

During the second half of July by Mr. Holmested, Senior Registrar.

During the first half of August by Mr. Mc Andrew, Junior Registrar.

During the second half of August by Mr. Hodgins, the Master-in Ordinary.

Chamber motions returnable before a Judge in Chambers will be heard on Tuesdays immediately after court.

COURT.

A Judge will sit in court on Tuesday of each week at 10 a.m., to hear motions of a strictly urgent character.

The necessary papers relating to every application, are to be left at "The Registrar's Office, Osgoode Hall," before twelve o'clock on the Saturday previous to the day on which the motion is to be made.

In cases of urgency the Brief of Counsel is to be sent to the Judge accompanied by copies of the affidavits in support of the motion, and also by a Minute on a separate sheet of paper, signed by Counsel, of the order he may consider the applicant entitled to, and an envelope capable of receiving the papers, addressed as follows:—

During vacation the Library will be open from 10 a.m. to 1. p. m.

Hints on Practice. DIVISIONAL COURT.

In County Court Appeals all Papers and Material to be used on the Appeal must be deposited and left in the Registrar's office at the time of the Appeal. A Judge of the High Court has now power to extend the time for setting down a Country Court Appeal.

See 63 Vic., C. 17, Sec. 12-which reads:

"Section 57 of the County Courts Act, is amended by adding thereto the following words: 'Provided, however, that a Judge of the High Court may extend the time herein before limited for setting down the Appeal where it is shown that the appellant has been unable to procure the notes of the evidence given at the trial within the time so limited, or to have the pleadings, and other papers in the cause certified, and this proviso shall be construed retroactively."

By 7 Will. IV., c. 2, a Chancery Court was established for Upper Canada, of which the Governor of the Province was Chancellor, the judicial power being exercised by a Judge, known as the Vice-Chancellor. By 12 Vic., ch. 64, the appointment of a Chancellor and two Vice-Chancellors was authorized.

Hon. Sir John Alexander Boyd.—Born at Torento, on 23rd April, 1837; called to the Bar 16th November, 1863; appointed Chancellor 3rd May, 1881; still acting.

Hon. Oliver Mowat.—Born at Kingston, on 22nd July, 1820; called to the Bar 13th November, 1841; appointed to the Bench 14th November, 1864; resigned 26th October, 1872.

Hon. Samuel Henry Strong.—See under Chief Justices Supreme Court.

Hon. Samuel Hume Blake.—Born at Toronto, on 31st August, 1835; called to the Bar 6th February, 1860; appointed to the Bench 2nd December, 1872; resigned 15th May, 1881.

Hon. William Proudfoot.—Born in Perthshire, Scotland, on 9th November, 1823; called to the Bar 13th November, 1849; appointed to the Bench 30th May, 1874; resigned 8th May, 1890; living in Toronto.

Hon. Thomas Ferguson. — Born at Rockside, Ontario, on 31st October, 1838; called to the Bar 1st September, 1863; appointed to the Bench 24th May, 1881; still acting.

Hon. Thomas Robertson.—Born at Ancaster, Ontario, on 25th June, 1827; called to the Bar 2nd February, 1852; appointed to the Bench 11th Feb. ruary, 1887; still acting.
