Located on Pond Island, at port hand side of entrance to Narraguagus Bay and Millbridge. Bell struck by hand to answer signals in thick weather.

Petit Menan Light; on Petit Menan Island. Latitude 44° 22′ 2″ N; longitude 67° 51′ 51″ W. Tall grey tower; white light, varied by a flash once in two minutes, visible 17 miles. This light is a warning against dangerous shoals, of which Petit Menan Ledge, or South East Breaker, bears 8 8 E 3½ miles, on which is 6 feet at low water, (Iron Nun Buoy) painted vertically red and black stripes. Sims' Rock bears 8½ E 2 miles; 9 feet at low water. (Spar Buoy). Tibbett's ledge bears E by N 3 miles, 9 feet at low water; no buoy. On Petit Menan there is also a steam fog alarm giving two blasts a minute; intervals between blasts 8 and 42 seconds; heard 8 miles. A dangerous neighborhood for strangers.

Petit Menan Whistling Buoy; painted red; P M in black letters marked on it. This buoy is placed half way between Sims' Rock buoy and Petit Menan Reef buoy. Nash Island Light bears from this buoy N E § E 84 miles.

Prospect Harbor Light; on the eastern side of entrance to Prospect Harbor. White tower, showing a flashing red and white light, visible 11 miles. In running for the Harbor, bring the light to bear N ½ E. But it is a dangerous locality for strangers.

Scoodac Point Whistling Buoy; painted red. Egg Rock Light House bears from this buoy N W \(\frac{1}{4}\) W, 5 miles; Petit Menan Light House E \(\frac{1}{2}\) N, 8 miles. This buoy bears S S E \(\frac{3}{8}\) of a mile from south end of Scoodac Island. Sounds by motion of the sea.

Winter Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles. On south point of Mark Island, western entrance to Harbor, leave on port hand; also, guide to Mosquito Harbor.

Egg Rock Light; on Egg Rock, in Frenchman's Bay. White tower, rising from the middle of a square white dwelling. Fixed red light, visible 12 miles. Fog bell struck by hand for passing vessels. Bearings—Bar Harbor bears N W ½ N 4 miles; Baker's Island bears S W by S ½ S 8 miles. An automatic whistle buoy ¾ of a mile from Egg Rock, entrance to Frenchman's Bay. A guide to clear Egg Rock.

Egg Rock Whistling Buoy will be in place June, July, August and September.

Baker's Island Light; latitude 44° 14′ 27′′ N; longitude 68° 11′ 56′′ W; white tower, connected with Keeper's house; white light, varied by a flash every 90 seconds; on Baker's Island, off Mount Desert; a guide to Cranberry Island, north east and south west harbors. On entering either of these, leave light on port hand; but in going to Bass harbor leave it on starboard hand 1 mile. Bearings—Bass Harbor Head bears W ¾ N, 5 miles; Mount Desert Rock bears S ¼ W, 18 miles; Petit Menan Light bears E by N ½ N, 16 miles.

Baker's Island Whistling Buoy; painted red and black stripes. Letters B I marked on it in white. Baker's Island Light House bears from this buoy N W 1½ miles; Bass Harbor Head Light House W by N, 7 miles; Scoodac Whistling Buoy N E by E½ E, 7½ miles. This buoy is a guide to Frenchman's Bay, Southwest Harbor or Bass Harbor.

North East Harbor Light; tower painted brown, with black lantern; fixed white light, visible 14 miles, on Bear Island; a guide to N E harbor by leaving it on the starboard hand.

Bass Harbor Head and Light; tower painted white; fixed red light, visible 13 miles; north east side of entrance to Bass Harbor and Blue Hill Bay, Mount Desert; a bell struck by hand to answer signals. To enter Blue Hill Bay and Bass Harbor bring this light within the bearings of W by N \(^3\) N and N W, and run for it, leaving the light 150 yards on starboard hand, to cross the bar in best water (10 feet at low water). When the light bears N by E. you are in best water on the bar. If bound to Bass Harbor, when the light bears N E \(^1\) of a mile steer N \(^3\) W into the harbor, keeping the starboard hand shore within \(^1\) of a mile to clear Weaver Ledge, and anchor at will.

Mount Desert Rock; latitude 43° 58m 7s; longitude 69° 7m 42s; grey tower; fixed white light, visible round entire horizon 14 miles; on Mount Desert Rock, Maine; a bell struck by machinery. Bearings—Baker's Island bears N ± E, 18 miles; Petit Menan light bears N E ½ E, 23 miles; Moosepeak bears N E by E ½ E, 38 miles; Matinicus light W ½ S, 33 miles. Vessels bound to St. John will run E N E straight up between Grand Manan and the American shore.

Burnt Coat Harbor Light; has recently been changed from two lights, to a single white light, visible 11 miles; on south end of Swan's Island. To enter harbor, bring the light to bear N E \(\frac{3}{4}\) N, and run for it until quite close aboard, then haul to E by N about \(\frac{1}{2}\) of a mile to anchorage.

Eggemoggin Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 9 miles; on Green Island, at entrance to Eggemoggin Reach; also, guide to Ellsworth.

Saddle-Back Light; tower, upper part, grey; lower part, white; on an Islet near S W end of Isle au Haute; a guide to Isle au Haute Bay, and to East Penobscot Bay; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; leave on port hand fair berth and steer N ½ W for Eagle Head Light.

Mark Island Light, on an Island at the western entrance to Deer Island Thoroughfare, or to Merchants' Row; white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. This station is in Isle au Haute Bay, bearing about N N E from Saddle-Back 4 miles. To enter Thoroughfare, leave light on starboard hand; to enter Merchants' Row leave it on port hand.

Heron's Neck Light, on the south point of Green Island, the most southern one of the Fox Islands; a guide to Carver's Harbor and to Hurricane Sound; white tower, fixed red light; visible 14 miles.

Engle Head Light, on Eagle Island, at the head of Isle au Haute Bay; guide to the N E entrance to Penobscot Bay. Vessels on entering will leave Saddle Back on the port hand and run straight for Eagle Head, leaving it on the port side; white tower; fixed white light; visible 13 miles.

Bantam Ledge.—A whistling buoy, painted red, with the letters "B. L." in black, moored in 18 fathoms, Bantam Ledge bearing N, 4 of a mile distant. It is a guide past Bantam Ledge and into Booth Bay Harbor from the southward.

Automatic Buoy; a whistling buoy is placed just off Boon Island ledge; it is painted red and black in horizontal stripes, with "B I L" painted in white on the middle black band. Is often heard 6 miles. It bears E by S 3½ miles

from Boon Island light. The ledge is awash at low water.

To enter Portsmouth harbor get Portsmouth light to bear N \(^3\) W, and run for it until Whale's Back light bears S E by E and you are abreast the southern end of Wood Island, then steer N \(^1\) E until past Fort Point, and Portsmouth lighthouse bears W by S \(^1\) S, then steer N W until the light bears S by E, and anchor; or, when Portsmouth light bears S by E, steer S W \(^3\) S, and anchor close in shore in the cove to the westward of Fort Constitution in from 2\(^1\) to 6 fathoms. Strangers in entering Portsmouth harbor should take a pilot if possible.

Newburyport Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. Also, a beacon, range of light, 336 feet in front of main light; black and white tower; fixed white light, visible 8 miles. These lights, in range, guide across the bar, in best water; bar constantly changes; outer bar buoy is in range with inner bar buoy and both lights; the beacon is moved as the channel changes. This station is on the north end of Plum Island, and on the south side of entrance to the Merrimac River, Mass. (Strangers should not attempt to enter.)

Newburyport Upper Harbor; two lights (beacons); outer beacon, black tower, fixed red light, visible 10 mls.; inner beacon, red tower, fixed green light, visible 12 m.; both on Bailey's wharf, and to be left on port side passing up the harbor.

Ipswich Lights; on Castle Neck, south side of entrance to Ipswich River; a main light, with a range light in front; main light fixed, white, varied by flashes, visible 11 miles, flashing once in 1½ minutes, shown from a white tower; range light, fixed, white, visible 8 miles, shown from a black tower; the lights are 625 feet apart, N E½ E and S W½ W; in range, they guide to entrance of channel across Ipswich Bar in the best water, which at present is but 6 feet at low water.

Annisquam Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; a harbor of refuge for small vessels; on Wigwam Point, east side of entrance to Annisquam harbor; 6 feet of water on Squam Bar at low tide. To cross the bar, bring the light to bear south and run for it, leaving it on the port side; then run for the Lobster Rock Beacon, and leave it on the port side also.

Straitmouth Island; on south side of Sandy Bay, entrance to Rockport harbor; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; to be left on port hand in going to Rockport. Bad ledges lie off this light. Strangers should keep the north shore of Sandy Bay best aboard on entering Rockport; shelter only for a few small vessels.

Cape Ann Lights; latitude 42° 38m 15s; longitude 70° 34m 30s W; two grey granite towers, 165 feet above sea level; fixed white light, visible 20 miles; the lights are 900 feet apart, in range at SSW and NNE; located on Thatcher's Island off Cape Ann, and the northern limit of Massachusetts Bay; to be left on the starboard hand in going towards Boston. Bearings—Isle of Shoals bears N, 17 miles; Boon Island NNE, 30 miles; Gloucester Light SW by W¼W, 6 miles; Long Island Light SW by W, 24 miles; Cape Cod Highland Light Sby E¾E, 43 m.; Londoner Ledge SE by E,½m. Salvage Ledge NNE, 2 m. Also, a 10 inch steam whistle, giving each minute a blast of 8 sec. and a blast of 4 sec., with alternate intervals of 4 and 44 secs.

Gloucester Light, on Eastern Point; on east side of entrance to Gloucester harbor; white tower; a revolving red light, showing once every 5 seconds, visible 9 miles. Give Baker's Island a berth of not less than half a mile, leaving it on the port hand, then run for Hospital Point Light, bearing about W by N \(^1\) N, until Derby Wharf light is in range with Fort Pickering light, when Salem harbor will be to the W S W of you, and Beverly harbor W by N \(^1\) N. Also, on Baker's Island a bell which strikes two quick blows each half minute. For better information, a lens panel has been placed in "Hospital Point" Light, which makes a more brilliant light in the line of the ships' channel from Baker's Island than on either side, and serves to keep vessels from danger on either side.

Hospital Point; grey tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; on Hospital Point, north side of entrance to Salem and Beverly Harbor.

Fort Pickering Light; red tower; fixed white light, visible 10 miles; on Winter Island, north side of entrance to Salem harbor. On entering Salem harbor from near Hospital Point, get Derby Wharf light in range with Fort Pickering light to clear the Haste Shoal; good anchorage half a mile S W by S from this light, with Derby Wharf light bearing W by S.

Derby Wharf Light; on the end of Derby Wharf, Salem upper harbor; red

Marblehead Light, on Marblehead Neck, south side of entrance to Marblehead, and to Salem South Channel; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; good anchorage balf a mile W by S from this light. From Cape Cod highlands the course for Boston Light is N W by W 1 W, which well clears Minot's Ledge and the Hardings; then, when well past Minot's, bring Boston light to bear W by N & N and run for it until within 1 of a mile of it or until the Beacon light bears about W by N, then run W & S until the Beacon light bears W N W, then run W by N leaving the Beacon light 100 yards on your starboard hand, then steer N W 1 W (keeping the middle of the channel) for the Narrows between Galloups and Lovell's Islands, then about N W & N for the bell buoy off Nix's Mate, which leave on port hand, then run W by N 1 N for Fort Independence, leaving the lower middle buoy, red can, No. 6, a good berth on your starboard, and State Ledge buoy, red Nun No. 8 close aboard on your starboard; then run about N W 1 N for the upper middle buoy, black Nun No. 9, which leave on your port, then the course to Long Wharf or to good anchorage is about N W W. But if approaching Boston from Cape Ann, via Broad Sound, bring Long Island Light to bear S W by W, and run for it until Deer Island Point Beacon bears N W by N½ N, three-eighths of a mile distant, then W by N¼ N up the harbor. Strangers should bear in mind that in the middle of Broad Sound there is but 8 feet of water at low tide; but by keeping on the southern side of the Sound, leaving the Graves Whistling Buoy ½ a mile on your port hand and the Devil's Limb Buoy (black can No. 1) ½ mile on port hand, and running straight to Ram's Head buoy (black can buoy No. 5) about W S W, passing Aldrich's Ledge buoy (black can No. 3) ¼ mile on port, then leaving Ram's head 50 yards distant on port, and run about W¼ S to clear Deer Island Point Beacon, you can carry 12 feet safely. From the Beacon you will steer W¾ N for lower middle buoy, then W by N¾ N for State Lodge Buoy, when proceed as before given.

Explanatory: it baned od somitem -

Aphelion—The point of a Planet's orbit farthest from the Sun.

Apogee—That part of the Moon's orbit farthest from the Earth.

Astronomical Day is reckoned from noon to noon through the 24 hours. Thus, July 21, 9h, is 9h A of July 21, and July 21, 15h, is 3h M of July 22.

Conjunction—A Planet directly between the Earth and the Sun is said to be in Inferior Conjunction with the Sun. A Planet with the Sun directly between it and the Earth is said to be in Superior Conjunction with the Sun. Planets are said to be in conjunction with each other, or with the Moon, when they are in the same sign and degree.

Declination—The distance of a heavenly body from the Equinoctial, measured north or south, in degrees or minutes, on a Meridian.

Ecliptic—The plane of the Earth's orbit, so called because Eclipses can take place only when the Moon is on or near it.

Elongation—The distance of a Planet from the Sun as seen from the Earth. Equinoctial—The circle in the heavens traced by the Earth's Equator.

Node—That part of the orbit of a heavenly body which intersects the Ecliptic.

If the body is passing from south to north, it is called the Ascending
Node: if from north to south, Descending.

Node; if from north to south, Descending.

Opposition—A Planet with the Earth directly between it and the Sun is said to be in opposition to the Sun.

Penumbra—That portion of space around the shadow of the Earth, in passing through which the Moon diminishes in brightness, in consequence of a part only of the Sun's rays reaching her surface.

Perigee—That part of the Moon's Orbit nearest to the Earth.

Perihelion—That part of the Planet's Orbit nearest to the Sun.

Quadrature—Two heavenly bodies are said to be in Quadrature when they are distant from each other by one-fourth of the Zodiac, or three signs apart.

The Sun's Declination and fast or slow of clock are given for apparent noon,

or time of passing the Meridian of St. John.

The Moon's Southing is given in Astronomical time for the Meridian passage at St. John; and her Declination, when on the Meridian.

The Rising of the Moon is given from Full Moon to New Moon; and the Setting from New Moon to Full Moon.

TIDES.

The Tides in the Calendar are the Morning and Afternoon Tides at St. John and Charlottetown. In the Tide Table (page 37) will be found Constants for finding the time of High Water at each of the places given in the Table. In editions of this Almanac prior to 1885 the Tides were only given ap-

proximately, but ever since they have been corrected for the varying distance of the Moon from the Earth, and also her angular distance from the Sun. They can now be depended on as accurate to at least the same degree as the Admiralty Tide Tables.

It will sometimes be found that when a Constant is added to the time of High Water at the Port of reference the sum exceeds 12 hours; in this case subtract 12 hours from the sum and the remainder will be the time of High Water at the required Port on the succeeding afternoon or morning, according as the Tide at Port of reference was a Morning or Afternoon Tide.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of its great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature, and prevent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from violent storms.

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon, but an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a century has shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prophets like Moore, Zadkiel and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast the weather day by day for a whole year; but meteorological science in the British Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Bureau of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast, with any certainty, the weather for more than three or four days at the most.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of the Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled to trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always blows towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of the telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, mistakes are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much remains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact sciences.

Post Cards.—Dominion and United States, Ic. Great Britain and other Postal Union Countries, 2c. Reply Post Cards for use within the Dominion will be issued at two cents each. Canadian one cent Post Cards can be forwarded to the United Kingdom if a 1c. Postage Stamp be affixed.

Drop Letters.—City (including districts heretofore known as Carleton, Portland and Indiantown), 2c. per ounce.

Mail Letters.—From one place in Canada to another, and between Canada and the United States, 3c. per ounce; between Canada and Newfoundland, and between Canada and Great Britain, 5c. per half ounce.

Insufficiently paid letters, from one place in Canada to another, on which at least a partial prepayment has been made, are forwarded charged with double the deficient postage.

Letters' addressed to places in the United States must be prepaid one full rate (3 cents), otherwise they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Legal and Commercial Papers.—The postage on Legal and Commercial Papers for the United States, Great Britain and all Foreign Postal Union countries, where the letter rate does not exceed 5 cents per ½ oz., is 5 cents for the first 10 ounces or less, and 1 cent for each additional 2 ounces. For countries where the 10 cent per ½ oz. letter rate rules, the charge is 5 cents for the first 4 ounces, and 2 cents for each additional 2 ounces. These papers, when posted for delivery in Canada, must be prepaid at Letter or Parcel Post rates; but Deeds and Insurance Policies are permitted to be sent at the Book Post rate of 1 cent per 2 ounces.

SECOND CLASS MATTER.

Canadian Newspapers, Etc.—Newspapers and Periodicals, printed and published in Canada, when issued not less frequently than once a month, and posted from the office of publication, or News Agency, to actual Subscribers or News Agents in Canada, the United States, and Newfoundland, resident elsewhere than at the place of publication, are FREE; but copies addressed to Great Britain, and all specimen copies, as well as all publications issued less

Local Newspapers and Periodicals, not exceeding one ounce in weight, are eligible for City delivery by Letter Carriers on the prepayment by stamp of 1 cent each; when exceeding 1 oz, and less than 4 oz, prepayment by stamp of 1 cent will be necessary.

THIRD CLASS MATTER.

Transient Newspapers, Etc.—On all Transient Newspapers and Periodicals, addressed to places in Canada, Newfoundland and United States, the postage rate is 1 cent per 4 ounces in weight, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and Periodicals, published not less frequently than once a month, and weighing less than one ounce may be posted singly, if prepaid by postage stamp one half cent each. Newspapers for the United Kingdom must be prepaid 1c. for each 2 oz.

Newspapers and Periodicals published in the United Kingdom, and brought by mail to Canadian Booksellers or News Agents, may be re-mailed by such Booksellers or News Agents, FREE of Postage.

Miscellaneous and Book Packets.—The rate of postage upon all Newspapers and Periodicals posted for destinations in Canada or Newfoundland, not otherwise provided for, and on Books, Pamphlets, Occasional Publications, Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Handbills, and other matter wholly in print, is 1 cent per 4 ounces or fraction thereof, to be prepaid by postage stamp or stamped postband or wrapper; but when posted for destinations in the United States, Great Britain and all European countries, the rate is 1 cent per 2 ounces.

Upon all Book and Newspaper Manuscript, Printers' Proof Sheets, whether corrected or not, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Lithographs, Photographs, when not on glass or in cases containing glass, Sheet Music, whether printed or written,—and all on other miscellaneous matter transmissible by post not otherwise provided for—the rate of postage when addressed to places in Canada, the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain and any European country, is 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof, to be paid by postage stamp or stamped postband or wrapper. School and College Examination Papers, distinctly marked as such, Assessment Rolls, Militia, Statute Labour and Municipal Returns, are permitted to pass in Canada at the rate of 1 cent per 2 ounces.

A book packet may contain a simple invoice of the contents.

No package must exceed 2 ft. in length by 1 ft. in width or depth. Limit of weight for Canada, Newfoundland, Great Britain or United States is 5 lbs; for other Postal Union Countries 4 lbs.

Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots and Scions or Grafts can only be sent to the United States as Fifth Class matter; when posted for delivery in Canada, the postage is 1 cent per 4 oz., and the limit of weight 5 lbs.

Patterns and Samples.—Patterns and samples of merchandise not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per 4 ounces weight, properly labelled, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, not being actually trade patterns or samples, are not admissible as such.

Patterns and Samples for the United States, 1 cent per 2 oz., the initial prepayment being 2 cents. Limit of weight, 8 oz.; size, 2 feet in length, by 1 foot in width and depth.

Packets of Patterns or Smaples, addressed to any place in Canada, can be registered on affixing thereto registration stamps of the value of 5 cents, in addition to postage stamps representing ordinary postage rate, provided such packets be presented for registration.

The limit of weight to Great Britain, France, Germany, and all other countries in Europe, is eight ounces - postage, 2 cents for the first 4 oz., and 1

cent for every additional 2 oz.

No article liable to Customs duty can be sent as a sample or pattern to a Postal Union country.

FOURTH CLASS MATTER,

Parcels.—Closed parcels may be sent to places in Canada, the United Kingdom, and Newfoundland. They should be plainly addressed and there must be no correspondence enclosed.

Parcels for Canada must be prepaid 6 cents per 4 oz. They must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in wdtih or depth, and the sender's name should be written on the lower left hand corner. They

may be registered for a fee of 5 cents.

Parcels for the United Kingdom and Newfoundland, must be prepaid 25 cents per lb. or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 5 lbs, in weight nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. A Customs Declaration of the contents and value of each parcel must be filled up at the Post Office by the sender. Parcels for the United Kingdom are forwarded by Canadian Contract Steamers only; and parcels for Newfoundland are sent to Halifax for dispatch by steamer.

FIFTH CLASS MATTER.

Comprises such articles of general merchandise as are not entitled to any lower rate of postage. Postage 1 cent per oz. or fraction of an ounce. Limit of weight, 4 lbs.; size, two feet in length by one foot in width or depth. Matter claiming to be fifth class must be open to inspection, and there must be no correspondence enclosed. Packages of Fifth Class Matter may be sent to the United States for the same prepayment as is required within the Dominion, but the contents will be liable to Custom inspection and collection of duty in the United States. Sealed tins containing fish, lobsters, vegetables, meats, &c., if put up in a solid manner and labelled in such a way as to fully indicate the nature of their contents may be sent as Fifth Class matter within the Dominion, but no sealed matter can be forwarded to the United States under this head. Liquids, oils, and fatty substances may be sent to places in Canada and the United States as Fifth Class, if put up in accordance with the ruling referring to such articles in the Canada Postal Guide for 1889, page xv.

Registration.

All classes of matter addressed to places in Canada, the United States, Newfoundland, Great Britain, or any Postal Union country, may be registered for a fee of 5 cents for each article in addition to the postage; and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the Union.

Every article intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor; on no account must it be dropped into a letter

box. The registration fee should be paid by registration stamp.

Value in Teas.

THE RESIDENCE THE SAINT STREET, SAINT JOHN, N. B.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any Postal Union country may entitle himself to a certificate as to the disposal of said article by the Postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents.

Registered articles cannot be forwarded unless the postage and registration fee are paid in full.

Registration stamps eannot be accepted in prepayment of postage.

All letters for registration should be posted 30 minutes before the hour or

Registered Letter Stamps of the denomination of 5 cents may be obtained at the usual places.

Re-Directed Letters.

Re-directed Letters to places within the Dominion or United States will be forwarded without any additional charge if returned promptly to the office.

Letters sent to or received from a Country of the Postal Union, and afterwards re-directed to any place in Canada, or to a Country in the Postal Union, will be forwarded even if taken out of the office and re-addressed; but if readdressed to a place where there is a higher rate of postage, the difference of postage will be chargeable.

Post Office Savings Bank.

Any business in connection with depositing and withdrawing money from the Post Office Savings Bank can be transacted at this office, but arrangements have not as yet been made for the opening of new accounts.

Matter which Cannot be Forwarded Through the Post.

Any explosive substance, glass, liquid, or other matter likely to entail risk or injury to the ordinary contents of the mail, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, Ottawa.

Spectacles and eye-glasses, if securely put in cases not likely to allow the contents to escape if broken in course of conveyance, may be sent by Post within the Dominion on prepayment of parcel post rates.

Letters containing Gold or Silver Money, Jewels or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties, cannot be forwarded by Post to any of the Postal Union countries except the United States.

Important.

A letter once posted becomes the property of the person to whom it is addressed, and must be forwarded according to its direction. On no application, however urgent, can it be delivered back to the writer, or to any other person.

Sale of Postage Stamps.

Any person, other than a Postmaster, who engages in the sale of Postage Stamps or Stamped Envelopes without being duly licensed by the Postmaster General is liable, on conviction before a Justice of the Peace, to a penalty of \$40 for each offence.

Useful Hints.

Never send money or other articles of value through the Post Office except either by Money Order or Registered Letter.

Make complaints and inquiries in writing.

Envelopes closed and simply clipped at the ends cannot be forwarded by Book Post.

Letters addressed to mere initials, or fictitious names, will not be delivered, unless addressed in care of a resident, or to some box in the Post Office.

Mutilated Stamps.

Letters having mutilated stamps, or stamps so soiled and defaced as to make it impossible for the sorting clerks to decide whether they have been used before or not, will be sent to the Postmaster General for his adjudication.

Post Bands and Stamped Envelopes.

One cent post bands for newspaper or book packet wrappers, and one and three cent stamped envelopes are issued by the Department, and may be had at the stamp vendors at a trifle above their face value.

Weights and Measures Inspection.

The Weights and Measures Act provides that two gallons shall be a peck, and eight gallons a bushel, and that after January 1st, 1886, in contracts for the sale and delivery of any of the under-mentioned articles, the bushel shall be determined by weight, unless conveniences for weighing are not available, or unless a bushel by measure is specially agreed on in writing, the weight equivalent to a bushel being as follows: Wheat, 60 pounds; Indian corn, 56 pounds; rye, 56 pounds; peas, beans, and clover seed, 60 pounds; barley, timothy seed and buckwheat, 48 pounds; malt, 36 pounds; oats, 34 pounds; flaxseed, 50 pounds; hempseed, 44 pounds; blue grass seed, 14 pounds; castor beans, 40 pounds; potatoes, turnips, carrots, parsnips, beets, and onions, 60 pounds; bituminous coal, 70 pounds. Power is also given to the Governor-in-Council to specify the weight of other articles equivalent to a bushel. Violations of the foregoing provisions subject the offender to a penalty not exceeding \$25 for the first offence and not exceeding \$50 for each subsequent offence.

BURNHAM'S FURNITURE WAREROOMS FOR

HACKNEY CARRIAGES - Rates of Fare.

The prices or rates of fare to be taken and recovered by and paid to the owner, driver, or other person having charge of any licensed Hackney Carriage shall be as follows, that is to say: for conveying one passenger from any public stand to any other part of the City, or from any one part of the City to any other part thereof, the sum of thirty cents, and for every additional passenger of the same household each twenty cents; other passengers not of the same household, each thirty cents. When detained at any place by any passenger, there shall be an additional fare of fifty cents every half hour detention. When agreement for hire is made by the hour, the fare shall be the sum of one dollar for each hour, and in that proportion for each division by the quarter of the hour. In case any driver shall be required to cross the ferry of the harbour to or from Carleton, he shall in addition to the above fare receive twenty cents additional rate for one passenger, or more than one of the same household; but if not of the same household, then twenty cents such additional fare for each passenger; and also in addition to the fare, he shall receive the ferriage charges for himself, his carriages and horses, both going and returning. Every owner, driver or person having charge of any Hackney Carriage shall, when requested so to do, carry with each passenger one trunk and also an additional valise, carpet-bag, portmanteau, bundle, basket, or other article used in travelling, without charge or compensation therefor; and for every additional trunk or other article more than hereinbefore provided, he shall be entitled to demand and receive the sum of five cents.

Cartage Districts.

First District—To comprise all that part of the City lying between and within the North side of Union Street, the East side of Prince William Street, and the South side of Duke Street.

Second District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the First District, that lies between and within the East side of Mill Street, at the City line, North side of Pond Street, East side of Peel Street, North side of Carleton Street, East side of Coburg and Charlotte Streets, and South side of Queen Street.

Third District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Second District that lies between the City line on the North, the East side of Dorchester Street, North side of Hazen street, East Side of Garden Street, Northerly side of Paddock Street, Easterly side of Waterloo Street, East side of Sydney Street, and South side of St. James Street.

Fourth District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Third District that lies between and within the City line on the North, to the Westward of a line at right angles to the said City line, and which strikes the intersection of the Easterly line of Coburg with the Northerly line of Hazen Street, the Easterly side of Coburg Street, Northerly line of Cliff Street, Westerly side of Waterloo street, Northerly side of Richmond Street, Easterly side of Brussels Street, Easterly side of Carmarthen Street, and Southerly side of Broad Street.



Time Ball on Northern Tower of Custom House.

The Ball will be hoisted half its elevation each day (Sunday excepted) at fifteen minutes before one o'clock. At one minute before one o'clock it will be hoisted its full height; and at one o'clock, mean time, the Ball will be dropped. A Chronometer keeping correct Greenwich time should then show 5h 24m 15s, and the difference between this and the time shown by a Chronometer, is its true error on Greenwich time at the moment. As the above hour of one o'clock when the Ball drops, represents 5h 24m 15s at Greenwich, the error of a Chronometer may be ascertained, no matter where the ship is lying. Masters of vessels arriving at Saint John should compare their Chronometers by the time Ball, as it will enable them to get the sea rate, which frequently varies from harbour rates. Latitude 45° 16′ 42″ North. Longitude in time 4h 24m 15s West of Greenwich.

P. S. Any shipmasters entering this Port, keeping a Meteorological Register, who may be desirous of having the accuracy of their Barometers verified, can do so by comparison with the standard at the Observatory at the Custom House.

It is unlawful to hunt, take, kill, wound, chase, or otherwise destroy any moose, deer or red deer, during three years after April 6th, 1888, under a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars and not less than one hundred For the setting of any net for the purpose of atol(21, qs.) its lettle. The fact of any person having in his possession the careass of any animal mentioned in the preceding section, or the green, or fresh-pelt, or hide thereof within the time specified (viz., May first and September first), shall be prima facie evidence of his having hunted, killed, taken, or trapped the same contrary to law; and the fact of any person having been found limiting within the time specified, having in his possession any trap or traps, shall be prima facie evidence of his hunting contrary to law, and in either case such person shall be liable to the penalties mentioned in the preceding section. (41 Vic., Cap. 45; 42 Vic., Cap. 20; 48 Vic., Cap. 61; 51 Vic., Cap. 12).

The export of deer, wild turkeys, quail, partridge, prairie fowl, and woodcock, in the carcass or parts thereof, is hereby declared unlawful and prohibited, and any person exporting, or attempting to export, any such article shall, for each such offence, incur a penalty of one hundred dollars, and the article so attempted to be exported shall be forfeited, and may, on reasonable cause of suspicion of intention to export the same, be seized by any officer of the Customs, and, if such intention is proved, shall be dealt with as for breach of the Custom's Laws. For the setting of any net for the purpose of catching any wild duck or any game bird, the offender shall be liable to a penalty of not less than ten, nor more than twenty dollars.

For the catching of any wild fowl by artificial light, the offender shall be liable to a penalty of not less than ten dollars, nor more than twenty dollars. enty dellars, nor less than five (02 l.qaD (201424)

To shoot, kill, or otherwise destroy any sea gull at any time within the parish of Grand Manan, a person will be liable to a penalty of four dollars. gnentioned in the preceding section, or the green or fresh-pa(16 cdsdc.aiVr84)

THE KILLING OF ROBINS, SPARROWS, SWALLOWS,

and other small birds and birds of song which frequent the fields and gardens, and the selling and offering for sale and having in possession such birds when killed, shall hereafter be unlawful; penalty one dollar. The trapping, snaring, or otherwise taking alive or selling, or offering or exposing for sale alive of any of the said birds, and the destroying of the nest or eggs of such birds, shall be unlawful, and any such traps or snares may be destroyed, and a penalty be exacted of one dollar, in addition to ten cents for each bird. (41 Vic., Cap. 45.)

9 HOW FINES AND PENALTIES SHALL BE ENFORCED, 8

Fines and penalties shall be paid as follows: One-half to the informer and the other half to the Commissioner or Warden or Deputy Warden prosecuting, but if the prosecutor be any person other than a Commissioner, Warden or Deputy Warden, then such other or second half shall be paid to the Chief Game Commissioner.

The Warden or his Deputy, or either of them, are authorized to seize all carcasses, or any part thereof, all hides, pelts or traps found in the possession of any person contrary to law, and shall forthwith proceed before a Justice of the Peace, who will deal with the case as prescribed in section 12, Act 41 Vic., Chap. 45.

If the owner of the property seized be not known, the Warden or his Deputy shall proceed, as directed in section 13 of the same Act, before a Justice of the Peace.

A search warrant can be obtained on application, under oath, of any Stipendiary Magistrate, Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices, whenever any person has reason to suspect, and does suspect, that moose, caribou or deer hides, or any portion of the carcass of a moose, caribon or deer during the close season, are concealed on the premises of any person, and if found, the same may be seized and dealt with as directed in section 12

Any nets set or placed for the purpose of taking or catching any wild duck or other game bird may be seized by any person, and the same shall be destroyed under the conditions of section 18.

GAME LICENSES.

No person not having his domicile in the Province of New Brunswick shall be entitled to hunt, take, kill, wound or destroy any moose, caribou, deer,

mink, otter, fisher, sable, beaver, or other animal referred to herein, or to hunt, take, kill, wound or destroy any bird referred to herein, without first having obtained a license, and shall be subject to the enactments of the Game Laws. The fee to be paid therefor will be twenty dollars, and the license shall be in force for one year from the first day of September in each year.

Every such person shall, on request of any person whomsoever within the Province, at all times, and as often as requested, produce and show to the person making the request, such license; and if he fail or refuse to do so, he shall forfeit any such license as he may possess, and shall, upon proof of such request and failure, be deemed to have violated the provisions of the preceding section.

The penalty for a non-resident hunting without a license will not be less than twenty dollars nor more than fifty dollars in addition to license fee and cost of prosecution.

Officers in Her Majesty's service, officers in the army and navy shall be entitled to the privileges of the Game Laws of the Province on the payment of an annual fee of five dollars, but shall be liable to last then tioned penalty for hunting without a license of bridge and private to last them.

Synopsis of the Fishery Laws of the Dominion of Canada.

Net fishing of any kind is prohibited in public waters, except under leases or licenses from the Department of Fisheries.

The size of nets is regulated so as to prevent the killing of young fish.

Nets cannot be set or seines used so as to bar channels of bays.

The netting of trout is prohibited. A general weekly close-time is provided in addition to special close-seasons. Salmon nets must be raised from 6 p. m. on Saturday to 6 a. m. on Monday, and angling for salmon is prohibited from 9 p. m. on Saturday to 6 a. m. on Monday.
