CHUSAN.

Teheu-san, or Chusan, or Chow-san, which last is said to be nearest the Chinese pronunciation of the name, derives its name in that language from its resemblance to a boat.

The appearance of the island presents a series of undulating hills, the highest being about 1,100 feet, intersected with broad valleys in the highest state of cultivation.

Geology.—Chusan is a submarine convulsion. No rotten strata are to be found as at Hong Kong.

Health.—Chusan is the Montpelier of China. Woolen clothes are worn there for nine months of the year. Ice is to be found in quantities, and lasts until the month of September.
