ETHEL SEATH, STAR, Montreal



Miss Ethel Seath, the youngest black-and-white artist in Canada, has been engaged in newspaper illustration for some years. She began to study drawing under Miss Stone. Her first attempts at original work were restricted to conventional designs for wall-paper, oil-cloth, rings, etc., with Mrs. Simister. Later she studied drawing under Mr. Dyonnet, and lithographing under Mr. Harris, at the Council of Arts and Manufactures, Montreal.

Miss Seath joined the staff of the Montreal *Witness* in her seventeenth year. Mr. A. G. Racey was then at the head of the Art Department, and to the young inexperienced girl his kind encouragement and guidance were extremely valuable.

In October, 1901, Miss Seath joined the art staff of the Montreal *Star*, where she found herself in fortunate association with Mr. Julien, Mr. Racey, and Mr. Mathews. Her work rapidly improved, and her original illustrations are now a regular feature of the *Weekly Star*.

Miss Seath is a Canadian by birth, but of Scotch descent. She was born in Montreal, and has seen little of the world as yet, outside her native city. With larger opportunities for study and an acquaintance with the masters of art, much may be expected of her.

**A. S. BRODREUR, LA PRESSE, Montreal**



Albert Samuel Brodleur was born in Montreal in 1862, entered the employ of Burland & Co. as a lithographic artist when sixteen years of age. After six years with the firm, he accepted a position with the George Bishop Engraving Co., where he remained nine years. In 1893 he joined the staff of *La Presse*. Mr. Brodleur was a student of the Government Art School and it was there he received the thorough instruction which fitted him so well for his future career. His teachers, while undergoing his training in art, were Mr. Edmund Dyson (his class teacher) and Professor Brymner, whose counsel and advice were ever at his service. Today Mr. Brodleur is the artist-in-chief of the most widely circulated paper in Canada.

**ALONZO RYAN, LE CANADA, Montreal**



Alonzo Ryan, born at Ottawa, 1874, moved to Montreal in 1889, and in 1892 his first cartoon appeared in a Montreal paper. In the course of the eleven years which have since elapsed the career of Mr. Ryan has been an eventful one. At various times he has been employed by almost every paper of importance in Montreal—the *Witness*, *Herald*, *Le Canard*, *La Patrie*, *Les Debats*, *Le Journal*, *The Sunday Sun* and *Le Canada*, besides many others. While in the United States Mr. Ryan also contributed to leading papers, and many of his most famous cartoons have been copied far and wide in the newspaper press, and frequently reproduced in leading American, English and French reviews and periodicals.


