USURY LAWS REPEAL BILL.
A bill was brought up from the House of Assembly by the Hon. Attorney General...

SCHOOL VISITORS' REPORTS.
Hon. Mr. MacDONALD presented to the House the school visitors' reports for the eastern and western sections of this island for the past year.

IMPROVEMENT OF HIGHWAYS.
Hon. Mr. HAYTHORNE, from the joint committee of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, appointed last session to inquire into and report upon the best method of improving our highways...

...Hon. Mr. BALDWIN: If the bill under consideration were rendered more explicit, it would recommend itself to all parties. It is considered that the duties of the Attorney General are very onerous, and perhaps they are; but from the fact that there is a great deal of anxiety about that office when a new party comes into power...

...Hon. Mr. DEWELL: It is true that I had some management of the stock that was sent to King's County last year, but I never heard that there was any dissatisfaction respecting the prices at which it sold.

...Hon. Mr. DEWELL: I do not pretend to say that full justice is done in the distribution of the land, but I do say that the form is more advantageous to gentlemen now in Charlotte-town than it can reasonably be expected to be to people in the other Counties.

Mr. Davies) would see that no good would come out of such an investigation. He would rather see the Tenant Union, as a body, express their regret at the stigma cast upon them by the false step taken by some of their members...

...Hon. Mr. DUNWELL: His honor from the first district of Queen's County, (Mr. Hartmore), very justly remarked that there is an impression in the country that the farm is kept for the benefit of a few individuals near Charlotte-town, and indeed, I do not see how they can think otherwise for those in the neighborhood of it have access to and privileges from the stock parcels of the farm, and it is not the country estate here. This should be taken into account when a distribution of the stock is made, so that justice may be done to all parts of the country.
