**AMHERST, N.S.,**

From the 27th of June to the 4th of July, 1878.

---

The Fifth Session of the Nova Scotia Annual Conference of the Methodist Church of Canada, began at Amherst, on Thursday, June 27th., 1878.

The Rev. Elias Bfettle, President of the Conference, took the chair at 9 o'clock, a.m.

After singing and the reading of the Scriptures, prayer was offered by the Rev. J. F. Bent and Rev. T. Angwin.

The Conference proceeded to elect by ballot its chief officers, when the Rev. James Taylor was elected President, and Rev. Stephen F. Huestis, Secretary.

The Rev. Jabez A. Rogers was elected Journal Secretary.

The Revs. Cranswick Jost, Arthur Dwight Morton, and Eben E. England were appointed Assistant Secretaries; the Rev. Jesse B. Giles, Assistant Journal Secretary; the Revs. John Cassidy and J. M. Pike, Letter Writers, and the Revs. D. W. Johnson, Conference Reporter to the *Wesleyan* and Thomas Rogers to the *Guardian*.

**HENRY POPE, SEN.**

Rev. Henry Pope, Senr., was born at Padston, Cornwall, England, May 25th, 1789, and died at Halifax, N. S., July 6th, 1877. Mr. Pope was the child of pious parents, who dedicated him in early life to the Saviour—his mother dying when he was but three years of age, passed to the skies breathing an earnest prayer to God for the conversion of her four children. John Wesley, in one of his visits to Cornwall, meeting him in his mother's arms, invoked the blessing of heaven to rest upon the child—a circumstance, the mention of which always suggested to Mr. Pope's mind the most pleasing thoughts. His conversion to God occurred when he reached the age of nineteen; the first link in the chain that led him to the Saviour was the purchase from a hawk, of a copy of Baxter's Saint's Rest. A year subsequent to this event finds him the leader of a class, and laboring diligently for the moral and spiritual improvement of his neighbors and friends. He was accepted by the English Conference in the year 1814, as a candidate for the ministry, and appointed to the Kingsbridge Circuit, and the year after was designated as a Missionary to Canada, and reached Quebec to enter upon his work on the 20th October, 1816. Mr. Pope's experience in the Western Provinces, covering a period of ten years, is intimately associated with the social and political, moral and religious history of those portions of the Dominion. On circuits where he travelled 4000 miles a year, mostly on horseback, compelled to ford streams and rivers often amid circumstances of great danger, inconvenienced no little by drawbacks inseparably associated with a new country, and labouring without the appliances and helps which are distinguishing features of the present day, his life shines out with peculiar lustre. The good Lord favoured his servant during the decade of years that he laboured in old Canada, with gracious and extensive revivals of religion. From Montreal in 1826, Mr. Pope proceeded to Charlottetown, P. E. Island. On that Circuit, at Maccan, Liverpool, Lunenburg, Newport, Horton, Yarmouth, Windsor, and other spheres of Christian toil in Nova Scotia, he spent 29 years in preaching Christ and promoting God's glory in the salvation of precious souls. cal powers, with his mind improved by study and the experience of years, and his spiritual life quickened by intercourse with the divine Lord, this period of his life was passed as he sowed the good seed of the kingdom, and witnessed on every hand the triumphs of Jehovah's cause. Souls by scores and hundred's were given him by the Lord, and several who subsequently entered the ranks of the Christian ministry, trace their conversion to God to his earnest and impressive appeals. In 1855 Mr. Pope became a supernumerary, and through most of the 22 years that elapsed between that period and the time of his death, he held the position of Protestant Chaplain at the Provincial Penitentiary. He was for several years the leader of a class which flourished in his charge, and by all the members thereof he was highly esteemed. His last sickness was short, but the messenger of death found God's servant waiting. The day before he became paralyzed, conversing with his wife he said, "I have been pleading with God to be entirely sanctified, and God has answered my prayer, and now I am ready to die." Though unable to converse with the loved ones who stood at his bedside, he communicated to them in no uncertain manner his trust in Jesus, and his glowing prospects beyond earth in the paradise of God. Thus his happy soul passed to the better world. Henry Pope's character represents a man of sterling worth, one who was controlled not by fickle sentimentality, but by holy and divine principles. He was a man of God, one who served his generation wisely and well, one whose motives were pure, whose simple heartedness and Christian consistency were transparent to all. His religion was illustrated outside the pulpit by a blameless life, and a spirit that reflected Jesus, and in the pulpit the cardinal doctrines of revelation were themes on which he delighted to expatiate. Whilst he was loyal to the Church of his choice, his religious instincts and Christian principles enabled him to fraternize with all who love our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, in sincerity and truth. Full of honors, his work done, and nobly done, at the advanced age of 89 years he was gathered to his fathers. He rests from his labors and his works do follow him.

#### W. F. PENNY, B.D.

W. F. Penny, B.D., who died at Liverpool, N. S., March 28th, 1878. He was a native of Carbonear, Newfoundland. In early life the death of a brother made a deep impression on his mind.



From that time he sought and found an interest in Christ. He studied and graduated from our College in Sackville, N.B. His first appointment was St. James, N. B., then Parrsboro', N. S. He then went to Boston University where he took a full theological course. He returned to Nova Scotia and was sent last year to labour on the Milton mission. In about eight months his health failed, and in a few weeks he died in the calm assurance of trust in Christ, in the 30th year of his age and the 4th year of his ministry.

The following are the Constitution and Rules of the Parsonage Aid and Church Extension Fund of the Nova Scotia Conference, as adopted by the Conference.

#### NAME.

This Fund shall be called the Parsonage Aid and Church Extension Fund of the Nova Scotia Conference of the Methodist Church of Canada.

#### CONSTITUTION OF COMMITTEE

The Fund shall be controlled by a Committee of said Conference, composed of twelve members, one half Ministers the other half Laymen. The Committee to be appointed Annually by the Conference, and to meet semi-annually. 1st—At the time and place of the annual session of the Conference: 2nd—At the time and place of the Autumn Session of the Missionary Committee.

The Conference shall appoint a Secretary and two Treasurers, one of whom shall be a Layman, who, with the President of the Conference, shall be an Executive Committee, for the transaction of business between the Sessions of the General Committee.

#### THE FUND

shall consist of

1st—That proportion of the Jubilee Fund which may be

long to this Conference, the interest of which has heretofore been paid into the late Parsonage Aid Fund of the E. B. A. Conference.

2nd—The Subscriptions of our friends in the Conference which they may deem fit to donate for the purposes of this scheme.

3rd—That portion of the Funds of the late Home Missionary Society of the E. B. A. Conference which has fallen to the share of the Nova Scotia Conference on the final adjustment of the matter.

4th—The Subscriptions of such Trust Boards as may from time to time desire to aid this Connexional object.

5th—Any Legacies which may be given to this object.

6th—Donations on Annuity.

#### THE EXPENDITURE

shall be of two kinds :

1st—Loans.      2nd—Free Grants.

Loans shall be of two classes :

1st—To New Erections.      2nd—To Old Trusts.

*A*—In New Erections, a Trust Board may receive as a Loan a sum not to exceed one fourth the entire cost of land and buildings.

*B*—In Old Trusts where debt exists the Board may receive a loan not to exceed one-half the existing encumbrance.

The terms upon which Loans may be made shall be as follows :

*A*—Trustees shall provide three fourths and one half the amounts respectively for New Erections and Debt Extinction before Loans are made, so that the Committee's claims shall be the only lien upon the properties.

*B* The Loans shall be repaid in equal yearly instalments. One-tenth of the full amount of Loan each year, together with an additional sum equal to one per centum per annum upon the whole sum first loaned.

*C*—Trustee Boards to which Loans are made shall insure and keep insured during the whole time of repayment, a sum at least equal to the amount of their liability, the policies and renewal receipts to be lodged in the hands of the Secretary of this Fund.

*D*—The Committee shall have power to make grants to Trust Boards to which Loans have been given, but in no instance shall the grant exceed one fifth of the amount loaned, nor shall Trustees have any claim to any grant, it being whol-

ly discretionary with the Committee. In instances where Grants without Loans are requested, the Committee shall have power to make such Grants, but to an amount not exceeding \$200 in any one instance.

#### GENERAL RULES

1st—The Funds shall be available to assist in New Erections and in the extinction of existing debts, whether the property concerned be in churches, vestries, or parsonages.

2nd—Trust Boards of New Erections, intending to seek aid, shall lay plans, &c., before the Committee for their approval, and no Trust Board neglecting or failing to obtain such approval shall be eligible to receive assistance by Loan or Grant.

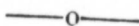
3rd—Full and minute statements of the Trust business, showing in detail assets and liabilities, and prospects justifying the petition must in all cases accompany applications for assistance.

4th—Applications must be filed with the Secretary of the Committee at least one month before the meeting of the Committee which will be called upon to examine and pass upon it

6th—The Committee shall, through its Secretary and Treasurers, present to the Conference an annual statement of the business of the Committee in detail; with auditors report.

7th—Two auditors shall be appointed annually by the Conference, who shall examine all the accounts of the Committee.

#### V.--SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT.

In examining the Sabbath School work of our Conference and submitting their annual Report, the Committee find reason for encouragement and for devout gratitude to the great Head of the church.

During the year three new Schools have been organized, and there is a gratifying increase in the average attendance both of teachers and scholars, as well as an improvement in the very important matter of meeting in class. Notwithstanding the general financial depression which has had the effect of reducing the total amount of moneys raised in the schools; still there is noted a decided increase in the contributions to "Missions."

With deep regret, however, they mark a decrease in the number of pupils attending the intermediate and adult classes, as well as of those who are studying our Catechisms. They would therefore, most affectionately and strongly urge upon our ministers and all who are engaged in Sabbath School work, the great importance of gathering not only the more youthful members of our families into that institution, but also those who are more advanced, and forming them into Testament and Bible Classes, in order that our young people of all ages may be thoroughly trained in the study of the divine word, and in the distinctive doctrines of our most holy religion. Thus they shall be fortified against the prevailing errors of the day, and brought into a position in which they may the more readily be won to Christ. As a valuable auxiliary in winning "the children for Jesus," the forming of young people's classes in connection with our Sabbath Schools, is strongly recommended, the members of which shall in due time graduate into the regular classes of the Circuit. Thus the Sabbath School becomes in reality the "Nursery of the Church."

The Committee would call attention to the disproportion that exists between the number of preaching appointments and the number of Sabbath Schools. They would urge upon the Superintendents of Circuits the importance of exercising the tenderest solicitude on behalf of the young people on all parts of their charges, and of organizing schools in *every* locality in which such a course is practicable. They would also recommend that the "Uniform Lessons" be more generally adopted, and that greater attention be paid to the holding of regular Teacher's Meetings for the study of those lessons. They would furthermore suggest that District Conventions be more frequently and generally held.

In conclusion, being deeply convinced of the importance of Sabbath School work, and believing that much still remains to be accomplished, they would most affectionately commend it to the kindest sympathy, most earnest prayer, and unabated zeal of our people; reminding them that no efforts are more acceptable unto God, or more readily crowned with the divine blessing than those which are put forth on behalf of the precious souls, concerning whom our adorable Redeemer hath said: "Of such is the kingdom of heaven!"

### MODE OF EXAMINATION.

Papers prepared by the Examiners upon the books, etc., assigned to them are to be sent to the Secretary of the Examining Board by the first of January.

Each *Chairman* and Financial Secretary shall meet the Candidates and Probationers in their Districts, on the last Wednesday in April, at some place appointed by the Chairman; lay the printed questions before them, and transmit their written answers to the respective Examiners who shall immediately report the result to the Secretary of the Examining Board. A meeting of the Examining Board is to be held on the day previous to the opening of the Conference, at 9 o'clock, a.m., in order to be ready to report to the Conference. The Superintendent of the Circuit which recommends a Candidate to be received on trial, is required to give a written statement of his religious character, talents and usefulness; educational advantages acquirements, and other particulars, as required by our Discipline; which statement shall be signed by him, and recorded in the District Book.

No Probationer shall be allowed the year of probation until the studies for that year are satisfactorily completed.

The Conference requires Candidates received on trial for our ministry, to preach a trial sermon before the District Meeting by which they are recommended, or before a Committee appointed by the District Meeting, who shall report its opinion on the sermon, and embody it in the recommendation of such Candidate to the Conference.

*Chairmen* of Districts are requested to inform the Secretary immediately after the March Quarterly Meeting of those who are to be Candidates for Examination in the Preliminary Course of Study.

#### VI.—REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

That this Conference hails with great satisfaction the increased impetus which has been given during the past year to the Temperance cause, within this Province and throughout the Dominion and world generally. That we heartily concur in the efforts which are now being put forth to secure the legal prohibition of the liquor traffic. We sincerely hope that our people will take a greater interest in this matter, and that more prominence will be given to this subject in our prayer meetings and congregations.

We urge with renewed emphasis upon all our members strict obedience to our rule which forbids "drunkenness, buying or selling of spiritual liquors, or drinking them, unless in case of extreme necessity." That apart from the question of the use of fermented wine at the Lord's table, we regard the employment of the drugged and impure compounds bearing the name of "wine," as being injudicious in connexion with this holy ordinance. We therefore urge upon our people that special attention be given to secure pure wine for use in the Lord's Supper; and suggest that if possible, some agency be instituted to secure the accomplishment of this end.

## VII.—REPORT ON THE STATE OF THE WORK OF GOD.

It is cause of devout thanksgiving to Almighty God that, although the past year has not been one of general revival, still there have been accorded to us as a church many special marks of the Divine favor. The general characteristic of the year has been, perhaps, gradual advancement and more complete consolidation of the work; but most Districts report an increase of membership, and some a very large number received on trial. This has been especially the case on the Yarmouth and Liverpool Districts, where extensive and powerful revivals have attested not only the faithfulness of the laborers but also the efficiency of the gospel preached as the power of God unto salvation unto every one that believeth.

New Germany and Port Mouton, in the Liverpool District, report revivals, whilst on the Lunenburg Circuit more than 100 souls have been converted to God.

Truro District reports general prosperity, whilst special success has attended the efforts put forth in connection with the Onslow Circuit.

On the Guysboro' and Cape Breton District the year's labor has resulted in general advancement of the work, and a slight increase to the number of members and those on trial.

Cumberland District has been visited with gracious seasons of revival in connection with the Amherst, Nappan, Warren, Oxford and Southampton Circuits, and reports general prosperity.

Annapolis sends cheering accounts of accessions on the Weymouth, Wilmot, Aylesford and Canning Circuits, although the District as a whole does not report an increase of membership.

The most remarkable revival of the year, however, has taken place, perhaps, in connection with the North East Harbor Circuit, where, under Bro. Scott, as the result of three and a half months of special effort, 175 persons have been converted to God.

Notes of discouragement, it is true, have occasionally reached our ears. Heavy church debts and the opposition of conflicting interests have in a few cases hindered our connex-

ional advancement. But on the whole we feel that we can but rejoice since our labor is not in vain in the Lord. Methodism is lengthening its cords and strengthening its stakes and proving itself not only a power for good in the land, but a chosen instrument in the hand of God for turning men from darkness to light and from the power of satan unto God.

*Resolved* That this Conference hereby urges upon each minister and preacher, as well as upon the trustee boards of the several circuits, that all such applications be refused, except to those who produce unmistakable credentials.

#### 3.—REV. ELIAS BRETTE.

*Resolved.* The thanks of the Conference are due to the Rev. Elias Brette, the retiring President, for the dignified and efficient manner in which he has discharged the duties of his office during the year, and for the urbanity and christian courtesy which eminently distinguished his official intercourse with the brethren and secured for him a warm place in their affections.

#### 4. REV. R. A. TEMPLE.

*Resolved.* The thanks of the Conference are hereby presented to the Rev. R. A. Temple for the very excellent and satisfactory arrangements made by him for the meeting of this Conference.

#### 5. AMHERST FRIENDS.

*Resolved.* That this Conference desires to acknowledge the very great kindness of the Amherst friends, representing different denominations of Christians, who have so hospitably entertained the members of the Conference during its present session, and directs that the resolution of thanks shall be published in the local papers of Amherst, and that the Superintendent of the Amherst Circuit be requested to read the same from the pulpit next Lord's Day.

## 6. REV. T. WATSON SMITH.

*Resolved.* That the thanks of the Conference are hereby presented to the Rev. T. W. Smith for his admirable first volume on the History of Methodism in E. B. A., and we would express our fervant hope that his health may be continued to admit of his completing this very valuable literary work.

## FINANCIAL ECONOMY.

The Conference recommends to the Quarterly Meetings of the several circuits, the following plan, by which it is hoped they may the more effectually raise the amount necessary to meet the allowance of the ministers and preachers, and which will make the collection of class and ticket money hereafter unnecessary.

1. Let the Quarterly Boards at the beginning of each financial year, estimate the amount needed for the year.
2. Then ascertain from each member of the church, and, as far as practicable, from each attendant of the congregation, what each purposes to give as his or her weekly or monthly contribution.
3. Let these sums be entered by a steward appointed for that purpose in a book which he shall keep as Treasurer of the Quarterly Board.
4. If the total amount of these sums does not equal the amount needed, then let the stewards apportion the deficiency among such as are willing, for Christ's sake, to assume such deficiency, setting down to each person, with his or her consent, the additional amount which they think he or she ought weekly or monthly to pay.

5. Let the stewards then adopt and carry out a plan by which every one shall have the opportunity of regularly contributing each week or month, by envelope or otherwise, not grudgingly or of necessity, the sum which has been pledged by him or her. Let these contributions be paid over regularly to the steward appointed to receive them, and be brought up by him to the quarterly meeting. The said steward shall keep an individual account of all the pledges and contributions, and shall pay over the same, under the direction of the quarterly meeting, to the preacher or preachers authorized to receive them.

6. That quarterly meetings adopting the envelope system be recommended not to include in their estimates the claims of Foreign and Home Missions, but to provide for these funds as in times past, by special collections and subscriptions.

---

### STANDING ORDERS.

#### 1.—FINANCIAL DISTRICT MEETINGS.

1. The attention of the Chairmen of Districts is called to Sec. VI., p. 49, and Section I., p. 112, of the Discipline. The Conference directs that the greatest care shall be exercised in preparing the estimates of Receipts and expenditure on the dependent circuits. The expenditure shall in no case exceed \$750, exclusive of the Children's Fund claims and house rent. These estimates, together with a detailed statement of the removal expenses of ministers, shall be forwarded to the Rev. W. H. Hertz, Secretary of the Missionary Committee, who will transmit them to the Central Missionary Board.

#### 2.—CONNEXIONAL FUNDS.

3. *Missionary and Educational Societies.*—Each Superintendent is required to present at the District Meeting, in a form for publication, lists of the benefactors and subscribers to these Societies of one dollar and upwards, all amounts under one dollar to be entered under small sums, with an account of their respective contributions, and all other monies received during the year; and the Chairmen of the District shall forward such lists to the Treasurers of the respective Funds.

3. *Contingent and Supernumerary Minister's Funds.*—Superintendents are requested to see that the annual public collections are taken for these funds at the time appointed. For the latter fund subscriptions and donations shall be taken in the classes and among the lay friends of the Church, and the names of all annual subscribers of five dollars or more, shall be forwarded to the Treasurer for publication in the Minutes of Conference.—(Dis. p. 115.)

4. *Children's Fund*.—The Financial Secretaries of the several districts are required to send to the Secretary of the Children's Fund, immediately after the Annual District Meeting, the names of all ministers in their respective districts who are claimants upon the Children's Fund for the current year; and to state the number of children for whom allowance is claimed; and, as far as possible, the name and date of birth of each of the said children.

### 3.—SABBATH SCHOOL REPORTS.

5. Each Superintendent is directed to see that an Annual Report of the state of the Sabbath-schools in his circuit, is prepared, in tabular form (*Schedules Nos. 1 and 2*, issued by the Board of Management), and presented to the Quarterly Official, and District meetings.—*Dis. pp. 79 & 98.*

### 4.—REPORTS OF RELIGIOUS STATE.

6. Each Superintendent is directed to prepare a Report of the religious state of his circuit or mission, to be read at the Annual District Meeting; at which meeting a summary of such Reports shall be prepared and entered in the District Minutes for the information of the Conference. The condensed Reports of Missions shall also be prepared in a form to be transmitted to the General Secretaries.

### 5.—BOOK ROOM ACCOUNTS.

7. Every Minister and Preacher is peremptorily required to settle his book account for the preceding year at each Annual Conference, and also regularly to transmit the money in his hands, without any reservation or deduction whatever, to the Book Steward, whenever it shall amount to ten dollars. (*Jour. G. C. p. 168.*)

### 6.—THE WESLEYAN.

8. Chairmen of Districts are directed to institute enquiry at the Annual District as to the diligence and fidelity of each Minister and Preacher responsible for the collection of subscriptions due for the *Wesleyan*.

### 7.—DISTRICT MINUTES.

9. Chairmen of Districts are required to take to Conference *three* complete copies of the Minutes of the Annual and Financial District Meetings, duly signed by the Chairman and Secretary;—one copy inserted in the District Book for his own use; one for the Secretary of the Conference; and one for the Members of the District and of the Conference.—(*Dis. p. 49.*)

### 8.—SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

10. Sermons on the obligations of the Sabbath shall be annually preached on all the circuits on the third Sabbath in the month of January.—(*Jour. Gen. Conf. p. 192.*)



## PASTORAL ADDRESS.

*Dearly Beloved Brethren,—*

Again assembled in our Annual Conference, we gladly avail ourselves of the privilege of sending forth greetings "to all the flock, over which the Holy Ghost hath made "us" overseers, to feed the church of God which he hath purchased with his own blood."—"Grace be unto you, and peace from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ. We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers; remembering without ceasing your work of faith and labor of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of God our Father; knowing brethren beloved your election of God." "And this we pray, that your love may abound yet more and more, in knowledge and in all judgment, that ye may be sincere and without offence till the day of Christ, being filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ unto the glory and praise of God."

Through the past we have shared the same spiritual blessings, and even amid trials have been "comforted together with you by our mutual faith." Let us then rejoice together. O come let us sing unto the Lord, let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation."

The record of the year is not without a fair measure of encouragement. In many instances "times of refreshing" came "from the presence of the Lord." Some new fields have been entered, and a spirit of increased liberality has been displayed; yet we are deeply conscious that our successes are not commensurate with the means employed. Believing that Jesus Christ tasted "death for every man," and "thereby became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him," we cordially invite you, even more fully than in the past, to co-operate with us, as laborers together with God," "warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom, that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus." "This honor have all his saints."

We are thankful that by the kind providence of our Heavenly Father, with but few exceptions, the ranks of our effective ministry remain unbroken. One of our aged brethren, the Rev. John S. Addy, is compelled by advancing infirmities to retire from circuit work. We hope that his years of Supernumerary life will prove, as his active ministry has been from the beginning, very fruitful to the bringing of glory to God. Two younger brethren

seek for a temporary supernumerary relation, hoping that after a year of comparative rest, they will be able in full to resume their loved employ.

One of the most venerable Fathers of our connexion, the Rev. Henry Pope, after a highly useful ministry of sixty-three years, entered triumphantly into the joy of the Lord, and will doubtless shine among those in the glory of the skies who have turned many to righteousness.

W. F. Penny, B.D., a young brother beloved, who had with laudable ambition prepared himself for the office and work of the ministry, was called to "enter into the joy of his Lord."

In view of the approaching General Conference our deliberations have been especially important. The experience of the past four years has suggested improvements in some of the details of the general plan of union, and we also anticipate the completion of work which could not be perfected at the first session.

"This epistle, beloved, we now write unto you, in which we stir up your pure minds by way of remembrance." Our great work is "to spread scriptural holiness throughout these lands." For this we believe God hath raised us up. "Ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a peculiar people," "which in time past were not a people but are now the people of God." At the present, there is less danger of our becoming offensively singular for piety—than of a friendly conformity—to this world. Let us guard our homes from "such diversions as cannot be used in the name of the Lord Jesus," bearing in mind that we are citizens of a heavenly city. "We are too great and born to greater things than that our souls should be made slaves to our bodies." "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world the love of the Father is not in him." Seek to have your joy so abundant in Christ that wordly amusements will have little attraction for you.

Next to our own homes comes the house of God. In our zeal to interest certain portions of our congregations, or to improve the financial condition of the Church, let us not countenance such entertainments as may be in disharmony with true reverence of the sanctuary, or would subject us to the reproof of Christ. "Take these things hence; make not my Father's house an house of merchandise."

To us, as to our fathers, comes the command "Remember the

Sabbath day to keep it holy." Any encroachment upon its sanctity will most surely bring spiritual loss and lower the standard of morality. "The King's business requireth haste," and the Sabbaths are so few, and the Master's so great, "the Lord hath need of them."

The Sabbath Schools are included as nurseries of the church. "Those that be planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God." It is highly desirable that adult classes should be increased in all the schools, and even senior members of the congregation invited to attend, not only for their own benefit, but that young persons may be encouraged to remain in the schools.

The financial support of the Church of God demands your serious consideration. "Honor the Lord with thy substance and with the first fruits of all thine increase, so shall thy barns be filled with plenty, and thy presses shall burst out with new wine." Very heavy deficiencies are sustained by many in our ministry, whereby their hearts are solely depressed, and their usefulness hindered, and also the ever widening fields which demand more laborers, prompt us to say to every one, with even greater emphasis than the apostle used, "Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things."

The extraordinary Temperance revival which has swept over this continent during the year, bringing peace, hope and comfort to thousands of stricken homes, and prompting our parliament to advanced legislation for the suppression of the traffic in ardent spirits, has been hailed by us with unmingled satisfaction. Convinced that the hand of God is in this great movement, we must earnestly bespeak for it your undivided influence and constant prayers, trusting that the time is not remote when this monster evil of evils which so long has mercilessly afflicted humanity and impeded the progress of religion shall be forever driven from our redeemed world. "Men of Israel help."

Our Educational Institutions at Mount Allison continue to hold deservedly, a high place in the estimation of the Conference. They are a strong bulwark against scepticism and immorality.

The records of the past, the facts of the present, and the hopes for the future, all assure us of the wisdom of placing higher education under the fostering care of the church. We commend our institutions of learning to your patronage and prayers.

*Our Book Room* sends forth its supplies of a sound literature, and is entitled to your interest and support. Whether for the home or Sabbath School you will find it profitable to draw your reading from its shelves. The *Wesleyan* is so necessary to us as a church that we feel desirous of having it in every household of our congregations, as it will increase your knowledge of the work of God in our midst and elsewhere.

And now, dearly beloved, "leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ let us go on unto perfection." It is the will of God that we "may grow up into him in all things which is the head even Christ." Let holiness be sought as a definite blessing, to be obtained by unconditional self-surrender to Christ and implicit faith in the blood which "cleanseth us from all sin." Continuance in that blessed state will depend upon walking "worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called with all lowliness and meekness." Every worker for God should constantly have the assurance of his acceptance in the beloved.\* By diligence in the study of the Holy Scriptures, by frequent approaches "unto the throne of peace," by the preservation of the family altar, and by faithful attendance upon the social and public services of the church "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling."

It is a time when the trumpet should give no uncertain sound. "The soul that sinneth it shall die." Let us on the one hand guard against a philosophy which would subordinate the inspired word to the deductions of miniature science, and on the other, repudiate a theology which magnifies the benovolence of God to the exclusion of his justice. As a church we stand firmly upon the old foundation, declaring to all that souls are saved or lost eternally as they accept or reject the only Saviour. "But ye, beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost, keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life;" and may the God of peace that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which is well pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen."

## APPENDIX A.

REPORT OF THE  
MISSIONARY AUXILIARY SOCIETY  
FOR THE  
NOVA SCOTIA CONFERENCE.  
1878.

The operations of the Missionary Society in connection with the Methodist Church in Canada increase in interest and importance. At the last annual meeting of the Central Board of Missions held at Brockville, Ont., in the month of October, 1877, the successes vouchsafed by the God of Missions called forth from representative men of our church pleasing expressions of satisfaction, whilst the spiritual prospects excited anticipations that "the Lord of the Harvest" will, in the future, even more graciously than in the past, bless the efforts of his people.

The field occupied by the Society is extensive—territorially considered it embraces the Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, Bermuda and the Empire of Japan. The operations of the Society are designed to promote the interests of souls in connection with Indian Missions, German and French Missions, Domestic Missions, and Missions to the Japanese.

## INDIAN MISSIONS.

The total number of Indian Missions under the care of the Church is 43, with 32 missionaries and 6 ministers who aid the missions near the circuits upon which they are stationed; 2790 persons are enrolled as members of our Church among the Indians. These Missions reach the aborigines in the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, as well as in Manitoba, the N. W. Territory and in British Columbia. Among the many pleasing features developed during the year in connection with this class of Missions has been the inauguration of a new mission at Naas, British Columbia.

The references to this Mission in the large report and in the Missionary notices are of a thrilling character. We give a few extracts. The Missionary Secretaries thus refer to the inception of the Mission:

"The destitute condition of this numerous band of Indians, and their earnest entreaty for a Missionary, made such a solemn impression upon the hearts of our generous-minded people in Victoria, that, independent of their usual offerings for the maintenance of their own minister and annual missionary subscriptions, they pledged themselves to a special effort to provide four hundred dollars for two years to begin this Mission."

The Rev. Alfred Green was selected to commence the work. His introduction to the different tribes on the Naas River marked an auspicious beginning. Large numbers of Indians expressed their great joy at the fact that they are to have a missionary to live among them. Mr. Green thus writes of his success:

"Some of the most wicked men that heathenism can produce have bowed at the feet of Jesus, and have been made new creatures by his wonderful power and mercy, so that at every service there are those whose hearts are touched by God's Holy Spirit, and are led to renounce their superstitious ways and take the new way; and every day some are coming to ask for advice as to how they may settle old heathen "Potlatch" debts, as they want to be Christians, and the large sacrifices they make to give ample restitution, and their changed lives show that they are in earnest. Seventy-five now meet in class, while 32 profess (as far as man may judge truly) to live a life of faith in the Son of God. I preach three times on the Sabbath, and twice during the week, and then we have class meetings and prayer-meeting, and in every service we feel the power of God and are encouraged by seeing many coming to the Cross. We never saw a people so dark before, and it has not been all sunshine. Doctors and conjurers, who make money by their evil practices, see their craft in danger and are loud in opposition. Others, with two or three chiefs, want to keep up the old feast and dance. One old chief brought his bag of feathers (an old dance charm) to church to tell us that he could not give that up, but he would give up everything else, just keep that and be a christian. They say they were told that if they had a Methodist Missionary they could feast and dance and be Christians all the same; but God is shaking heathenism to the foundation all up this river."

From Beren's River Mission, in the Red River District, Rev. J. Semmens writes under date Nov. 25, 1877:

"Our services are regularly sustained and well attended. Thrice on the Lord's day we seek to echo Heaven's offers of salvation in Jesus' name. The most marked attention is paid to the divine message, and a bright-eyed interest is manifested in things pertaining to godliness. A weekly class-meeting follows the Sabbath services. On Wednesdays we meet for prayer and fellowship, on Thursdays for Biblical research and devotion. Occasional sickness affords me opportunities of inculcating spiritual lessons in the camp and at the fireside. Here, as everywhere, sinking times are praying times, and in the hour when the heart is softened we hasten to impress the claims of God. Breaches of discipline there have been, but, on the whole, there has been little to complain of

and much to commend considering what these people were and who they are. To judge them from our standpoint would be to expect an abundant harvest where little has been sown. I find them open to correction, thankful for reproof, ready to promise amendment, and where these signs exist may we not rightly be hopeful.

The Pagans have not and will not yet give up all to follow Christ. They are convinced of the hollowness of their creed, they are ashamed of their heathenish practices, they feel that they are astray in their attachments, but they shrink from the light and abide in the darkness, lest their deeds become manifest to themselves and to the world. I have little confidence in their speedy conversion, but am entirely confident of truth's final victory. The gospel day is but dawning here. As the sun rises every dell and cave and jungle shall be flooded with its light, and icy hearts shall be transformed into gardens of the Lord.

Sowinas, an old man of fifty, to whom I made reference last spring, is steadily drawing nearer to us. He put his idols away, he buried his bad medicines in a quaking bog, he married his aged consort, the companion of his life, hand in hand with her he approached the table of the Lord. Night after night he comes to learn from my lips the sweetly simple yet expressive prayer of Christ, "Our Father, which art in Heaven, hallowed by Thy name." Oh that many more were as eager as he to renounce the hidden things of dishonesty and seek for purity of heart."

These Missions are indebted to friends in Ontario and Quebec for valuable gifts of clothing, etc., for distribution among destitute Indians, especially widows and orphans, and also to The Wesleyan Ladies' Association in London for nine cases of suitable garments, etc., for the climate, valued by invoice at £75 sterling. For many years gifts of a similar nature have been generously forwarded from the same society. These sons and daughters of the far north have shared largely in the sympathies of Mrs. Dr. Hoole and the other distinguished christian ladies who form the association. We trust that ere long the ladies of our Methodist congregations in the Lower Provinces will by organized effort render their valuable assistance to the Missionary department of the Churches' work, imitating the noble examples set by their sisters in England.

The interest of our people generally in Indian Missions has been during the year greatly quickened by the visit to different portions of Nova Scotia of the Rev. E. R. Young, a returned missionary from the Indian tribes in the North West. Mr. Young's eloquent addresses have had a most beneficial effect, and his visit will be long remembered.

#### JAPAN.

The Mission of our Church to Japan is one of the most interesting and successful of modern times. The reports that have been received from the missionaries strongly resemble the literature of the Christian Church in primitive times, when the

Spirit Divine to a marked degree was poured forth and gracious results followed. The Missionary Secretaries inform us that apparently our success in Japan will be limited only by the amount of means provided for carrying on the work.

Under date of February 20th, 1878, Rev. G. M. Meacham, A.M., writes:—

“Since September last we have received into the Church, by baptism, six persons, and in a village in another province, near whose boundary Numadzu is situated, I have baptized and formed into a Methodist class five gentlemen, to whom we preach as often as possible. It is a village where the gospel was never preached till I went there on an invitation of an old man, eighty years of age, “whose poor old legs,” the messenger said, “could not carry him to this place.” As those who have been baptized there are among the most respectable people of the place, we have reason to hope that the work will extend. In that village resides an ex-governor of that province, who, I have it on the best authority, is receiving instruction, but “secretly for fear of the Japanese,” in the English Bible from a lad who knows a little of English but is not a christian.

Here where we live we have a Sabbath-school in connection with our Sabbath-morning service, conducted by Mr. Satow, who teaches the adults, and principal Yebara, who has the care of the children. It is certainly an interesting and profitable part of our work. Usually the whole congregation remains to the class-meeting and then to the Sunday-school.

I wish we could extend our operations, but we seem shut up to the two appointments, Numadzu and Netta, where, however, we have unquestionable evidences of the presence and blessing of God. On Sabbath last we had our Quarterly Meeting, and it would have done your heart good to hear what even our latest converts had to say touching heart-experience. One of them teaches sixteen of his poor neighbours what he knows about the Gospel, from 7 to 10 o'clock every night, and he says their conversations and discussions often last till after midnight. If testimony with the lips, correctness of life, the practice of self-denial, conflicts with the devil, and victory over him, and peace with God, evince true christian experience, then we have genuine conversions here.”

The Rev. Dr. McDonald, our Medical Missionary from Japan, who is at present on a visit to Ontario, recently addressed the Toronto Conference in a speech of telling effect. In Japan Dr. McDonald resides in a part of one of the huge castles built hundreds of years ago for the rulers. From this castle an edict was issued that all the Christians should be exterminated, and no footing allowed them anywhere, and yet from the very citadel of this castle he had the great honor of preaching the gospel. The “Christian Guardian,” under date of the 19th June, 1878, thus refers to the latest phases of our work in Japan:

“Five Japanese candidates for the ministry of our Church in Japan were received on trial by the Toronto Conference. They had been duly recommended by the District meeting. Dr. Macdonald in each case gave



testimony as to the character and attainments of these candidates. They were described as men of good natural abilities, good social position, and well educated in the literature of their country as well as in English. These native laborers are employed at a much lower salary than missionaries from England or America. Such laborers will therefore greatly reduce the expenditure of missionary societies, and prove a new power in the prosecution of the work. We think it is cause for deep gratitude to God, that in so short a period since our first missionaries were sent forth, we have these native laborers raised up to carry on the work of God among their fellow-countrymen. This is a gracious earnest of future extension and victory. We shall doubtless see, before many years, self-sustaining native churches, supplied by faithful native pastors, as centres of evangelistic influence in that interesting country. It is impossible to contemplate the facts which our missionaries relate without feeling our faith in the power of the truth confirmed and quickened. We may preach with confidence a gospel that is mighty to subdue the hearts of the heathen to Christ our Saviour."

#### GERMAN AND FRENCH MISSIONS.

In these departments of our work we have ten missionaries employed. Our mission to the French in Montreal is especially inviting, whilst in other centres of evangelistic enterprise it is abundantly evident that the light is spreading. The brethren engaged in this arduous work feel much encouraged, and are anticipating those grand results for which for years they have labored and prayed.

Besides the missions already referred to, and in addition to successful missions to the English-speaking population of British Columbia, Manitoba and Algoma, the Missionary Society has under its care flourishing Domestic Missions in each of the six Conferences comprising the General Conference of the Methodist Church of Canada. The following

#### GENERAL RECAPITULATION

will furnish a suggestive view of the operations of the Church: Missions, 416; missionaries, 436; members, 38,709. There are 31 schools and 31 teachers, 21 interpreters and 6 ministers on circuits supplying small bands of Indians—making a paid agency on the Missionary Department of the Methodist Church of Canada of 493.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENT.

The total income of the Society for the year ending June 30th, 1877, was \$145,998.92. The expenditure of the year was \$174,255.92. The excess of expenditure over income is \$28,257, to which we must add the debt of previous years, \$25,338.70, making the total actual debt of the Society at that date, \$53,595.70.

We now proceed to give a brief financial statement of the Nova Scotia Auxiliary for the year ending June, 1878. The income from the Districts is as follows :

Mr. Crosby, on the Pacific slope, is pleading the many openings among the thousands of Indians who are awaiting the tidings of salvation, and are asking for missionaries. The devoted and self-denying Cochran is soliciting assistance to erect churches in Japan's capital, with its population equal to that of the whole Province of Ontario. There are many openings in Manitoba and the North West Territory, where the lands are being rapidly bought up and occupied by emigrants. If our Church is to leaven with her influence the future of this vast Dominion, we must devise great things for God and souls.
