

ANNUAL REPORT.

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

The Committee of Management at the close of their term of office, beg to report :---

That the permanent fund at the credit of the Society has this year reached the sum of £1500, affording a gratifying guarantee for the continuance of the useful labors of the Society, and increasing the means at the disposal of its officers for relieving their distressed countrymen.

On the Anniversary, divine service was held in the Cathedral, for the second time in the Evening, when a numerous congregation attended. The Lord Bishop of the Diocese preached on the occasion, prayers having been offered by the Rev. G. V. Housman, and the lessons read by the Rev. A. W. Mountain. The voluntary choir conducted by Henry Carter, Esq., executed the musical portion of the service (though at a great disadvantage, the organ being under repair,) in their usual superior manner. The charitable fund was augmented by the amount of \$86.05, collected after the Sermon.

The much desired visit of the Prince of Wales, afforded the Society an opportunity of renewing the expression of the attachment of its Members to Her Majesty's person and government: and the presence of our future sovereign was hailed by none with greater delight or more cordial affection, than by the countrymen of His Royal Highness. The occasion having led to the revival of the vexed question of the order of precedence which should be adopted on public occasions by the National Societies, steps were subsequent ly taken which we trust will very shortly lead to results satisfactory to all parties. The Sub-Committee of Charity have this year expended the sum of \$375,39, towards the relief of 170 applicants, and could have extended their good work towards the close of the scason, had the funds (only recently augmented by the receipt of a Bank dividend) enabled them to do so. By the increased amount hereafter to accrue in the shape of interest from the Permanent Fund, your Charitable Committee will for the future be in a better position to carry out their work and labor of love. The amount now in the hands of the treasurer and available for charitable purposes, after payment of the expenses of the year, (which, in consequence of the Royal visit above alluded to, have necessarily been much larger than usual) is \$265.71.

The roll of the Society has had added to it during the year, the names of four Ordinary Members, while three Ordinary Members have become Life Members. The Committee would desire here to impress upon all Ordinary Members now on the roll, or to be hereafter elected, the great advantage which would result not only to themselves, but to the Society, by their at once becoming $^{*}Life$ *Members*," the premium for which is now reduced to the lowest possible figure—£5.

The Committee regret to state that death has deprived the Society of two Life Members during the year, namely: Mr. Francis Noad, who died at Montreal, and Mr. W. W. Wheeler, who died at Quebec. Mr. W. Ginger, also of Quebec, recently deceased, was one of the Original Members of the Society.


