"THE CANADA BOOKSELLER."

Messrs. ADAM, STEVENSON & Co. beg to announce to the Book trade of the country, and to those book readers and professional men to whom the "CANADA BOOKSELLER" has been sent during the last two years, that they have discontinued the publication of that bibliographical serial in the form in which it has hitherto appeared.

Having, during the past year, severed their connection with the Retail Book business, by assuming a Wholesale trade only, their interest in continuing a gratuitous publication for the information of readers generally, to a great extent, has ceased; while, as a Trade Journal and record of the doings of authors and publishers abroad and at home, their periodic issues of wholesale catalogues and circulars in the various departments of literature, supplied that information most useful and advantageous to the trade.

This consideration, however, would not alone have induced them to discontinue the publication had they not contemplated to issue a native magazine, such as is now presented to the reading public; and it was thought that the medium of a *monthly* literary publication, such as the present, would be more advantageous in announcing the current issues of the press, and in giving publicity to the advertisements of those Publishing Houses who have been the patrons of the "CANADA BOOKSELLER," and hence they have decided to avail themselves of these pages, and to continue to give such jottings of the trade's doings, and such a record of the publications of the day as their leisure will permit them to prepare, as well as to make public the announcements of those publishers who may favour them with advertisements.

LITERARY GOSSIP.

Mr. HEPWORTH DIXON, returning from a visit to Switzerland, announces a book on "The Switzers."—The title of the new poem by Mr. Morris, the author of the "Earthly Paradise," is "Love is Enough."—Messrs. Cassell announce a little work designed to illustrate, in an anecdotal form, the Parliamentary History of England, and of distinguished statesmen.—Dr. J. H. Newman is publishing his critical and historical Essays, issued at various times from 1829 to 1846.—Messrs. Routledge are about to start a penny weekly magazine for boys.—A new work on Hallucination, by Robert Dale Owen, entitled "The Debatable Land between this World and the Next," is announced.—The subject of a fish diet, as conducive to intellectuality, is being

discussed among medical men, and two works are announced on the same.—A new poem, "The Drama of Kings," by Robert Buchanan, is announced.—Mrs. Oliphant is writing a Life of the Count de Montalembert.—Mr. John Forster's "Life of Charles Dickens" will appear, simultaneously, in England and America, early in January.—A new work, "Lord Bantam," by the author of "Gin's Baby," is announced.—A further prophetic work, by Dr. John Cumming, entitled, "The Cities of the Nations Fall," has appeared.—A book on Polygamy, bearing the title of "Saint Abe and his Seven Wives," will be shortly issued. A work on Human Longevity, dedicated to Lord St. Leonard, is just published, bearing the title of "The Secret of a Long Life."—A new novel, by the author of "Adam Beale," is being published in a serial form, and bears the title of "Middlemarch; a Study of Provincial Life."—"Through the Looking-glass, and What Alice Saw There," is the title of a new book, by the author of "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland."—"Three to One," the new story of Dr. Dasant, author of "Annals of an Eventful Life," is appearing in Appleton's Journal.—Mr. Gladstone is announced to contribute a series of papers to "Scribner's Monthly."—Mrs. Annie Edwards' new novel, "Ought We to Visit Her," is now published in book form.—Justin McCarthy's recent story, "Lady Judith; a Tale of Two Continents," is now completed, and issued separately.

Messrs. Hunter, Rose and Co., of Toronto, have ready, and publish by arrangement with the author, a Christmas Story, by Wilkie Collins, entitled, "Miss or Mrs." Price 40c.

The "Canadian Almanac," for 1872, published by Messrs. Copp, Clark and Co., and "The Year Book," issued by Hunter, Rose & Co., are now ready. Price 12½ cents each.

The various issues of Office and Pocket Diaries for 1872, manufactured by Messrs. Brown Bros., Toronto, are now in the hands of the trade.

The Canadian News and Publishing Company, Toronto, have just issued a reprint of Mrs. Stow's new novel, "My Wife and I," price, in paper, 50c., or in cloth extra, \$1.00. They have also ready "Josh Billings," and "Nast's Illustrated Almanacks" for the year just opened. Prices 15c. and 25c. respectively.

The same House announce, for immediate publication, reprints of "Jean Ingelow's Poems," price in paper, \$1, in cloth, \$1 25; and "Little Breechies, and other Poems," by Colonel John Hay, paper, 25c.; "East and West," Poems by Bret. Harte, paper, 25c.; "Josh. Billings's Papers," illustrated by Nast. Paper, 20c.

Mr. Lovell, of Montreal, is about to issue, from his International Printing and Publishing Press, at Rousse's Point—an establishment, by the way, which the anomalies of the Canadian Copyright Act have driven its worthy and patriotic proprietor to erect, to enable him to compete with American publishers for the supply of the native market—a choice edition, in one volume, of Macaulay's "Lays of Ancient Rome," and "Aytoun's Lays of the Scottish Cavaliers." The volume will be produced in the style of the adorned editions of the

Poets, in 12mo., issued by Messrs. Routledge, Nimmo, and other English publishers. Price, cloth plain, \$1; cloth extra, gilt edges, \$1 25.

Messrs. Adam, Stevenson and Co. have issued for the holidays a cheap though elegant edition of "The Changed Cross," and other fugitive hymns, a volume which has met with great favour, and of which English and American editions have been published. The work is issued in three styles—in paper at 40c., cloth limp, 60c. and cloth extra, 75c. They have also a sixth edition of Mr. Bickersteth's much admired poem, "Yesterday, To-day, and For Ever," in 12mo. cloth, price \$1 25; and an edition, manufactured for them, of the Christian Evidence Society's Lectures, entitled, "Modern Scepticism," a volume specially designed to meet some of the current forms of unbelief among the educated classes.

The same publishers have just issued No. 1, for January, of "The Pulpit Harvest," a series of Sermons to be issued monthly, from published and unpublished sources, by the foremost British, American, and Canadian preachers of various denominations. The 1st part, comprising 43 pages, 12mo., contains three Discourses on the Defence and Confirmation of the Faith. Discourse I. On "Christianity and Free Thought." Discourse II. "Christianity and Scepticism." Discourse III. "Christianity and Faith." By the Bishop of Peterborough. The subscription per annum is \$1 50, or 15c. each.
