[29th March, 1845.]
WHEREAS an Assnciation hath been formed in Preamble. the City of Montreal, in this Province, by divers persons engaged as Mechanics and otherwise, resident in that City and the neighbourhood thereof, under the name of The Meckanics' Inslitute of Montreal, for the purpose of forming a Library and Reading Room, and of organizing a system of instruction by means of Lectures and Classes, for the use and benefit of those who are or may hereatter become members of the said Association; And whereas the persons hereinafter named Office-bearers of the said Association, acting in behalf of the members thereof, have by their Petition to the Legislature, represented that the said Association was criginally founded in the year eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, with the object of aifording instruction to its members in the principles of the Arts, and in the various branches of Science and useful knowledge, necessary or advantageous to the said Associates in their pursuits in life; And the Petitioners have further represented, that the benefits derivable from the said Association,

## AMENDED ACT OF INCOR2ORA'TION. 23 Vic. Cap. $13 \%$.

An Act to alter and amend the Act incorporating the Mechanics' Institute of Montreal.
[March, 1860.]

WHEREAS the Mechanics' Institute of Montreal, Preamble. a body corporate and politic, constituted as such under and by virtue of the Act of the Legislature of this Province, passed in the Eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled "An Act to Incorporate ${ }^{8}$ Vict. c. 93 the Mechanics' Institute of Montreal," have by their petition in that behalf prayed for certain amendments in the Act relating to the said Corporation, and it is desirable to grant the prayer of the said Petition : Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:-
I. It shall and may be lawful for the said Corpor-Power to ation to have, take, receive, purchase, acquire, property and hold, possess and enjoy to them and their successors, to take by to and for the uses and purposes of the said Corporation, auy messuages, lands, tenements, and hereditaments of what nature, kind or quaity soever, situate and being within this Province, not exceeding in value the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars, and also to take, receive, purchase, acquire, have,
hold and possess (provided the same do not exceed in value a like sum), to and for the same uses and purposes, any goods, chattels, gifts, benefactions or bequests whatever : Provided always that no Will shall be valid and sufficient to pass any real or personal estate to the said Corporation, unless such Wili shall have been executed by the Testator six Calen= dar months prior to his decease.

Annual Subscrabing Memlers.
I. The object of the Institute is to afford to its Members instruction in the principles of the Arts, and in the various branches of Science and useful knowledge, necessary or advantageous to them in their pursuits in life, by means of a Library, a Reading Room, Lectures and Classes.

## Classification of Membership.

II. Ordinary Members are those who are now Life Members of the Institute, or who shall hereafter become Life Members, either by a cash payment of Twenty Dollars, or by giving Books or other articles available for the purposes of the Iustitute, of the value of Thirty Dollars.
III. Annual Subscribing Members shall be these who shall pay and contribute to the funds of the Institute the Aunual Subscription hereinafter prescribed.
Jumior Mem- IV. Apprentices and youths under eighteen bers. years of age, elected anrual Subscribing Members, shall be styled Junior Members, and shall not be entilled to vote at any meeting, nor be eligible to office.

The Officers and Memhers to compose the General Committee shall be elected by Officers and Each of the Members of Ballot in manner following:members present, qualified to vote, shall write upon a slip of paper the name of the person he may desire to vote for as President, which slip of paper he shall deliver to the President, who shall, in his presence, deposit the same in the bullot box, and the President, having ascertained that all the members present wishing to vote have done so, shall declare the Ballot to be closed; and the Scrutineers shall forthwith proceed to ascertain the number of votes given for each person, and also the total number of votes recorded, and to report the same in writing to the President, who shall announce the same to the meeting; and if any person has received an absolute majority of ail the votes given, he shall be held and declared to be duly elected, but if no person has received an absolute majozity of the votes given, a further ballot or ballots shall take place until an
election is made. And a President having been elected, the meeting shall proceed in like manner to the election of each of the other Officers, and then to that of six Members to compose, with the soid officers, the General Committee.

Funds. surer's hands shall amount to, or exceed the sum of Twenty-five Pounds currency, he shall forthwith deposit the same in the name of the Institute with some Danking Institution to be designated by the General Committee, and such Institution shall be instructed by it not to pay any sum of money on account of the Institute, unless upon cheques signed by the President, the Recording Secretary and Treasurer.
XXV. The Librarian shall see that the Duties of Libooks, Periodicals, and like articles in the Reading Room and Library are kept in good order, and properly arranged, and shall make and keep catalogues of the books in the Library in such form as may be ordered.
XXVI. XXXIV. Ordinary Meetings of the General Committee shall be held on the second and fourth Mondays in each month, which meetings may adjourn unto another day. Extraordinary Meetings of the Committee may be called by tae President at any time.
Quorrmat XXXV. At all Ordinary General Meetings, Gieneral Meetings. ten Members, and at Extraordinary General Mcetings, fifteen Members shall be a quorum competent for the transaction of any business, except the Election of Corresponding and Honorary Members, the quorum requisite for the election of which is twelve and sixteen members respectively.
Quorum at XXXVI. At all meetings of the General Conlumittee Meetings. Committee five members shall be a quorum, competent for the transaction of business.
Hour of Meeting.
XXXVII. At all meetings either of the Institute or of the General Committee the Chair shall be taken at half-past seven o'clock, P. M.
Questions, XXXVIII. All questions, matters, and how to be things, (except the adoption of By-Laws,)
deecided. which shall be proposed, discussed, or considered at any General or Committee Meeting shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present. And all voting shall be by show of hands, but if at any General Meeting, it appears doubtful to any three members apon which side the majority is, tel-

8. All motions shall be given in writing, with the names of the movers and seconders, to the Recording Secretary, and shall be read by the President,
9. No discussion shall be allowed upon any motion until it shall have been seconded, and been read by the President.
10. No Member shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same question, nor longer than ten minutes on each occasion inless by leave of the President.
11. When there is a motion before the Meeting undetermined, no other motion shall be
received, unless it be a motion to adjourn, to postpone the consideration of the subject, or to amend the original motion.
12. 1 motion to adjourn, which shall always be in order, shall be decided without debate.
13. When there is more than one motion in amendment proposed, each of them shall be taken to be proposed in amendment of the last preceding one, and the question shall be taken on each, beginning with the one made last.
14. No discussion of a political or religiou nature shall be allowed.
15. No motion for the reconsideration of a question decided shall be entertained, unless notice of such motion shall have been given at the meeting previous to which it is made, except by permission of the President and of the mover or seconder of the original motion.
16. No member of the General Committee shall retire from any meeting thereof, without obtaining the permission of the President.
